Enlargement of a Community Primary School by Expansion
Harborne Primary School

Notice is given in accordance with section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Birmingham City Council proposes to make prescribed alterations to Harborne Primary School (a Community school), Station Road, Harborne, Birmingham B17 8QB, namely enlargement of the premises by expansion with effect from 1st September 2019.

The current net capacity of the school is 630. The proposed net capacity is 840. The current number of pupils registered at the school is 630 (excluding nursery). The current admission number for the school's Reception class is 90. It is proposed that the admission number for Reception will increase to 120 with effect from 1st September 2019. The school has agreed to take up to an additional 30 places in Reception in September 2018 in available temporary space at the Station Road site. The school currently operates from the main site at Station Road, Harborne. An additional site has been identified for the building of an annex on Court Oak Road, Harborne, Birmingham B17 9AB to provide the additional classrooms and further space required to accommodate the additional form of entry (30 places per year). This site is approximately 0.67 miles (1.1 kilometres) from the main site.
