- Plan to build six new tram extensions giving the best outcome for the travelling public and the local economy by 2026




East Birmingham to Solihull



This 17km extension will be a continuation of the Birmingham Eastside route which will see the Metro line extended to Solihull. The proposed Metro route will connect key destinations in Birmingham and UK Central including Heartlands Hospital, Birmingham International, the NEC and HS2 Interchange via the Bordesley Green / Chelmsley Wood Corridor.

Scheme Objectives



Five themes identified to guide the development of the scheme:

- Support regeneration in areas of high deprivation through improved connectivity with areas of opportunity
- Support economic development by improving the accessibility of (major) employment sites
- Encourage modal shift from private car by delivering a high quality and reliable public transport service
- Support an integrated transport network through providing seamless interchange
- Deliver a high quality public transport service in a manner that supports local environmental and safety benefits

Recognising that this is **not solely a transport scheme**, it is a catalyst for achieving these ambitions.

Wider Economic Benefits

- 298,000 extra people within 45 minute commute of UK Central
- Links with future development = 15-20% extra transport user benefits (£85m-£110m productivity)
- Increases attractiveness and value of commercial and housing developments and existing properties
- Strategic connectivity; Birmingham Business Park 55 mins from London via public transport (Metro and HS2)


