The proposals in this project specifically relate to children aged between 4 - 16.

Pupils aged (4 - 11): the proposal to move to a new site. remove all-through provision; will need to apply for year 7 place at alternative provision (school). Pupils in year 6 (age 11) during 2018/2019 academic year have the oportunity to apply for a place at an alternative school.

Secondary age boys (11 -16): change of age range would remove secondary provsion from Al-Hijrah School. Displaced Boys would have to apply for secondary schools elsewhere. (there is sufficient secondary school places [in the city, in this area?]).

Secondary age girls (11 - 16): change of age range

would remove secondary provision. Displaced Girls would have to apply for secondary schools elsewhere. (there is sufficient secondary school places [in the city, in this area?]

Al-Hijrah is a voluntary aided, Islamic, all-through school for girls and boys aged 4-16 years.

Since February 2014, the school has consistently received "inadequate" following Ofsted Inspections. An Interim Executive Board has been in place at the school since May 2014.

One of the reasons for the "inadequate" Ofsted judgement was the school's practice of segregation of older pupils by sex.

A legal case concluded that segregation by sex in coeducational (mixed sex) schools is contrary to the Equality Act 2010.

Following this judgement, the Secretary of State for Education said that mixed schools which segregated by sex should be given time to stop the practice. Segregation by sex will be taken into account in Ofsted school inspections from September 2018.

Following a further inspection by Ofsted in March 2017 the school received an "inadequate" Ofsted judgement, and was made subject to a Directive Academy Order.

The IEB and the Local Authority are proposing the following solution:

> Lower the Age Range of Al-Hijrah all-through school to be a Primary School: this means that Al-Hijrah will no longer offer secondary places for girls and boys so therefore alternative provision will have to be offered.

(The Directive Academy Order will then apply to the Primary provision and the preferred sponsor is Star Academies Trust. The primary provision on the current Al-Hijrah site is not fit for purpose so therefore we propose to relocate the primary pupils to the site formerly known as

the Small Heath Lower School site on Waverley Road. It should be noted that the name of the new Primary School will be determined by the Academy sponsor) TO EDIT.

- Secondary Provision for Boys: displaced Boys would have the oportunity for a place at a different secondary school.
- Secondary Provision for Girls: displaced Girls would have the oportunity for a place at a different secondary school and we are currently proposing a new Free School application under the presumption route for an Islamic Girls Secondary School (EIA for the Free School ref: EQUA187).

The project is acknowledged as challenging and complex.
