 Local – speeding (average speed cameras needed on Stratford Road as a deterrent), need for regular enforcement, traffic at Robin Hood island, night time racers, Green Road ford should be closed to prevent vehicles needing retrieval by the emergency services, congestion around schools, parking on pavements & grass verges, tree roots causing damage to roads/pavements, cyclists on pavements, Southam Road used as a rat-run, pot holes, blocked drains, spaces behind shops on Hall Green Parade, pavements uneven. Residents Have Your Say:

- 1. <u>Bibury Road</u> issue about young drivers racing along the road but identified as a local issue involving local people. Councillor Robson suggested holding a local ward/surgery type meeting involving families from that area to discuss the problem.
- 2. <u>Taxi School Road</u> complaint made regarding the owner of a hackney carriage who started the engine of the vehicle hours before driving away, presumably due to the age of the cab. It was polluting the air but there appeared nowhere to report this action. Joe Green undertook to find out if

the matter could be reported through the Environmental Protection Unit.

- 3. <u>Hall Green Library</u> update provided on work to refurbish the children's area of the library. Friends of Hall Green Library had organised a fund raising community event on 30 June.
- 4. <u>Travellers, Sarehole Mill</u> recent encampment had left litter and rubbish which was cleared at the council's expense. Swanshurst Park had an injunction to prevent access and it was queried whether similar could be arranged for Sarehole Mill. Councillor Robson undertook to make enquiries. Councillor Ahmed referenced fines issues for fly tipping at the ford and that good news also needed to be reported and he undertook to include such in the councillor's quarterly newsletter.
- 5. <u>Hall Green Action Group</u> election of a new chair at the AGM so group will be reformed and revived.
- 6. <u>Hall Green Parade</u> special meeting to be arranged by Stuart Daniels to discuss parking issues and help revitalise the Parade councillors, local engineer and Joe Green to be invited.
- 7. <u>Tixall Road</u> shoots from tree trunks. Local Engineer to check with Amey's maintenance programme.
