# AMENDMENT TO MOTION 11A

# 1 to 11a

**CITY COUNCIL**  
**Tuesday 7 January 2023**

After 4<sup>th</sup> Paragraph add:

In 2022/23 the NHS budget was 39.6% higher in real terms than in 2010/11, and total expenditure on social care was £1.5bn higher in real terms. Only 4 countries spend more on healthcare as a proportion of GDP than the UK and there are more hospital staff per 1000 population than anywhere other than Switzerland. Despite this the system, in both Health and Social Care, continues to struggle to meet demand or to sustainably meet the pay demands of a dedicated workforce. It is clear that the answer is therefore not just about funding, but that more fundamental reform is needed.

In Birmingham, recently reported concerns highlighted about the culture at the University Birmingham Hospitals Trust demonstrate the need for a NHS system, remaining free at the point of use, with patient safety and quality of care at its heart and with proper accountability and transparency in management to ensure front line workers are valued and empowered to do their job.

After 'this council resolves to:'

Amend first paragraph to read 'Lobby the Government and unions to reach agreement to ensure that NHS staff and health and social care staff are paid fairly and avert further strike action that harms patient safety, increases waiting lists and outcomes.'

After first paragraph insert new paragraph to read 'Write to Government to call for a new Royal Commission to review the whole health and social care economy and develop a long-term, cross-party consensus on funding, reform and improved health outcomes for patients with an NHS that remains free at the point of use.'

At end of third paragraph insert 'This workforce plan should focus on frontline staff and patient outcomes rather than perceived 'non-jobs' such as 'Directors of lived experience'.
