HUNTERS HILL COLLEGE CLOSURE - EDUCATION WITHDRAWAL FROM THE CROPWOOD ESTATE

The following report of the Head of Service - Education Infrastructure was submitted:-

Zahid Mahmood, Capital Projects Manager, presented the report and advised Members that a decision was made by Cabinet to close the school with effect from 31 August for a variety of reasons. It is a special school outside the City Boundary. Mr Mahmood noted that there would be 24 hour security site as the Children would vacate before the 31 August and it was broken into previously whilst in use. He explained in normal circumstances the Education Directorate would get any Capital receipt from the sale of the site but in this instance the site would revert to the Cropwood Estate Trust. There had been some interest in the site from a third party.

Responding to comments from Councillor Adrian Delaney, Zahid Mahmood, Capital Projects Manager, explained that an independent provider of special schools has taken details as they are interested in taking the site and this approach would be forwarded to the Trust. Children from the school had been relocated to places within Birmingham Closer to home. The issue was that the Education Directorate would not be able to continue paying for security after the 31 August.

Councillor Julian Pritchard raised the question of what the cost is for the surveys stated in the report on paragraph 4.2. Nigel Oliver, Birmingham Property Services, explained that there are funds within capital receipts for surveys which would be commissioned as an informal tender. In response to a further question from Councillor Pritchard he noted that it is difficult to estimate the length of time it would take to transfer the site from Education as the survey had yet to be undertaken and officer did not know what it would reveal.

A debate ensued during which the following points were made:-

- As the building belongs to the Trust it should be given back in the original condition it was given.
- The condition of the site should be established before it was handed back and a visit must be made before August for that reason.
- It was not appropriate at this point to agree the recommendations in the report as they were committing the Committee to things that were unknown not at least what happens after the 31 August in terms of security. The report should be resubmitted to the next meeting.
- It would be appropriate to, following the visit, to hold an additional meeting of the Committee before September so that feedback from the visit can be considered and a post 31 August plan could be established.

3. Compliance Issues:

3.1 Consultations

The grants will be awarded in accordance with the Mechanics of Funding Protocol agreed by this Committee on 14 December 2016 and no further consultation is required. The officer panel reviewing the applications consists of representatives from Inclusive Growth: School Crossing Patrols and the Travel Demand Management Team, Education, and Finance and Governance.

Active engagement and promotion of the initiative takes place with all schools in Birmingham through various methods including regular newsletters, webinar training sessions and noticeboard bulletins.

3.2 <u>Relevant legal powers, personnel, equalities, procurement, regeneration and other relevant implications?</u>

The City Council is the Sole Corporate Trustee for a number of charitable trusts ("charities") including Young Active Travel in Birmingham and the day-to-day management of these charities is delegated to the Council's Trusts and Charities Committee.

Each charity is governed by the Deed under which it was established, and/or a Charity Commission Scheme. These documents set out the Trustees' powers, as well as the objects or purposes for which the charitable trust was created.

Assets held in trust by a charity are ultimately for the benefit of the public (beneficiaries) and any dealing in these assets and any income derived from them, is legally required to be dealt with, and accounted for, separately from the Corporate Property Portfolio/assets of the City Council. Charities must be managed in accordance with the objectives and rules laid down in their Trust documents.

It is the legal duty of Trustees to ensure that the charity is managed in accordance with the Trust objectives and, accordingly, there is a legal duty upon the City Council when it acts as the Sole Corporate Trustee. This duty extends to acting in the best interests of the charity and its beneficiaries at all times or making decisions which are expedient in the interests of the charity (as opposed to the City Council.)

All charity Trustees also have a legal duty to avoid conflicts of interest, and self-dealing (which prohibits a trustee from buying trust property and makes a sale by a trustee to himself voidable by any beneficiary). All decisions made by Council's Trusts and Charities Committee are subject to prior review by the Council's City Solicitor and Monitoring Officer to ensure that decisions are made in accordance with charity law having regard to any relevant Charity Commission guidance.

3.3 Finances

The Trustee secured the sum of £100,000 as the initial fund to be applied in furthering the objects and purposes of the Charity. This income is available for immediate use. This is comprised of a contribution of £75,000 from the City Council and £25,000 sponsorship from Churchill Insurance.

As of April 2021, the remaining balance was £70,742.55 which is held in a trust account within the Council's balance sheet. The recommended applications total for September 2021 is £9,906.20 and will leave a balance of £60,836.35 available for future disbursement.

3.4 Public Sector Equality Duty

None. The statutory functions discharged by the Council as Trustee are subject to a separate and distinct statutory regime underpinned (principally) by the Charities Act 2011, Trustee Act 2000 and relevant Charity Commission guidance. These are non-executive functions and are therefore not subject to the Equalities Act 2010 provisions.

4. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

Background

- 4.1 At its meeting on 13 September 2016 Council-as-Trustee approved the formation of the Young Active Travel Trust.
- 4.2. Council-as-Trustee further resolved to instruct officers to register the Trust as a charitable organisation with the Charities Commission. As with any other charitable trust where the Council is sole corporate trustee, the responsibility for the day to day management of the trust is delegated by Council to the Trusts and Charities Committee.
- 4.3. At its meeting on 14 December 2016 this Committee (Trusts & Charities) approved the Mechanism of Funding Protocol which set out the management arrangements for the Young Active Travel Trust and the criteria against which applications for funding would be assessed (Appendix 1).

Purpose of the Trust

4.4 The Council's Young Active Travel initiative aims to pull together cross-cutting policy objectives around improving children's health, achieving "behaviour change" around transport choices, and addressing environmental and road safety concerns. It seeks to encourage parents and pupils to adopt more sustainable ways of travelling to school and to reduce car journeys, improving not only their own health but that of the wider community – with reduced road danger, less air pollution from cars, and less traffic congestion in local neighbourhoods – particularly around school gates.

4.5. The purpose of the Trust is set out in the Deed as follows:

The objects and purposes of the Charity are to preserve and protect public health, particularly the health of school children in Birmingham by:-

- I. supporting initiatives which raise awareness about road safety, health, exercise and fitness;
- II. changing behaviours towards travel to school

Applications for Funding

4.6. 10 applications have been received and assessed against the criteria set out in Appendix 1. These applications have met the criteria set out in Appendix 1 and are recommended to the Committee for approval as schemes to further the objectives of the Charity. The applications are attached at Appendix 2.

- To be eligible to apply for a grant, schools must be located within the geographic boundary of Birmingham City Council. Alternatively, constituted groups of parents of children attending these schools will also be eligible to apply.
- Up to £1,000 per application, or school in the case of collective bids, will be available for projects that meet one or more of the criteria set out below.
- Applications may be made for revenue or capital schemes but if it is the latter, the
 applicant will need to resource any on-going maintenance liability that may be created.

Subject to the above, priority will be given to funding proposals where:

- a) the school has an on-going commitment to promoting safe and sustainable travel through actions within their ModeShift STARS (on-line programme) travel plan. In Particular -
 - ➤ The school MUST have registered to Modeshift STARS
 - The school MUST have completed at least 1 school travel survey for both staff and pupils within the previous 12 months of the application.
 - > The school MUST started a School Travel Plan.
- b) there is a link between the proposal and actions contained within the ModeShift STARS travel plan, for example, to achieve behaviour change to more sustainable modes of travel to and from schools:
- c) it is expected that the proposal will result in a reduction in parking congestion around school gates;
- d) there is a linkage to existing initiatives led by the Council or its partners, for example, Bikeability (cycle training), Birmingham Big Bikes Bike Library or family cycle centres, or Birmingham Cycle revolution infrastructure investment;
- e) there is connectivity with other children's health and well-being programmes and activities; or local environmental initiatives;
- f) consideration has been given to the legacy of the initiative or activity to ensure sustainability beyond the life of the grant funding, for example, through parent's groups or the School Council

The Trust cannot:

- Award grants in excess of £1,000 to a single institution or group.
- Award more than one grant to the same school in less than 36 months.
- Award grants for things that have already been paid for.
- Fund initiatives or measures for which there is a free of charge alternative, for example, Think Road Safety resources, or other local funding source.
- Fund schemes for which Top Cycle Location Grants are available or have been awarded in 2016/17 or 2017/18.

About Your Project

1. Please describe the project you are asking for grant funding to undertake.

Please refer to the guidance notes for information about what sort of projects will be given priority.

All children that attend Heathfield school have recently completed the modeshift stars questionnaire. This has highlighted to us that over 100 of our children would like to cycle or scoot to school. Through launching initiatives we would like to see this reach 500 children across a five year period.

In order for this project to be successful the school will have a suitable shelter to store bicycles throughout the day.

Our vision for the project has two main strands. The first strand revolves around road safety. This includes reducing parking congestion around school gates which will free up pavements for pedestrians and allow traffic to move freely. Children and parents will feel safe walking to school. This will also improve air quality around the school.

The second strand focuses on children's health and well-being. The initiative to encourage children to cycle to school will increase their physical activity and encourage good attendance. We will actively encourage children who will be of increased benefit from this intiative such as overweight children and children with poor attendance.

2. What you will spend the grant funding on?

In order for it to be successful we will have to provide suitable and safe storage for bicycles.

3. What benefits do you expect to result from the project?

We hope to see several benefits from this project over the next five years.

These will include:

- Increased road safety awareness for all children in school.
- Reduction in potential accidents with cars around school premises.
- Improved air quality around the school premises.
- Potential for staff to bike to school and reduce time spent in traffic.
- Increased use of the A34 bike route between Heathfield Road, Birchfield Road and the city centre.
- Increased attendance and reduction in children arriving late to school.
- Improved health and well-being.
- Children in year 5 & 6 encouraged to travel to school alone to develop independence.

4. What wasting larger will the wastest have on the calculation and what will
4. What positive legacy will the project have on the school or wider community and what will happen when the grant funding stops?
We would be able to advertise ourself as a school that promotes and can facilitate cycling to school. This would appeal to children in year 5 & 6 to increase independence and secondary school readiness.
When the funding stops the project will be able to continue as the grant will supply a permanent storage solution.
5. How does this project connect with your Modeshift STARS Travel Plan?
Please note funding is only available to schools who have committed to developing school travel plans through the on-line Modeshift STARS programme; or schools who will commit to registering on Modeshift STARS and achieving bronze level within 12 months (from date of award of grant).
There are several initiatives that the school have already implemented. We run the bikeability programme each academic year in KS2. This teaches all children how to ride a bike. In early years we run balance bike sessions to increase confidence and skills needed to ride a bike on the pavement. Through both of these schemes children are more likely to become involved in an intiative to bike to school.
We would like to encourage targeted groups of children to cycle to school by offering them a free place at our breakfast club. This may include children with poor physical health or children with poor attendance. By allowing children to attend our breakfast club they are able to arrive before the morning rush, increasing the safety of their journey.
There will be an increased focus on road safety awareness throughout school. This would be for all children, not just the children taking up the initiative. We would do this through whole school assemblies, road awareness days and road safety projects. This would be extended to parents through newsletters and by working with our local PCSO and councillor.

About Your Project

1. Please describe the project you are asking for grant funding to undertake.

The school will use the money to launch scootability in KS1. The money will be used to focus on practical skills and knowledge so children feel confident to ride scooters safely. This project will improve childrens physical and mental wellbeing by them being healthy and active. Also it will help children to learn about how to look after the environment by thinking about air pollution. At Leigh Primary School, we would promote scootability through our PE scheme and by inviting outside agencies to help train children on the safe use of a scooter. The aim is for children to learn about the parts of a scooter, safety gear, balance, push and steer, learn how to stop and learn how to navigate obstacles We would eventually like the children to use scooters as a transport to arrive into school. The whole intiative would link in with our Modeshift Scheme and also our WOW Travel programme.

2. What you will spend the grant funding on?

The money will be spent on buying scooters, safety gear and a storage unit. Also some of the money will be used on training staff on the implementation of the project and how to measure the impact of the project.

3. What benefits do you expect to result from the project?

The benefits of the scheme will be promting a healthier lifestyle and also increasing the wellbeing of the children mentally and physically. It will help the children learn about different ways of travelling and also help with PE skills such as balance and co- ordination. The children will also learn how to look after the environments and how to keep the streets around Leigh Primary School safer. Hopefully, the children will enjoy the project and will use a scooter as a mode of transport to get to school. This will help reduce the car congestion around Leigh Primary School and also help improve the air quality around the school.

1. Please describe the project you are asking for grant funding to undertake.

Moor Hall School are looking to build on the success of their annual Bikeabiltiy programme by introducing Balance Bikeability to EYFS and KS1 children. This programme will ensure that our younger children have the skills to successfully move to safely riding a bike. This will encourage more families to cycle to school and enourage healthy family activities outside of school.

In the last 3 years we have grown from admitting 30 children to 60 children into our Reception class. Our catchment area last year was 1.6km which means that the majority of children are within an easy walking distance. For those families slightly further away we would like to encourage the use of bikes and scooters and ensure that our children know how to keep themselves and others safe.

We are therefore requesting funding to purchase school balance bikes along with suitable storage. We would also like to allocate a small amount of the grant to school gate banners to discourage the use of cars for journeys to and from school.

2. What you will spend the grant funding on?

The funding will go towards:

- Balance bikes
- Balance bike storage
- Signs for the school gate

3. What benefits do you expect to result from the project?

There are many benefits that will result from a balance bikeability programme and the use of balance bikes during the school day:

Health and fitness – children will be physically active whilst and will be encouraged to enjoy this physical activity outside of school. This will improve general physical health and fitness.

Metal health – time outside and physical activity is known to improve mental health. We would encourage children to build on their skills by enjoying cycling outside of school and with their families.

Transition into school – the use of balance bikes by our youngest children will be encouraged and will be used to aid their transistion into school as a fun activity they will enjoy and look forward to.

Safety – learning to use a balance bike safely will ensure children are aware of their own safety and the safety of others. This will then translate to when they ride a peddled bike as they get older and will be a life long skill.

Delivering the National Curriculum - Balance bikes will be used as part of the curriculum including Physical Development under the EYFS curriculum and as part of the the KS1 PE curriculum.

Achieving Silver Modshift Stars – having the use of balance bikes and encouraging cycling will be part of our travel plan and help us move to our silver award.

The Moor Hall School Vision is that of the 'Moor Hall Child'.

The Moor Hall Child is Achieving, Healthy, Confident and Responsible.

By using balance bikes our children will:

We would like to purchase 15 pupils scooters and 2 adult scooter to enable us to deliver scooterability classes to our KS1 pupils. Encouraging these pupils to travel to school in a safer and more sustainable way, this intitative will also:

The aim of this project is to reduce the parking congestion around the school gates, both on Wood End Road and Jaffary Crescent.





About Your Project

1. Please describe the project you are asking for grant funding to undertake.

We would like to reduce the number of cars parked on zigzags outside the main pupil entrance to our school.

With school returning in September to a new norm, we want to promote sustainable travel to school and reduce car use. By doing this we hope to create a safer area around the school to enable pupils to social distance.

In addition to the parking dollies, school will be running a keep clear campaign to deter parents parking on the school zigs zags. This will be accompanied by police enforcement. Letters will be sent to parents reminding them of the importance of parking correctly.

The children will also take part in the Living Streets WOW campaign to encourage them to walk to school. Letters and newsletters will reinforce the importance of walking to school. Walking past the parking dollies on the way into school will ensure that the safety message is there as a daily reminder.

2. What you will spend the grant funding on?

We would use the money to purchase 'Parking Dollies Pavement Signs' to be placed on the kerbside outside our school by the pedestrian gates to deter people from parking on the zigzags and ensure they park safely away from school or walk their children to school.

We hope this will raise awareness that parents should not park here and keep the area clear around the school gate to enable social distancing

3. What benefits do you expect to result from the project?

We are working on achieving our Modeshift STARS award, so we are keen on promoting sustainble travel to school to our parents.

The kiddie cut out signs we are looking to receive through the funding are very distinctive and will remind parents about this important message when placed along the pavement outside the school gate. We hope they will act as a deterrent to parents parking in this area. The children are also taking part in the Living Streets WOW campaign which encourages them to walk to school. Walking past the parking dollies on the way into school will ensure that the safety message is there as a daily reminder.

4. What positive legacy will the project have on the school or wider community and what will happen when the grant funding stops?

We will continue to work towards promoting sustainable travel to and from school and cleaner air.

Our pupil safeguarding team (Team Protect) will take an active role in the rolling out of all our sustainable travel initiatives. This campaign would remind parents about sustainable travel and safe parking. The children will promote this message to both their peers and parents. By being part of this initiative the pupils will not only raise their profile but will also allow them to see how to campaign in a positive way and see the difference that this could make to making a change on the wider community.







About Your Project

1. Please describe the project you are asking for grant funding to undertake.

As a school in a land locked area of inner city Brimingham. Our children do not often have the opportunities to experience active travel, As well as this our children do not have access to as many green spaces with fresh air as we would like. To help change our children's health prospects and encourage more activity across the school day and at home we are taking part in the Health for Life scheme. The scheme has had a huge impact on our children so far allowing them not only to experience a range of physical activity but also experiment with healthy eating and building on healthy sustainable lifestyles.

To furthur our pupil's awareness of active travel we have joined Modeshift Stars and WOW for which we are on our way to achieving the Bronze accredidation. Children have reaped the benefits (and continue) of these initiatives and can articulate the significance of sustainable travel such as walking, cycling, park and stride and catching a bus. We would like to continue the pupil's learning and exposure to having healthy active lives with the support of this grant allowing us to embed these initiatives and create sustainable outcomes for generations of school children to come.

2. What you will spend the grant funding on?

The funding will be spent on the promotion of health, active travel, sport and suatianabilty. Our children will benefit from having playground markings to use during break, lunch and P.E times. This will increase participation, engagement and the love for sport. It will also allow teachers to deliver high quality P.E lessons. Having a stimulating and enjoyable environement which nurtures the pupil's physical well being will be key to encouraging active lifestyles.

As well as this, we would like to create running track to encourage children to be active. In the previous years we implemented the daily mile within school times and a running track would furthur this initative. This will be reinforced through PE, PSHE lessons and collective worship (this is where we encourage children to reflect upon their physical and mental health and promote positive life choices). We believe, this will have a positive impact on children's love for being physically active which will make them want to continue this outside of school and positively impact their families at home and the school community.

We would like to spend some of the funding on enhancing our pupil's understanding of promoting a sustainable future through workshops for children and staff. We are currently working with the Aston Villa FC partnership who will deliver these programmes. These programmes expose children to different environmental, local and global issues. Moreover, they give children the onus to make that change within school and their local community.

With our growing issues surrounding climate change we feel it is vitally important to encourage more sustainable travel where ever possible and encourage living sustainable lives with our pupils. With this grant we will be able to furthur develop initiatives we have at school and take them to the next level to promote healthy lifestyles and active travel which will have a lasting impact on generations of pupils.

With this grant we will put in place methods to reduce congestion through active travel encourage pupils and their families to think consciously about the environment and their own mental and physical well being.
