Dear Sir,

I am writing on behalf of my residents of Homehall House regarding proposed extension of licensing hours at Sutton Sports and Social Club, South Parade Sutton coldfield B72 1Qy. I enclose petition signed by the residents and family members. At present we are already having concerns and ongoing problems with parking of clubs minibus, removal van which are parked outside 24 hours a day and which (Director) drives doing removals. The outside of the club always looks dirty and when they do have private functions litter is left outside and I end up picking it up as my residents have to walk past the club into back entrance. The noise already from the club is causing problems when their back door is open and patrons are out on patio singing to already loud music. Many of my residents have been to the office to voice their concerns they are all aged from 63 – 89 years old and we have 59 apartments they come to Homehall House because they are retired and all they want is peace and quiet, not patrons coming onto the grounds with their drinks sitting on residents benches drinking and smoking and children sitting on the car park barrier. I hope you can consider all these issues before granting an extension. Also please find enclosed copy of photo taken by one of my residents on Saturday 1st July 2017 when van parked in front of our car park barrier went into club resident was behind him and sounded his horn for him to come out and move the van, when he did come out resident informed him he was parking in private road and in front of barrier, the resident was told to F--- off by the van driver, not something residents should have to put up with. Before Emma Davis and took control of club we had very little trouble and outside club was always


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clean and tidy and very little trouble with parking issues. Weekends are even more of a nightmare when they have private function and groups playing loud music.

Although there was a meeting on 11th May 2017 with Birmingham City Council Licensing Enforcement, the Local neighbourhood Policing Team and the Birmingham Police Licensing Team when various points were raised nothing has changed especially their attitudes towards residents concerns.

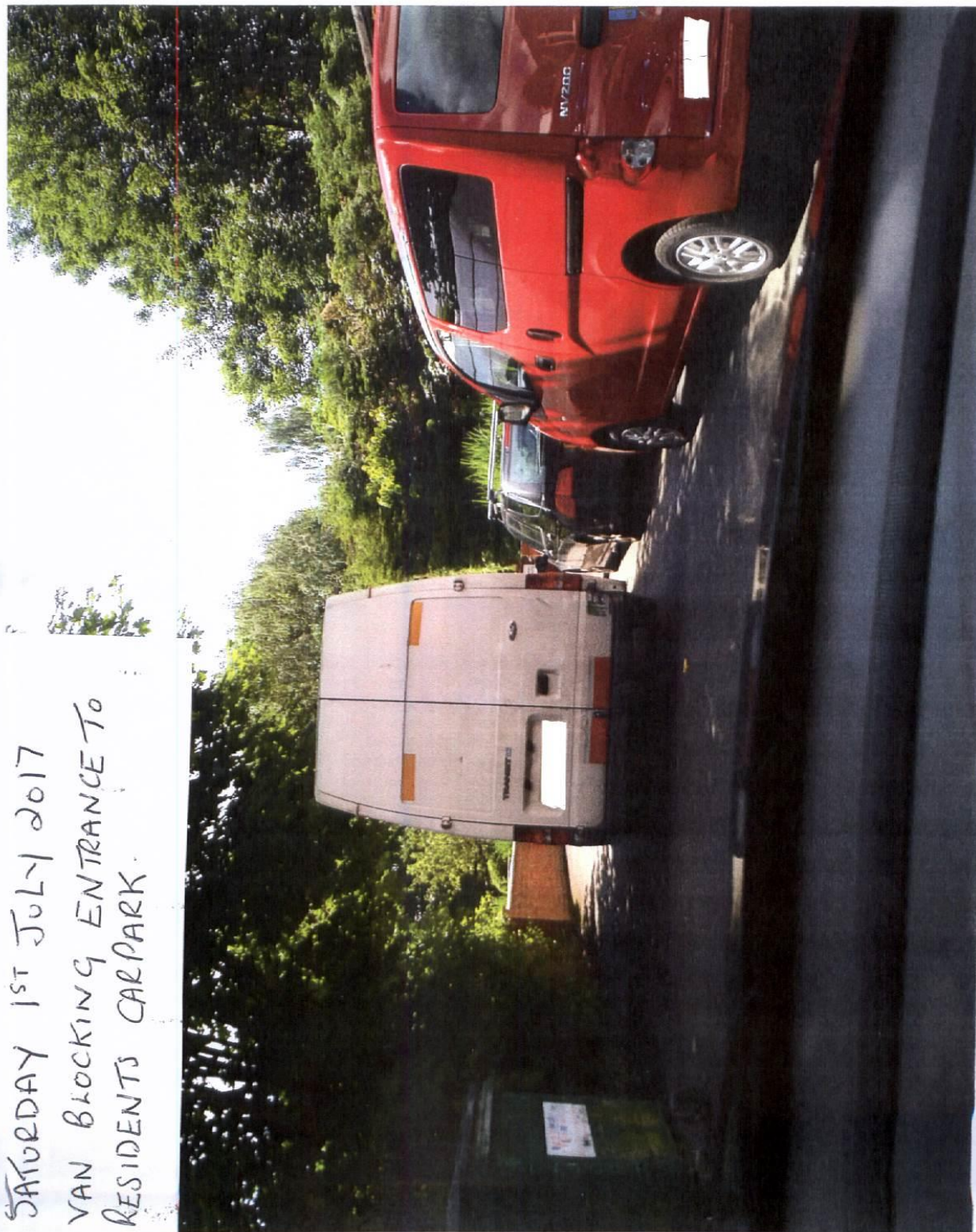

Dear Sir,

I am writing regarding the application by Mr. Emma Davies for a drinks licence for the above club. I have several concerns that I would like to raise with you.

These concerns are all drink related and have all started since Mr. Davies took over the club. Prior to that there have been no such problems with previous owners.

The retirement flats where I live are in close proximity to the club, there are 59 flats. Since the change of ownership many of our residents have received verbal abuse and bad language from the owner and patrons of the club when attempting to talk to them about the problems.

Firstly, the music which is always played loudly. It is particularly bad in the hot weather when they open all the doors and windows. Mostly

it occurs in the evenings, but it can go on all day on Saturdays and Sundays. So we have a choice of either sitting outside having to listen to it, or staying in our flats with the windows shut.

It seems she is trying to extend the opening hours on her application so we are going to get this noise until early hours of the mornings.

Secondly the parking. The road that leads to our carpark is a private road. This is regularly blocked by cars and a large removal lorry, which is a business run from the club. This includes cars on pavement stopping the passage of wheel chairs, and completely blocking the entrance to the car park. We also on three occasions have had damage to the bar that raised it, by patrons to the club, forcing it up to gain access to our car park. Any attempt to talk to these peoples is to receive verbal abuse and threats.

Trespass. People walk through our grounds to get to the club on occasion. They then return that way to get back to Upper Holland Rd. very late at night. This scares elderly tenants living on the ground floor hearing them pass. Also when there are parties with children involved they are left to play in that road at the back and invariably end up on our car park leaving litter, and areas children are when playing, very noisy on occasion.

It couldn't be so bad if you could talk to Mr Davies.
But you can't, he is very volatile and attitude that
says I'm going to do what I want to do.

Personally I would like to see the drinker licence taken
away from this club. As I've already said most of the
problems are drink related. And there are plenty of
places in Sutton Centre where people can get a drink
till late, that doesn't cause nuisance to peoples
dwellings, and affect the quality of peoples lives.
It could give you a better understanding of the problem
if you could come and view our site and the club.
If you should wish to do so I would be quite happy to
show the grounds and how the problems affect our
flats. If you should want to take up the offer I
have enclosed my phone number
