## **1.** Purpose of report:

To consider a relevant representation that has been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence which seeks to extend the hours for the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on and off the premises); the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of live music, recorded music and the performances of dance (indoors only) and the provision of Late Night Refreshment until 02.00am on Friday and Saturday.

The application also seeks to extend the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of Anything of a similar description to live music, recorded music and performances of dance, to operate indoors only, from 10:00am until 12:00midnight (Sunday to Wednesday), 10:00am until 01:00am (Thursday) and 10:00am until 02:00am (Friday and Saturday).

The times during which existing permitted licensable activities can take place on all other days to remain unchanged.

Premises to be open to the public from 07:00am until 12:30am (Sunday to Wednesday), 07:00am until 01:30am (Thursday) and 07:00am until 02:30am (Friday and Saturday).

The application also seeks to amend and add non-standard timings for notable days as detailed in the application form.

I am writing regarding the proposed change of Hours at the Slug and Lettuce High Street Harborne your Application reference 99698.

It is with some trepidation that I am making this representation as we are more than aware that living in such close proximity of the Hight Street, that it is inevitable, subsequently at certain times we have to be tolerant to Noise and Nuisance, and we have stood fast to this view, however this tolerance has to have some measurable perimeters, extending the hours is unacceptable.

We have had an accumulation of incidents over the last few years – rubbish and sick strewn along the street, Fighting and shouting in our street, urinating up walls and windows, noise from the venue. We accept it's something we live with, but extending this to such a late hour is not a good thing for the community, I am surprised that the operator has decided to do this, its dangerous, irresponsible and inconsiderate.

Looking carefully at the four licensing objectives stated in the Licensing Act 2003, the new proposed trading hours for this Public House raise several issues regarding The prevention of crime and disorder, Public Safety, The prevention of public nuisance and The protection of children from harm.

Within most of four categories issues could be raised, I have therefore decided to object primarily "The Prevention of Public Nuisance" mainly from noise pollution both from the Venue and the customers leaving the Venue, as I attained to earlier the current License allows for the venue to be cleared by 1.30 at night, which is bordering on the cusp of acceptability, however extending these hours by one hour to 2.30 exasperates the situations and in reasonable terms is unacceptable with so many residential properties so close. The principle that this nuisance could extended to the other category of The Protection of Children (is it reasonable too expect a young child to be disturbed by revellers at 2.30 or 3.00 in the morning?).

Extending these thoughts too the other two categories The prevention of Crime and Disorder & Public Safety, I would also question the local police regarding the ability to contain any disturbance from the venue should it arise, historically the customers from this venue have been "Boisterous" - so taking into consideration the budget cuts having to be dealt with, along with such an isolated venue (most Young Person Late night venues are zoned) at this time in the morning, I would suggest that resources may be stretched at this time in the evening. Further to this I would like to ask the Licensing Inspector to look at the track record of this venue regarding such matters.

Harborne is a primarily a residential area, with the Slug and Lettuce currently been one of the last venues to empty, generally speaking the area has calmed down by 2.00 because of this any problems attributable to the venue are easily identifiable, again I would venture it would be an unsafe decision to grant this to be extended too 2.30/3.00.

I would also like to draw attention to the fact that the venue has shown disregard too some of its Operating conditions, a specific example is the requirement to display "Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly" They simply don't have any - I Checked, this is among other indiscretions. We hear noise from the venue all the time.

Can you please guide me regarding this representation, and if I need to distribute it to any other parties, or whether this is something that you would deal with ?

Finally I would like to thank you for your time, and assure you that I am not simply been small minded about this matter, the extending of the hours for this venue is something I am genuinely concerned about.

This variation primarily seeks to extend the terminal hour for licensable activities to 02:00 on Fridays and Saturdays and with closing time 30 minutes thereafter. The application also seeks to add and amend non-standard timings to reflect the proposed extension of hours, and extend hours for entertainment similar to music or dance in line with all other licensable activities.

Given the changes proposed, the applicant has carefully considered the application, the effect of the licensing objectives and the Council's Licensing Policy. Pre-consultation has taken place with the Police Licensing Officer and Environmental Health Officer prior to submission of the application. The applicant believes the hours sought, coupled with the existing measures in place are unlikely to have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives.

Stonegate Pub Company Limited have an extensive licensing manual in place, detailing both company policies, appropriate across the whole estate, along with procedures in place at a local level to ensure that the premises operates to the highest standard and promotes the licensing objectives. These policies include: social responsibility of underage sales, which promote responsible drinking and discourage drunkenness, as well as procedures to prevent crime and disorder, and public nuisance. Stonegate take their responsibility as a premises licence holder seriously and are aware of, and will ensure compliance with, the mandatory condition on the licence regarding irresponsible drinks promotions.

Additionally, with regard to the additional hour for terminal hours sought, the premises has operated with temporary event notices to the later hour sought without any issues of note and which have not had a negative impact on the licensing objectives.



The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to--- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2) In this condition:- (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$ , where-(i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence---- (i) the holder of the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

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(3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made: (a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC), where the film has been classified by that Board, or (b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20(3)(b) (s74(3)(b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

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#### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with operating schedule

#### 2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment to take place indoors only.

No adult entertainment or services, with the exception of A.W.P. gaming machines, permitted on the premises.

#### 2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

Any person exercising a security activity as defined above shall be linked by means of text or radio pager to the Police enabling the Police to be alerted to instances of crime and/or disorder (where required).

No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any time the premises are open to the public.

Where C.C.T.V. is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the Police.

Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.

Toughened glasses shall be used for draft beer and lager at all times the premises are open to the public.

#### 2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

#### 2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

The use of the beer garden shall cease at 23.00 on Sunday - Thursday and at midnight on Friday and Saturday.

The external doors to the beer garden to be closed at 22:00.

Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

#### 2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm

Persons under the age of 16 will be admitted only if accompanied by an adult and are not permitted to enter the premises after 21:00 hours.


