- 5. **Funding opportunities** Carla Belle
  - Celebrating Communities fund Beyond Birmingham 2022, both Trinity and Roughley Wards have an allocation of £11,000 for this year which local groups can apply for to fund a community event.
  - Community Chest localised unrestricted funding each Ward as an allocation of £10,000 for 2023
  - Brum Breathes Funding to be spent on improving air quality across the city, both Trinty and Roughley Wards have a £20,000 allocation for 2023/4 and 2024/5.
  - Highways Minor improvements budget £10,000 per Councillor to be spent on Ward improvements.
- 6. **Brum Breathes proposal for Roughley Ward** Cllr Ewan Mackay outlined a proposal to bid for funding for a grass verge protection scheme on Slade Road, Roughley. This would physically prevent parking on the grass verges, as well as adding wildflower planting to the area at an estimated cost of £28,000. This proposal was supported by the residents at the meeting.
- 7. **Review of the Ward plans** Both plans were reviewed by the Cllrs section by section noting working in progress and achievements, both plans to be reviewed again in 6 months' time.
