I, Arron Hanson, as a representative of Environmental Health, formally raise a representation on the above application.

My representation is that the likely effect of the granting of this licence would not promote the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance

I am concerned that the grant of the licence would not be in keeping with the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The reason for my concern is that is that a 24 hour licence would bring vehicles, and people to the shop in a night time period with possible groups of people in an around the area.

This concern is based on the fact that in the immediate vicinity of the premises the ground floor uses on College road are retail/commercial, there are residential dwellings above these shops and there is a residential street across from the premises. Another concern is that the granting of this licence would allow other similar premises in the same location to apply for the same hours which would further increase the public nuisance in the area.

I do not believe that this concern can be dealt with by the use of appropriate conditions. If however, contrary to my recommendation, the licence is granted the condition I suggest to mitigate this concern would be a restriction of hours.

To safeguard the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance Environmental Health considers that the application should be refused.

#### In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience
  does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
  audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
  licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Good Afternoon Licensing,

With regard to the premises licence variation for SSS Stores, 9 college Rd, Handsworth Wood B20 2HU

West Midlands Police have reviewed this application and are happy that if the below conditions are added to the licence, together with the operating conditions already offered by the applicant then the licensing objectives will be met and promoted. The conditions have been agreed with the applicant, as per below email chain and is copied into this.

CCTV – to be fitted to the specifications and recommendations of West Midlands Police (Birmingham Central Police licensing team)

CCTV - to be recording at all times the premises is open for licensable activity

CCTV – images to be held for a minimum of 31 days

CCTV – a member of staff will be on duty at all times that is both trained and authorised to download cctv footage, which is to be provided to any Police officer/staff before they leave the store if requested

CCTV – if for any reason the old hard drive becomes broken, requires replacing or resetting the old hard drive will be kept for the 31 days and made available to any Police officer/staff on request.

Sales – no single sales of beer, cider, also pops or any other products below 10 cl for any defined spirit or 750 ml for wine, between the hours of 2200 and 0700

No sale to have included with it a single use drinking cup/implement

Sales - no alcohol shall be sold that has an aby of above 6.5% accept for wine and/or spirits

Trading – where the premises is trading beyond 2200 hours they will

- Have at least 2 members of staff on duty (1 of whom will hold a relevant personal licence as issued by a relevant licensing authority), or
- Where there is only 1 member of staff (whom will hold a relevant personal licence as issued by a
  relevant licensing authority) there will be at least 1 (one) SIA approved and registered door
  supervisor at the premises from 2200 hours until 0700 hours.
- Where a door supervisor is working then they will wear a his visibility coat/jacket, and display their SIA badge on their arm in a clear sleeve pocket

Door supervisor will be required to sign on and off duty for each night they work. Sign off to include full name, SIA badge, company working for (if applicable).

The premises will have a challenge 25 policy and will display posters at the entrance, by the tills and where the alcohol is displayed.

All staff prior to be allowed to sell alcohol will be trained in the Licensing Act 2003 prior to them being allowed to sell alcohol. Training to be provided by the DPS and/or a training company and will be kept on file for each member of staff. Training to be refreshed every 6 months

Premises to have a documented refusal book (for all age related products) to be signed off weekly by the DPS

If the above conditions are imposed onto the licence then West Midlands Police have no objection to this licence application.

#### Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:- (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$ , where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

# **Embedded Restrictions**

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means: a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, 8 am. to 11 pm. b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day, 10 am. to 10.30 pm. c. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 pm. and 7 pm. to 10.30 pm. d. On Good Friday, 8 am. to 10.30 p.m. The above restrictions do not prohibit: (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel; (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered; (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club; (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.




