1. Purpose of report:

To consider an application to review a Premises Licence.

2. Recommendation:

To consider and determine the review application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

Review application received on 28th November 2016 from the Chief Inspector of Weights and Measures in respect of International Supermarket, 117 Villa Road, Birmingham, B19 1NH.

Representations have been received from West Midlands Police, as a responsible authority, and from other persons.

4. Compliance Issues:

4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:

The report complies with the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Council's Corporate Plan to improve the standard of all licensed persons, premises and vehicles in the City.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

The Chief Officer of Weights and Measures applied on 28th November 2016 for a review of the Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for International Supermarket, 117 Villa Road, Birmingham, B19 1NH.

A representation has been received from West Midlands Police, as a responsible authority. See Appendix 1.

A representation has been received from other persons, which is attached at Appendix 2.

Review application is attached at Appendix 3.

Since the review application was submitted an application was made by Girmay Sibhatu on 4th January 2017 to transfer the premises licence from Najibullah Asakzai. This applicant requested that the transfer was to have immediate effect.

The Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 4.

Site location plans are attached at Appendix 5.

When carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must have regard to Birmingham City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

West Midlands Police are in reciept of the application made by the Chief Inspector of Weights and measures to review the following licensed premise -

International Supermarket 117 Villa Road Lozells B19 1NH

West Midlands Police fully support the grounds as stated in the review application and wish to join in with this application. These premises are well known to West Midlands Police, in June 2016 West Midlands Police applied for an expedited review of the premises following a serious disorder inside the premises.

Although the DPS and PLH were changed it is still very evident that these premises are being used to furnish serious criminal activities, with the premises this time being found to have concealed large quantiites of both counterfiet and illegal cigarettes and tobacco.

The Sec 182 guidance makes very clear reference to premises that are used ot sell illegal, counterfeit goods and non duty paid tobacco, and encourages local authorities to consider revocation even on the first instance. With the number fo items siezed being so large, West Midlands Police will be making the case for revocation to be the only course of action.

West Midlands Polcie wish to join this review application on the grounds of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety and will be present at the full review hearing

The premises licence holder, Mr Najibullah Asakzai, is associated with licensed premises known as European Food Express, 202 High Street, Dudley as well as International Supermarket, 117 Villa Road, Birmingham B19 1NH. Both of these premises have been used to engage in criminal activity, namely the sale of smuggled tobacco. Evidence relating to the sale of illegal tobacco from International Supermarket will be produced before the Licensing Sub-Committee.

This type of activity should be treated particularly seriously. The crime prevention objective is being undermined by this premises licence holder and as such we will be requesting that the committee use its powers to revoke the premises licence.

On 2 February 2016 Birmingham Trading Standards Service received information from a West Midlands Police Officer concerning a number of incidents dating from 26 January 2016 at Villa Supermarket 117 Villa Road Birmingham B19 1NH.

The information stated that the officer had viewed 30 minutes of CCTV footage of the premises depicting the sale of alcohol to a drunk male.

The footage also showed single cigarettes being sold to five separate customers

There were two occasions where a staff member got a cigarette style pack from underneath the shop window having to get down on his hands and knees to retrieve the goods.

On a further occasion similar items were taken from beneath the counter. On all three occasions cigarettes were not taken from the tobacco gantry.

Often single cigarettes are sold to children as they have less money available to buy full packets.

The officer also reported a male attempting to sell items to shop staff that were potentially stolen goods (Reference WK/008236832- M3 complaint form)

On 6 July 2016 Birmingham Trading Standards received anonymous information alleging that counterfeit cigarettes and polish cigarettes were being supplied from International Food Store 117 Villa Road Birmingham B19 1NH. The information also alleged that cigarettes were being sold to children. (Reference WK/008354183- M3 complaint form)

On 15 July 2016 Birmingham Trading Standards Service received anonymous information alleging that illegal cigarettes and cigarettes from other countries were being supplied from International Food Store 117 Villa Road Birmingham B19 1NH. (Reference WK/008361385- M3 complaint form)

On 12 September 2016 officers of Birmingham Trading Standards Service in company with a child acting as a volunteer attempted to make a test purchase from the retail premises at 117 Villa Road in order to test compliance of the law in relation to the supply of cigarettes to children. On this occasion the test purchase had to be aborted because of the presence of a number of drunken people who were loitering outside the premises. It was the view of the officers that it would be unsafe to send the volunteer into the shop. (Reference WK/008398981- M3 job form)

On 19 September 2016 an officer of Birmingham City Council's Licensing section received information alleging that illegal cigarettes were being sold from the premises and that cigarettes were being sold to children. The complainant provided video evidence that they allege depicts the supply of illicit cigarettes.

(Reference WK/008408810- M3 complaint form)

On 20 September 2016 Birmingham Trading Standards Service received information from an officer of Sandwell Trading Standards Service alleging that counterfeit cigarettes were being supplied and that cigarettes were being sold to children from International Food Store 117 Villa Road Birmingham B19 1NH. (Reference WK/008411313- M3 complaint form)

On 19 October 2016 Birmingham Trading Standards Service conducted a co-ordinated exercise with West Midlands Police which involved visiting a number of premises to check for alcohol and tobacco compliance. One of the premises visited was Villa Supermarket 117 Villa Road Birmingham B19 1NH. An inspection of the premises was conducted with the assistance of a dog handler and a dog that is trained to detect illicit and concealed tobacco.

The inspection revealed a total of 1652 packets of counterfeit and illicit cigarettes and 26 packets of illicit hand rolling tobacco. The majority of these items were found hidden in the ceiling cavity in the shop. A smaller amount was found hidden in a concealed area that was behind the shop counter.

Mr Saimok Zohrabnejad was present at the time of the inspection.

Mr Najibullah Asakzai, the Premises License Holder and current Designated Premises Supervisor was not present at the time of the inspection.

Photographs taken at the time of the visit are included. (Reference-Photographs) (Reference WK/008430488- M3 job form)

On 20 October 2016 Mr Nawzad Howla contacted an officer of Birmingham Trading Standards Service in relation to the seizure of cigarettes the previous day.

Mr Howla stated the following

1-He is a previous owner of Villa Supermarket 117 Villa Road Birmingham B19 1NH.

- 2-That his licence to sell alcohol at that premises was revoked in June 2016.
- 3-That he sold the business around June or July 2016.
- 4-That he left the seized items at the premises because he did not want to take them to his home.

5-That the seized items are all his property and have nothing to do with the current owners of the business.

The premises that is the subject of this application for review of its licence to sell alcohol is known as both Villa Supermarket and International Food Store 117 Villa Road Birmingham B19 1NH

On 19 October 2016 officers of Birmingham Trading Standards Service carried out an inspection of Villa Supermarket and seized 1652 packets of illicit cigarettes and 26 packets of illicit hand rolling tobacco.

However since February 2016 Birmingham Trading Standards Service have received 5 separate pieces of information alleging that the premises is at the centre of an array of illegal activity that ranges from being a place that stolen goods can be bought and sold to selling cigarettes to children.

An additional point of note is that on 12 September 2016 officers from Birmingham Trading Standards Service were to attempt a test purchase of tobacco with an underage volunteer; they decided to abort the test purchase because they were concerned about the safety of the volunteer due to the presence of drunken people who were loitering outside the premises. This was at a time when the premises were not licensed to sell alcohol.

As stated during the inspection on 19 October 2016 a total of 1678 packets of illicit cigarettes/tobacco were seized. The vast majority of these items were found hidden in the ceiling cavity of the shop. The remainder were found concealed in a cavity behind the counter of the shop. The fact that these items were concealed in the way that they were indicates that the proprietor of the business knew that the goods were illegal product and was aware that the items should not be on the premises.

On 27 June 2016 this premises was subject to an expedited review that was requested by West Midlands Police. The Premises License Holder at this time was Mr Nawzad Howla. The result of this was a revocation of the premises licence due to serious disorder in and around the premises. (A copy is attached reference PQ/ER/1.

The current Premises Licence Holder is Mr Najibullah Asakzai. The Licence was granted on 29 September 2016 but records show that the representation start date to be 1August 2016. As previously stated this service has received two separate pieces of information alleging wrong doing at this premises in the period after representation had begun and before the current licence was granted to Mr Asakzai.

It should also be noted that on 19 October 2016, the date of seizure, there were a number of people loitering outside the shop that appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. It would have been impossible for trading standards officers to carry out the inspection without the presence of uniformed police officers who were able to prevent interference from those people and maintain order.

As stated above Birmingham Trading Standards Service was contacted by the previous Premises Licence Holder, Mr Nawzad Howla who said that the seized items were his and had nothing to do with the current owners of the business.

Mr Howla has been asked to supply documentation providing the date that he sold the business. He has failed to supply any documentation or confirm the exact date of the transaction. I would request that the committee to consider the feasibility of Mr Howla's version of events given that the approximate value of the seized items is £5873. It is our contention that the current licence holder was aware of the tobacco products especially when we take account of the complaints made in September to the trading standards and licencing service.

At the time of submitting this review application the current Premises Licence Holder has not

made any comments.

Furthermore, one must ask is it the actions of an honest business to store any type of item in the ceiling cavity?

It is the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Weights and Measures that the premises known as International Supermarket is in breach of the following Licensing objectives

"Crime- Failed to prevent crime and disorder" in that it can be shown that there was a large quantity of illicit cigarettes and tobacco on the premises. Duty would not have been paid on these products and this is considered serious under the Licensing Act 2003.

It is also alleged that stolen goods are potentially bought and sold from the premises.

"Safety-Failed to promote public safety" in that it can be shown that there was a large quantity of illicit tobacco on the premises.

"Nuisance - Failed to promote and prevent public nuisance" in that on more than one occasion persons have been loitering outside of the premises that appear to be under the influence of alcohol; this can be intimidating for the general public.

"Child-Failed to promote and protect children from harm"- in that it is alleged that they sell cigarettes to children.

It is alleged that they sell single cigarettes; often this is to entice children to purchase them as full packets of cigarettes are expensive.

It is therefore requested that the Committee consider a revocation of the premises licence in this instance.

Martin,

I've been viewing some CCTV from the 26th Jan from this premises trying to identify them serving a drunk male that was witnessed by a Police Officer.

I have 30mins of footage and in that time they sell single cigarettes to 5 separate customers. The cigarettes are taken from a pack in the till draw and one under the counter. Each customer places by the looks of it 50p on the counter and immediately the member of staff knows what they want and gets the cigarette.

The times this has been witnessed are:

14:31:18 - 14:38:31 - 14:44:25 - 14:47:22 - 14:48:16

Also on the footage are 2 occasions were the member of staff gets a cigarette style pack from underneath the shop window having to get on his hands and knees to retrieve it and another from under the counter. Both are not taken from the normal stock of cigarettes on display.

Other issues have been identified like a male trying to sell an item to the staff in the shop (possibly stolen) and the drunk male being served which we will deal with.

Could do with a joint visit to this place ASAP.

That having reviewed the premises licence held under the Licensing Act 2003 by Mr Nawzad Howla in respect of The Villa Supermarket, 117 Villa Road, Handsworth, Birmingham B19 1NH, following an application for an expedited review made on 1 June 2016, on behalf of the Chief Officer of West Midlands Police, this Sub-Committee hereby determines to:

REVOKE the LICENCE, in order to promote the prevention of crime and disorder objective in the Act.

The Sub-Committee's reasons for revoking the licence are due to concerns by West Midlands Police in relation to matters which came to light at the premises on 31 May 2016, when the Police attended after reports of an incident. The incident was captured on CCTV, which was shown to the Sub-Committee.

Members of the Sub-Committee saw various CCTV footage of the incident in question and the events leading up to it and it was clear that some form of altercation had taken place. However, what had been initially reported to the Police, namely that an individual had been found unconscious outside the premises, after being pushed, then falling over and banging his head, was not borne out by the CCTV evidence. The Sub-Committee observed various individuals participating in an attack on a member of the public who had visited the premises earlier. It was admitted by the Premises Licence Holder that the incident shown on CCTV was a serious incident but he denied any personal involvement in it.

The Sub-Committee were persuaded by the conclusion drawn by the Police, who had no faith in the ability of the Premises Licence Holder (who was also the Designated Premises Supervisor) to run and manage the premises, particularly given the additional issues which had come to Police attention, such as the sale of alcohol to street drinkers, and sale of single cigarettes. The Police also informed the Sub-Committee that on the day of the interim steps meeting, when the Licence was suspended, they had visited the premises during the evening and discovered that despite the suspension issued earlier that day, alcohol remained on sale in the premises.

The Sub-Committee noted that the Premises Licence Holder denied knowledge and/ or responsibility for these issues, despite being the person with ultimate responsibility under the Licence for both managing the premises and promoting the licensing objectives.

It was therefore necessary and reasonable to impose a revocation to address the continuing problems with the premises, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder objective in the Act.

Although the Sub-Committee gave careful consideration to the submissions/ volunteered conditions made by the premises licence holder's solicitor, such as limiting sales of single cans of alcohol, members were not persuaded that the issues identified could be addressed satisfactorily.

The Sub-Committee gave consideration as to whether it could modify the conditions of the licence or to suspend the licence for a specified period of not more than 3 months, but was not satisfied, given the evidence submitted, that the licensing objectives would be properly promoted following any such determination.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 by the Secretary of State, the Guidance issued by the Home Office in relation to expedited and summary licence reviews, the application and certificate issued by West Midlands Police under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003, the written representations and the submissions made at the hearing by the police, and the premises licence holder and their solicitor.

INTERIM STEPS

The following interim steps are maintained as part of this decision notice:

- The suspension imposed on 3 June 2016 remains in effect until the hearing of any appeal, if there is one.
- That Mr Nawzad Howla be removed as the Designated Premises Supervisor.

Any decision to the contrary would not be consistent with the decision of the Sub-Committee today.

All parties are reminded that under the provisions contained within Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, there is the right of appeal against the decision of the Licensing Authority to the Magistrates' Court, such an appeal to be made within twenty-one days of the date of notification of the decision. Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2) In this condition:- (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where-(i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence- (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence; or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with operating schedule

2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the Designated Premises Supervisor or another qualified person will train any staff at the premises on; •All of the licensing objectives contained in the Licensing Act 2003; •Responsible retailing of alcohol, and the law regarding sales of alcohol; •The protection of children from harm and this must include how to competently check customers 'identification where necessary;

•Permitted hours during which licensable activities can take place and on compliance with the conditions attached to the premises licence.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure all staff will be trained with regard to the relevant legislation of the Licensing Act 2003. All staff training records shall be documented and signed by both the trainer and trainee, which shall be made available to any of the Responsible Authorities on request. Refresher training will be completed and documented every 6 months.

The staff training records will be kept at the premises and made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

Prominent signs with regard to alcohol sales shall be displayed at the premises.

CCTV will be recording and cover all areas open to members of the public, including the interior, front exterior of the premises and the entrance of the premises. This will be to the recommendation and specification of West Midlands Police. The CCTV will operate whenever the premises are open to members of the public. It will hold recorded data for a minimum of 31 days, and be made available to any Responsible Authority on request.

A refusal book shall be maintained and kept at the premises and will be signed off weekly by the DPS. The refusal book shall be made available immediately to any Responsible Authority upon request.

A member of staff in possession of a personal licence will be on the premises after 23:00hrs until 06:00hrs every day. In addition, all staff members will be able to operate and download CCTV at all times.

The premises will maintain an incident book and will record all incidents occurring inside or immediately outside the premises and will be signed off by the DPS on a weekly basis. This will be produced to all Responsible Authorities immediately on request.

SIA registered door supervision, wearing high visibility clothing, to be at the premises from 23:00hrs until 06:00 hrs on Fridays, Saturdays and on Sundays before a Bank Holiday.

The premises shall have a panic button facility.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

Emergency lighting will be fitted at the premises and will be checked on a weekly basis. These checks are to be documented and produced to any responsible authority on request.

Entrances, exits and passageways are to be kept clear.

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

Notices must be prominently displayed at the exit from the premises requesting that customers respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises quietly.

No alcohol will be permitted on the premises in open containers.

No alcohol to be consumed on the premises.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm

The Premises shall adopt a Challenge 25 Scheme and signage shall be displayed on site advising customers of the scheme. All staff shall be trained on the Challenge 25 scheme and this shall be recorded in the training register confirming the date of training, staff member trained, who conducted the training and the staff member and trainer shall sign the register.

The premises licence holder will maintain a refusals register (or refusal button on EPOS –Electronic Point of Sale) on the premises and ensure it is completed whenever a sale is refused to a person who cannot prove they are over the age of 18. The refusal register or record of till recorded refusals must be signed off on a weekly basis by the DPS and be made available to any Responsible Authority on request.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that any alcohol on display is not obstructed from the view of the sales assistants.


