- Birmingham has the 4th worst recycling rate in the country, we are ranked 335 out of 338 local authorities
- There have been over half a million reports of missed collections in the last 5 years, not including those missed collections that were not reported individually by residents.
- The Local Government Ombudsman upheld 95% of complaints about Birmingham City Council's waste service that it received last year.
- Fly-tipping in Birmingham is up by 84% since 2015/16.
- Labour had 9131 days to plan for the end of the waste disposal contract but left it 36 days before it expired to agree a plan. This resulted in more than £2.5m a year additional cost to the taxpayer and at least 10 more years use an inefficient and polluting incinerator'

All this despite a 53% increase in budget on waste collection service in last ten years.
