MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING INCLUDING LOCAL CONCERNS:

- 1. Introductions by Cllr Brown
- 2. Notice of recording
- 3. Housing of Multiple Occupation -Roy Haselden from the private rented team delivered a presentation on the private rented sector this included problem landlords; empty properties ;enforcement powers; H.M.O legislation; licensing; supported accommodation ;Article 4; and Health and safety which included minimum room sizes. At the end of Roy's presentation he took questions from the residents which he answered and clarified some specific issues that residents had.
- 4. Tree's maintenance with Stuart Cross Amey Stuart briefly outlined the work of Amey who are the Highways maintenance contractor for Birmingham City Council, adding that he was happy to answer any Amey Highways related question not just tree related questions. Stuart then went on to explain the current Highways Tree program to the residents this involved the reasons why, how and when differing Trees are pruned, removed and replaced .Stuart answered a number of questions posed by the residents and took details of specific issues . Action .Stuart Cross to investigate the overgrown trees in Erdington Hall Road that residents reported as affecting street lighting.
- 5. Public Health Consultation and Presentation Dr Justin Varney Director Of Public Health Dr Varney explained that the B.C.C were currently consulting on a Public Health Green paper which would shape Public health policy in the city for the next four years .Four priorities have been identified Child Health ;Working aged adults; Ageing well and Healthy environment . The residents were provided with statistics and an info graphic

with the Gravelly Ward health inequalities .Which ranked Gravelly Ward 126th MOST DEPRIVED out of 7511 wards in the Country. With life expectancy 10 years lower than the most affluent ward in the city; childhood obesity rate of 11% of 4 to 5 yr olds and 31% of 10 to 11 yr. olds. Dr Varney said that the consultation was the start of the conversation on how to address the health inequalities across the City.
