1. Purpose of report:

To consider representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption off the premises) to operate from 7:00am until 9:00pm (Monday to Saturday) and 9:30am until 8:00pm (Sunday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 7:00am until 9:00pm (Monday to Saturday) and 9:30am until 8:00pm (Sunday).

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representations that have been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 13th February 2019, in respect of Jarmark, 5 – 9 Station Road, Erdington, Birmingham, B23 6UB.

Representations have been received from two responsible authorities, and from other persons.

4. Compliance Issues:

4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:

The report complies with the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Council's Corporate Plan to improve the standard of all licensed persons, premises and vehicles in the City.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

Jarmark Erdington Limited applied on 13th February 2019 for the grant of a Premises Licence for Jarmark, 5 – 9 Station Road, Erdington, Birmingham, B23 6UB.

Representations have been received from West Midlands Police and Trading Standards, as responsible authorities. See Appendices 1 & 2.

Representations have been received from other persons. See Appendices 3 - 5.

The application is attached at Appendix 6.

Site Location Plans at Appendix 7.

It should be noted that there is a special policy in force for the Erdington area. The effect of a special policy is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new licences or material variations to existing licences will normally be refused unless it can be shown that the premises concerned will not add to the cumulative impact on the licensing objectives being experienced.

The Council will expect the applicant to demonstrate the steps it will take to promote the licensing objectives. Where relevant representations are made, the Council will consider the application on its individual merits and decide whether to apply the special policy.

When carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must have regard to Birmingham City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The Licensing Authority is also required to take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:-

- a. The prevention of crime and disorder;
- b. Public safety;
- c. The prevention of public nuisance; and
- d. The protection of children from harm.

Thank you for forwarding a copy of the new lease for 5/7/9 Station Road. I assume this means that Jarmark is starting a new business at the premises which has no involvement with the previous shop owners?

In response to point 2. Trading Standards and West Midlands police witnessed a sale of alcohol to a 14 year old volunteer at Jarmark 261/3 Slade Rd on 2/11/15 followed by a warning letter to Monika Duda
 On 11.3.11 Trading Standards cautioned Monika Duda for the sale of alcohol to a minor at The Polish Shop 6 Wood End Road, Erdington.

I am aware that Ms Duda is DPS for 3 other premises in Birmingham as well as this proposed one with others outside of the city.

I am not convinced that being a DPS for so many premises gives sufficient control to satisfy the licensing objectives with regard to sales of age restricted products.

I am aware that West Midlands police have also now objected under similar grounds. **I wish to support the police objection for the above reasons.**

Dear Licensing

Myself and Cllr Alden wish to object to the above licensing application on the grounds of Prevention of Crime & Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Station Road already has a large number of off-licences which causes problems of street drinking and anti-social behaviour. As a result, this attracts a number of street drinkers to the area on an evening who engage in anti-social behaviour. It is quite common for these drinkers to take advantage of the secluded areas to drink alcohol and cause a nuisance to nearby residents. The presence of cans and bottles is common place

The number of off-licences in this area has led to a cumulative impact policy being introduced. The need for a CIP in this area is based on the crime and disorder and public nuisance that already exists. The addition of another off-licence in this area will make this situation worse. It is also a problem that the existing off-licences have to advertise offers to attract business, driving down the price of alcohol and making it cheaper for the street drinkers who are attracted to this area.

Nearby is Erdington High Street, the third largest local centre in Birmingham which attracts over a million visitors of the course of the year. It is a thriving part of Erdington which we, in partnership with the Erdington BID, have actively tried to improve. The area has suffered problems with street drinkers, who hang around on the High Street drinking all day and abusing those who pass by. This includes children. There has been much work from the Erdington Neighbourhood Police team to address these issues, and while there has been some success, there continues to be issues with street drinking and we are concerned about more off-licences opening up in the area and exacerbating this.

It is also worth noting that these premises were previously licenced but the licence was revoked following an investigation by Trading Standards. The premises had been found to be selling non-duty paid tobacco and cigarettes and we are concerned that since these premises are known to have engaged in such activity, it will become associated with this again.

The addition of a further off-licence in this area is contrary to the Licensing Objectives and the Council's Cumulative Impact Policy and therefore should be refused.

Dear sir/madam,

I would like to register some concerns regarding the above licensing application for 5-9 Station Road. My concerns are as follows:

There is a well-documented problem with groups of men congregating at the junction of Station Road and Johnson Road to drink. This gets worse in the summer months and causes problems with noise and litter. It can also be intimidating for local residents to have to walk through large groups of people drinking. There is also a litter problem in the area with discarded cans. An additional retail outlet for alcohol could potentially exacerbate this.

There are already several premises selling alcohol in the immediate area: Viktor's on Sutton New Road, the Co-op in the High Street, Raj's stores in Station Road and Costcutter on the junction of Station Road/Gravelly lane. There are also 4 pubs in proximity to this site. There is absolutely no need for further licensed premises in the area.

There are three nurseries and four schools in the immediate area. A licensed establishment open for such long hours and at times when children are travelling to and from school could potentially expose children and young adults to anti-social behaviour.

Furthermore, this establishment had its alcohol license removed some time ago for illegal sales of alcohol and tobacco. It is not clear from this application whether it has passed into new ownership. If it has not, then there would be significant risk of further violations of licensing conditions.

I hope you will be able to consider these concerns.

Digital CCTV will be installed at the premises to the reasonable satisfaction of the Police. The System must be operational at times when licensable activity is taking place. The system must have an image download capability. All recorded images must be kept for a minimum of **28** days. Full access to recordings must be given to Responsible Authorities immediately upon request

A notice stating that no sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be displayed at the premises

A notice stating that it is illegal for persons to buy alcohol on behalf of persons under 18 years of age will be displayed at the premises

A challenge 25 policy will be operated by the premises with notices informing customers of the policy being displayed within the premises with at least 1 sign on the door to the premises and 1 displayed behind the counter. Staff must be trained on this policy. The staff will be regularly reminded/ trained to enforce the challenge 25 policy

All alcohol sale refusals will be noted in a refusals register which can be inspected by a Responsible Authority on request



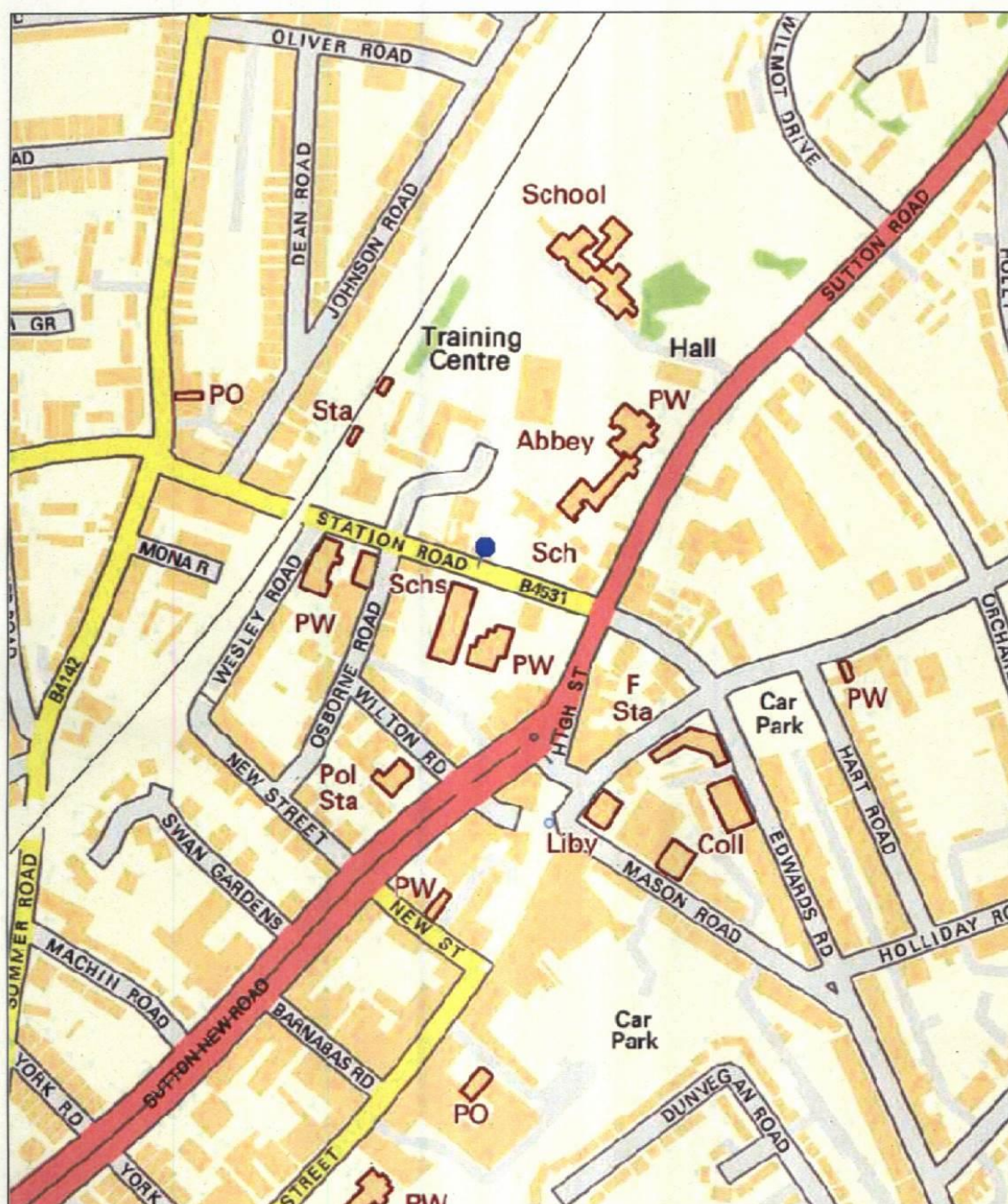

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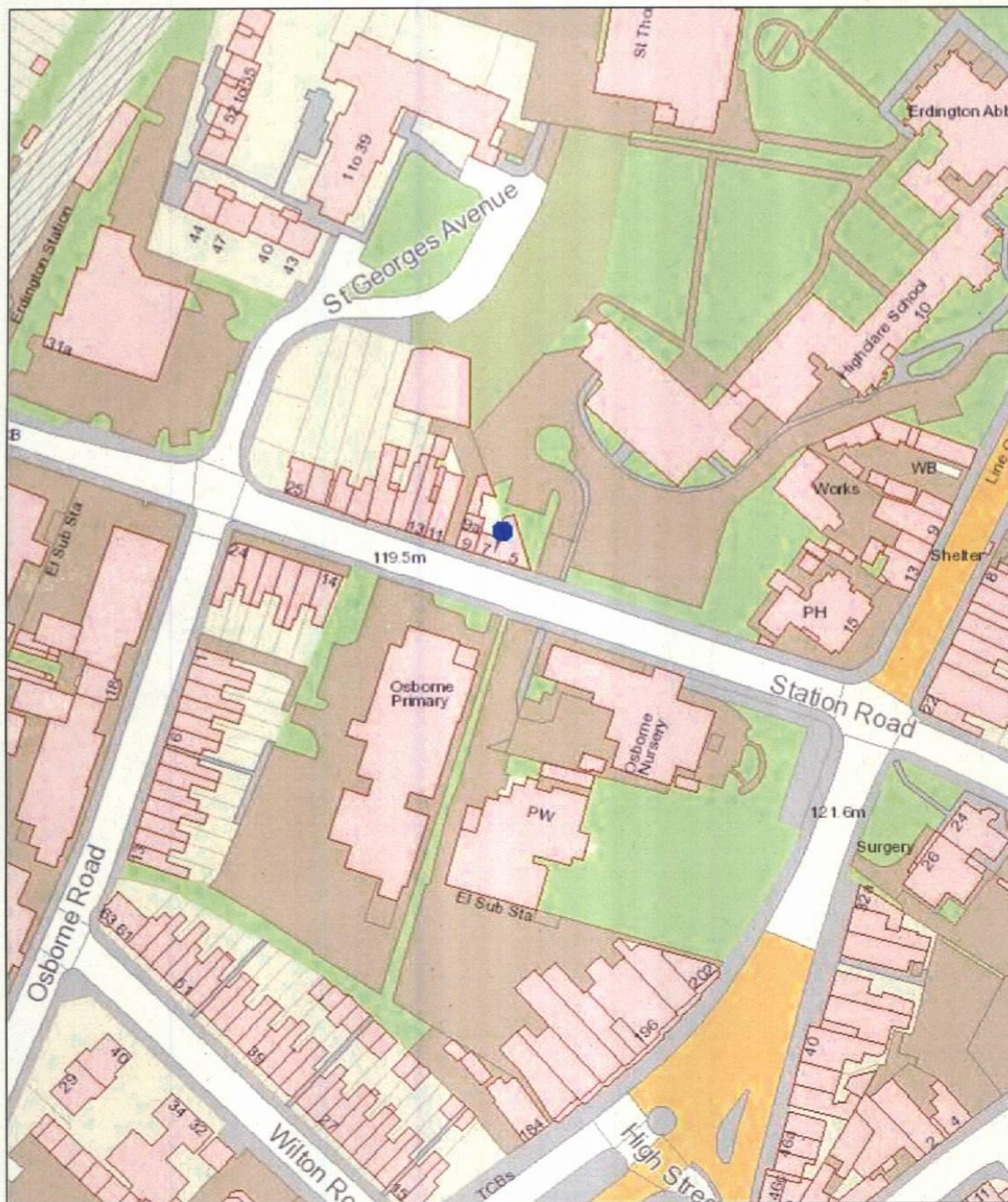
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
