1. Purpose of report:

To consider a representation that has been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which initially sought to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises) and the provision of regulated entertainment consisting of live music and recorded music. The times for these licensable activities are stated in the application form.

The applicant has agreed to amend the application and is now seeking to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises) to operate from 12:00midday until 11:00pm (Sunday to Thursday) and 12:00midday until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday).

The provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of live music and recorded music, to operate indoors only, from 7:00pm until 11:00pm (Thursday) and 7:00pm until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 8:00am until 11:00pm (Sunday to Thursday) and 8:00am until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday).

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representation that has been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 18th February 2019, in respect of the Warehouse Café Bar, 55 – 57 Allison Street, Digbeth, Birmingham, B5 5TH.

A representation has been received from other persons.

4. Compliance Issues:

4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:

The report complies with the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Council's Corporate Plan to improve the standard of all licensed persons, premises and vehicles in the City.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

The Warehouse Café Co-Operative Limited applied on 18th February 2019 for the grant of a Premises Licence for the Warehouse Café Bar, 55 – 57 Allison Street, Digbeth, Birmingham, B5 5TH.

A representation has been received from other persons. See Appendix 1.

The application is attached at Appendix 2.

Site Location Plans at Appendix 3.

It should be noted that there is a special policy in force for the Digbeth area. The effect of a special policy is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new licences or material variations to existing licences will normally be refused unless it can be shown that the premises concerned will not add to the cumulative impact on the licensing objectives being experienced.

The Council will expect the applicant to demonstrate the steps it will take to promote the licensing objectives. Where relevant representations are made, the Council will consider the application on its individual merits and decide whether to apply the special policy.

When carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must have regard to Birmingham City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The Licensing Authority is also required to take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:-

- a. The prevention of crime and disorder;
- b. Public safety;
- c. The prevention of public nuisance; and
- d. The protection of children from harm.

Dear Sir/Madam,

We are a writing to raise some concerns over the licence application 109976 by The Warehouse Café Co-operative Limited, 54-57 Allison Street, Digbeth, Birmingham.

We have operated as a hostel for 26 vulnerable men for the past 40 years at 52 Allison Street, Digbeth, they have a mixture of problems including alcoholism, mental health, learning difficulties and chronic health conditions.

The unit applying for the licence is next door to our building and we have concerns related to public nuisance.

We have been in discussions with Mr Emmanuel Blondel about the operating hours and after realising the nature of the vulnerable residents next door he has agreed to restrict the operating hours Sunday to Thursday 12:00 to 23:00 and Friday to Saturday 12:00 to 00:00. However, this is not reflected on the public register as of yet. We additionally request that the operating hours on Friday and Saturday are also 12:00 to 23:00 due to the venue being so close to the hostel and the vulnerability of the residents.

Another venue some 45 yards from the hostel (licence 93163 SPM Restaurants Ltd) have had the following committee conditions applied and we would request the same for this venue:

NUSIANCE

Clear legible notices to be displayed at all exits/entrances to the premises requesting patrons to consider the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

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That external notices are displayed requesting that patrons respect nearby residents and keep noise levels to a minimum.

That all doors and windows remain closed during regulated entertainment in the premises.

That the licence holder/DPS ensures daily litter patrols to clear litter from all external areas and that external litter bins are provided.

That bottle bins are not to be emptied after 10pm (we request 9pm) or before 8am.

No deliveries to the premises to be permitted after 6pm or before 8am.

There has been a launch event at the premises and there was a problem with smoking and talking, directly outside the venue on the pavement, which can be heard by residents at the back of the hostel. To minimise the effect on our residents we would request that the side entrance onto Shaws Passage is used after 9pm for people smoking, entering/leaving and notices displayed as stated above to be considerate of neighbours with regard to noise.

Hennesseys Bars Limited (licence 108293) further down the road on Allison Street had additional conditions applied to protect the residents of the Brolley Works flats opposite from public nuisance. We would request the following for this venue:

- Shaws Passage entrance/exit to be used after 9pm.

- Taxis to pick up/drop off on Shaws Passage.

- The consumption of alcohol and food on the premises only - no consumption outside.

To date there has been no live or recorded music at the venue although this is planned for the coming weekend. There is very little if any noise insulation to their building

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therefore we are very concerned about the application to play live music (E) and recorded music (F).

If we are subject to noise nuisance we would request:

Noise attenuation works to the premises shall be approved and implemented to the reasonable satisfaction of Birmingham City Council Regulatory Services.

A noise limiting device is installed in the premises and set at a level agreed with Birmingham City Council Regulatory Services. All regulatory entertainment, live or recorded shall be controlled by the limiter.

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LICENSING OBJECTIVES

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

The business plan is that of a cafe during the day, and a specialty craft beer and gin bar in the evening that gets booked for events, not a full time boozer. Combined this with the status of the cafe as a vegetarian restaurant inside the Friends of the Earth building should create a self selecting client base that isn't likely to cause trouble.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The staff leadership are well versed in identifying problem customers and denying them service and evicting them in the unlikely event that they might cause trouble. While we are applying for a late night license Thursday to Saturday this is not expected to be used in the vast majority of nights, simply for booked events upon occasion.

c) Public safety

While the cafe might be open to the street in the summer months during the day, it will be self contained in the evenings, and most events are not going to be focused on drinking. The building already has cctv inside and out, lights out the front, and while we aim to have full training, a number of us have experience in de-escalation, mediation and conflict management.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We will wish to maintain a good relationship between Birmingham FotE and their neighbours, as well as developing a working relationship with them ourselves. Fortunately the space is fully internal to the building, with the main room having thick walls and other rooms on each side, which will greatly minimise any noise to the neighbours. We will also have signs requesting that patrons keep noise to a minimum and given our position within the FotE building we will judge very harshly any littering and damage to the local environment.

e) The protection of children from harm

Children will be welcome in the space during the day, we will have an area of the room specially for them, with sofas and toys etc, but visible to the rest of the room. We intend to operate a 'no children after 8pm' policy except in special cases. For larger events such as the feminist free school that will be using the space (perhaps before we have moved in) they are booking other rooms in the building.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
 - is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
 indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
 the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
 Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity. A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence. A current immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer. A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence. Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number. Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:evidence of the applicant's own identity - such as a passport, evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member - e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months: (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer, (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank, (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements. Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form. Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-(i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality; (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph; (iii) any page containing the holder's signature; (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work. if the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided. Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:


- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises
 of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500,
 and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local
 authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.


Continued from previous page... Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable. Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for: any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided 0 by or on behalf of the local authority; any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the ٥ entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider; any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or o on behalf of the school proprietor; and any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling 0 circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
