To permit the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of Indoor Sporting Events to operate from 12:00midday until 11:00pm (Monday to Saturday) and 12:00midday until 10:30pm (Sunday); Live Music and Performances of Dance to operate from 12:00midday until 11:00pm (Sunday to Thursday) and 12:00midday until 11:59pm (Friday and Saturday); Recorded Music to operate from 12:00midday until 11:00pm (Sunday to Thursday), 12:00midday until 12:30am (Friday) and 12:00midday until 01:00am (Saturday); and Anything of a Similar Description to operate from 12:00midday until 11:00pm (Monday to Thursday), 12:00midday until 11:59pm (Friday and Saturday) and 12:00midday until 10:30pm (Sunday). All activities to operate indoors only.

Premises to remain open to the public from 10:00am until 11:30pm (Monday to Thursday), 10:00am until 01:00am (Friday and Saturday) and 10:00am until 11:00pm (Sunday).

Other dates and times as specified in the application form.

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representations that have been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 28th June 2017 in respect of Sutton Sports & Social, South Parade, Sutton Coldfield, B72 1QU.

Representations have been received from other persons.

I am writing on behalf of my residents of Homehall House regarding proposed extension of licensing hours at Sutton Sports and Social Club, South Parade Sutton coldfield B72 1Qy.i enclose petition signed by the residents and family members . At present we are already having concerns and ongoing problems with parking of clubs minibus ,removal van which are parked outside 24 hours a day and which (Director) drives doing removals. The ouside of the club always looks dirty and when they do have private functions litter is left outside and I end up picking it up as my residents have to walk past the club into back enterance . The noise already from the club is causing problems when their back door is open and patrons are out on patio singing to already loud music. Many of my residents have been to the office to voice their concerns they are all aged from 63 - 89 years old and we have 59 apartments they come to Homehall House because they are retired and all they want is peace and quiet ,not patrons coming onto the grounds with their drinks sitting on residents benches drinking and smoking and children sitting on the car park barrier. I hope you can consider all these issues before granting an extension. Also please find enclosed copy of photo taken by one of my residents on Saturday 1st July 2017 when van parked in front of our car park barrier went into club resident was behind him and sounded his horn for him to come out and move the van, when he did come out resident informed him he was parking in private road and in front of barrier, the resident was told to F--- off by the van driver, not something residents should have to put up with. Before Emma Davis and took control of club we had very little trouble and outside club was always

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clean and tidy and very little trouble with parking issues. Weekends are even more of a nightmare when they have private function and groups playing loud music.

Although there was a meeting on 11th May 2017 with Birmingham City Council Licensing Enforcement, the Local neighbourhood Policing Team and the Birmingham Police Licensing Team when various points were raised nothing has changed especially their attitudes towards residents concerns.



Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

None of the mandatory conditions under the Licensing Act 2003 are currently applicable to these premises.

Embedded Restrictions

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means: a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 11 am. to 11 pm. b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30 pm. c. On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30 pm. d. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11 am. to 11 pm. e. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30 pm. g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day, which would be 11.00 am. if New Year's Day fell on a weekday or 12 noon if a Sunday. f. On Christmas day, as provided by the rules of the club and notified in writing by the chairman or secretary of the club to the licensing authority. The said hours shall: i. not exceed six and a half hours; ii. not begin earlier than 12 noon; iii. not end later than 10.30 pm. iv. provide for a break of at least 2 hours, including 3 pm. to 5 pm.; v. not extend for more than three and a half hours after 5 pm. The above restrictions do not prohibit the supply to, or consumption by, any person of alcohol in any premises where they are residing.
