West Midlands Police have applied for an expedited review of the premises licence in respect of **King of the Clubs, Hill Street, Birmingham, B5 4AH.**

The application has been made under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 (as amended) and has been accompanied by a certificate signed by a senior member of the force, stating that in their opinion the licensed premises have been associated with serious crime and disorder. (See A and B above)

In accordance with the regulations, the licensing authority has given the premises licence holder and responsible authorities a copy of the application for review and a copy of the certificate.

This hearing has been arranged in order to consider whether it is necessary to take any interim steps in respect of the licence pending the determination of the review. The Premises Licence is included at item C.

The interim steps that must be considered at the hearing are:

- Modification of the conditions of the premises licence;
- Exclusion of the sale of alcohol by retail from the scope of the licence;
- Removal of the designated premises supervisor from the licence;
- Suspension of the licence


I am a Superintendent in West Midlands Police.

I am giving this certificate because I am of the opinion that the summary review procedure is necessary to ensure the licensing objectives are promoted expeditiously. Given the seriousness of the trigger incident on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2026, in my opinion immediate steps are required that can best be achieved through the summary review procedures. Other steps available under the Licensing Act 2003, including a standard review application, cannot lead to the imposition of immediately effective steps to promote the licensing objectives and so these are inadequate. I view this application as a proportionate and necessary response to the serious incident at the venue.

On Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2026 the venue was open and trading. As people were leaving the venue a serious violent disorder where items were used as weapons took place outside the venue on John Bright Street. This matter is a serious crime by virtue of the sentence tariff for the offence alleged.

In coming to my opinion, I have had regard to the facts of the incident and current investigation, the track record of the premises, the terms of section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 and Chapter 12 ("Summary Reviews") of the Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (December 2022 revision).

King of The Clubs is a licensed premises situated at Hill Street, Birmingham. B5 4AH. The premises license holder is DAN86 Ltd and the designated premises supervisor is Ms Angela Nelson.


The premises is licensed to sell alcohol for consumption on and off the premises 24 hours a day 7 days a week although alcohol sales conclude at 0200 hours Sunday to Thursday and 0400 hours Friday and Saturday unless otherwise agreed with the police.

The premises were open and conducting licensable activity on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2026. At approximately 2236 hours, as people were leaving the premises an incident occurred whereby a violent disorder occurred involving in excess of 100 people using items as weapons. This violent disorder is a serious crime by virtue of the sentencing tariff for the offence. The offence has been subject to a crime report for violent disorder against section 2 The Public Order Act 1986 the maximum sentence for this offence being 5 years imprisonment.

West Midlands Police have serious concerns for the promotion of the licensing objectives at this premises. The premises have had previous incidents involving persons leaving the premises requiring police attendance and assistance to disperse persons and the police have attempted to work with the premises in relation to this with no avail..

This is such a serious incident and breach of the licensing objectives that West Midlands Police would request that the premises license is suspended.



**Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -;(a) a holographic mark, or(b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that -;

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -; (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition: (a) permitted price is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$ , where (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) duty is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) value added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day (the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (the second day) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added

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tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made: (a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC), where the film has been classified by that Board, or (b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20(3)(b) (s74(3)(b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

The provisions of Regulated Entertainment and Late Night Refreshment shall take place indoors only.

The CCTV system is to be installed at the premises to the specification agreed with the West Midlands Police Licensing Department.

CCTV is to be operational whilst the premises are open and be recording continually. Recordings are to be kept for a minimum of 28 days. CCTV images to be made available to any responsible authority on request.

The premises licence holder shall have in place at the premises a search policy, which will be implemented to ensure that drugs and offensive weapons are not brought into the premises by patron.

The Premises to provide a standard operating risk assessment for each night of the week to include door staff numbers and deployment plan. Premises also to provide risk assessment for all non-standard events i.e. student nights.

An incident register of all occurrences and ejections from the premises will be maintained at the premises and any details of public order offences will be recorded. The register will be produced and made available for inspection upon request by a Responsible Authority.

If the premises use any new promoter for any external event, then for the first event the Designated Premises Supervisor will inform West Midlands Police Licensing Department at least 28 Days before the first event with a risk assessment for the event. Recommendations made to the Designated Premises Supervisor that satisfy the four licensing objectives will become conditions for that event on the premises license.

The premise is to maintain door staff profiles for all door staff working at the premises and for any door staff that have worked on the premises in the last three months.

The door staff profile will consist of identification for the member of staff.

A copy of his/her SIA badge Passport or driving licence. If the proof of identification is anything other than the photo driving licence then the member of staff will need proof of address, which must be a copy of a utility bill dated within the last six months.

The licence holder shall maintain and operate an ID Scan to all persons entering the premises whenever licensable activities are being carried on. The premises is to adopt and display a clear notice to the effect that there is a strict policy of NO ID, NO ENTRY.

All persons (including staff, DJs and entertainers) entering the premises whenever licensable activities are being carried on will be subject to a search. This search will include a full body search AND metal detection. Each of those activities will be undertaken by a separate door supervisor.

No person will be allowed entry to the premises 1 hour before close, save for re-entry for persons who were on the premises before midnight. Every person re-entering the premises will be strictly subject to the body and metal detection search.

If the premises wish to have events which continue after the end time for normal licensable activity, they must provide 28 days; notice to West Midlands Police of this and include the risk assessment for the event including the security plan. Any recommendations made by West Midlands Police in relation to the application will become conditions of the license for that event and West Midlands Police will have a right of veto over the event to prevent breaches of the licensing objectives. This to be put in writing to the Premises License Holder, giving the reasons.

The premises will operate a dispersal policy this will be made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request.

The premises will operate a vulnerability policy which will be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request. As part of this policy the premises will have a safe space for vulnerable people.

Staff other than personal license holders involved in the sale of alcohol are to be trained under the Licensing Act 2003 prior to being allowed to sell/ supply alcohol. All training is to be documented and signed by the Premises License Holder and the trainee. All training records are to be made available to any of the

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responsible authorities on request. Staff other than personal license holders involved in the sale/ supply of alcohol are to receive documented refresher training every six months.

A refusals log will be maintained at the premises. The log will be made immediately available to members of the responsible authorities on request.

Doors and windows will remain closed If regulated entertainment is taking place after 2000 hours except for ingress and egress or cases of emergency.

While regulated entertainment is taking place the premises will ensure that regular noise assessments (minimum of 1 check every 3 hours) are carried out at the nearest residential property to ensure noise or vibration from the premises does not cause a public nuisance. These checks are to be documented, dated, timed and signed by the person who has made the check. This documentation to be made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request and held on the premises for a minimum of 3 months.

The volume of all entertainment/music will be controlled by the DPS, premises licence holder or their nominated representative and not the DJ, artist or persons hiring the venue.

The premises will deploy door staff when trading. Door staff will sign on and off duty. The premises will keep a profile of all door staff which will include a copy of their SIA licence and photographic ID. (If photographic ID is not available then a utility bill no older than 3 months will be acceptable.) The signing in andamp; out sheets and profiles will be kept on the premises for a minimum of 3 months and made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request. Door staff will wear a fluorescent coat, jacket or waistcoat while on duty at the premises. Door staff will remain on duty until all the customers have dispersed and this will form part of the premises dispersal plan.

The numbers of door staff will be risk assessed by the premises. This risk assessment will be made available to any of the responsible authorities immediately on request.

The premises will operate a dispersal policy which will be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request.

If the premises is hired out or any promoted event with/by a third party the premises will notify West Midlands Police Central Licensing Team (by email) a minimum of 14 days prior to the event taking place unless West Midlands Police agree to a reduced notice period for individual small-scale events. This notification will be accompanied by a risk assessment tailored for that event. As well as the security plan the risk assessment will include the names, addresses and dates of birth of the person(s) hiring the room or promoter. It will also include the real names and stage names of any artist, DJ, band or performer. If West Midlands Police make any recommendations in relation to an event these will become conditions of the license for that event and West Midlands Police will have a veto of any event which is likely to impact on the licensing objectives. This to be put in writing to the Premises License Holder, giving the reasons.

Dexter Laswell will play no part in the running of or management of the premises.

A member of the management team of the premises will have control and direction over the security team positioned at the entrance when the premises is open for licensable activities.

The premises shall change the security provider as of 24th October 2022

Unless otherwise agreed in advance with WMP Licensing Team in writing (and no less than 7 days) alcohol sales will cease at 02:00 hrs on Sunday to Thursday and 04:00 hrs on Friday and Saturday.

The premises will cease licensable activity at 0400 hours on a Friday and Saturday and 0200 hours Sunday to Thursday.

The smoking area on the 1st floor will be closed at 02:00hrs on Sunday to Thursday and 04:00hrs on Friday and Saturday.

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All staff will be trained in First Aid and emergency procedures. All training and incidents shall be recorded in writing.

The premises licence holder shall provide suitable and sufficient written Health and safety and Fire Risk Assessments.

A member of staff will be trained in First aid.

Electric, Gas and relevant equipment are to be checked and maintained in working order and tested annually.

Adequate lighting will be provided in all public areas and outside.

Capacity limits will be set and agreed with West Midlands Fire Service.

The premises licence holder will create and follow a noise management monitoring policy for the external smoking area on the 1st floor to ensure that disturbances to local occupiers are not caused. The policy may be inspected by a Responsible Authority at any time and will be amended at the request of a Responsible Authority to meet with the approval of the Responsible Authority.

The Premises License Holder will provide responsible management at all times.

The Noise from the premises will be monitored so as not to become a public nuisance.

The disposal of empties and bottles will not be done after 23:00hrs or before 07:00hrs.

Notices will be posted asking patrons to leave quietly.

A challenge 25 policy will be operated by the premises with notices informing customers of the policy being displayed sufficiently within the premises, so the policy is sufficiently publicised with at least one displayed behind the Bar. Staff must be trained on this policy.

The staff will be regularly reminded/ trained to enforce the challenge 25 policy.

All alcohol sale refusals will be noted in a refusals register.

No persons under the age of 18 will be allowed into the premises unless accompanied by a person over the age of 18.

No persons under the age of 18 will be allowed to be on the premises after 2200 hours.

**Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority**

Licensing Sub-Committee A resolved on 29th November 2024 to impose the below conditions following a Summary Review.

When taking an event booking staff will take a copy of Photographic ID which will be either a Passport or driving licence, staff will take a copy of a utility bill not more than 3 months old.

Booking details are to be kept on the premises for a minimum of 6 months after the event and made available to West Midlands Police on request.

A deposit is to be taken for all bookings. Additionally, the persons booking will be informed that it is subject to agreement to the deployment of door staff and the entry/ search policies of the venue

All events will be risk assessed, the risk assessment for the event will be signed and acknowledged by the DPS, a copy of the risk assessment will be sent to West Midlands Police no less than 28 days before the event takes place if the event is deemed medium or high risk.

Recommendations made to the Premises that satisfy the four licensing objectives will become conditions for that event on the premises license.

All persons entering the premises or re-entering the premises will be subject to a full body search and metal detection search by a search arch. This will be followed up with search by metal detection wands if this is required because of a positive indication by the arch Alarms on the fire exits from the Shisha bar (this is attached to the club Licence) to signal door opened also lights activated when opened.

All persons entering the shisha lounge will be subject to the same search criteria as for the main nightclub premises.

A member of the management team from the premises will have direction of the security team at the premises when it is open for licensable activity. All door staff and premises management will be equipped with bodycam.

The bodycams will be recording all the time whilst the door staff and management using it are performing duty. Bodycam footage is to be retained for 28 days from the date that the footage is taken and made available to any of the responsible authorities on request.

Each bodycam will be checked by the premises license holder or their nominee to ensure that it is working each day prior to licensable activity taking place. The result of the check, the time it took place, and the identity of the checker are to be recorded in a log on the date that the check takes place. This log is to be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request and is to be retained for 3 months.

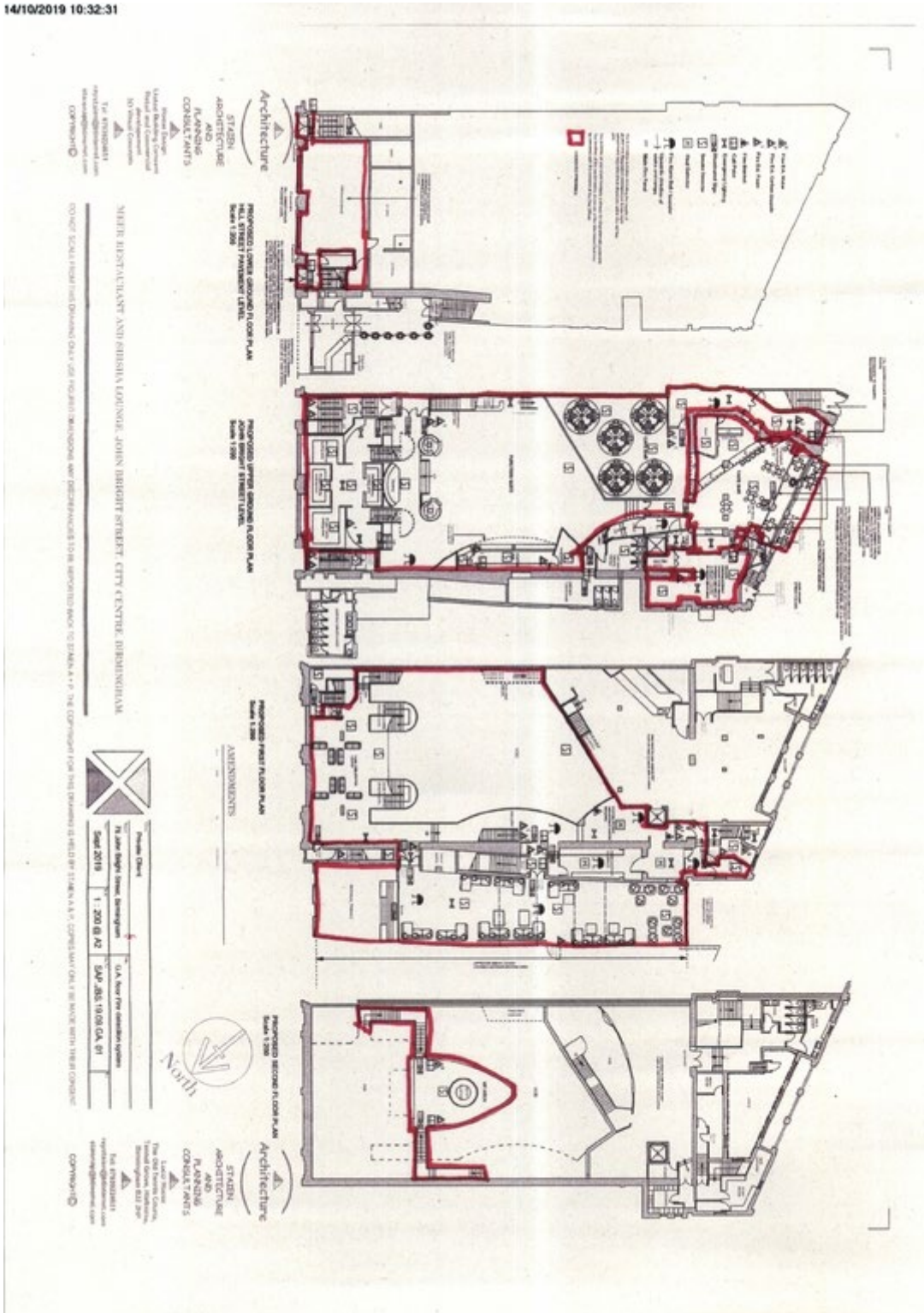
Staff are to be trained in their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003, crime scene awareness, weapons recognition and conflict management prior to being allowed to carry out work in the premises.

All training is to be documented and signed by the Premises License Holder or their representative and the trainee. All training records are to be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request. Staff are to receive documented refresher training every twelve months.

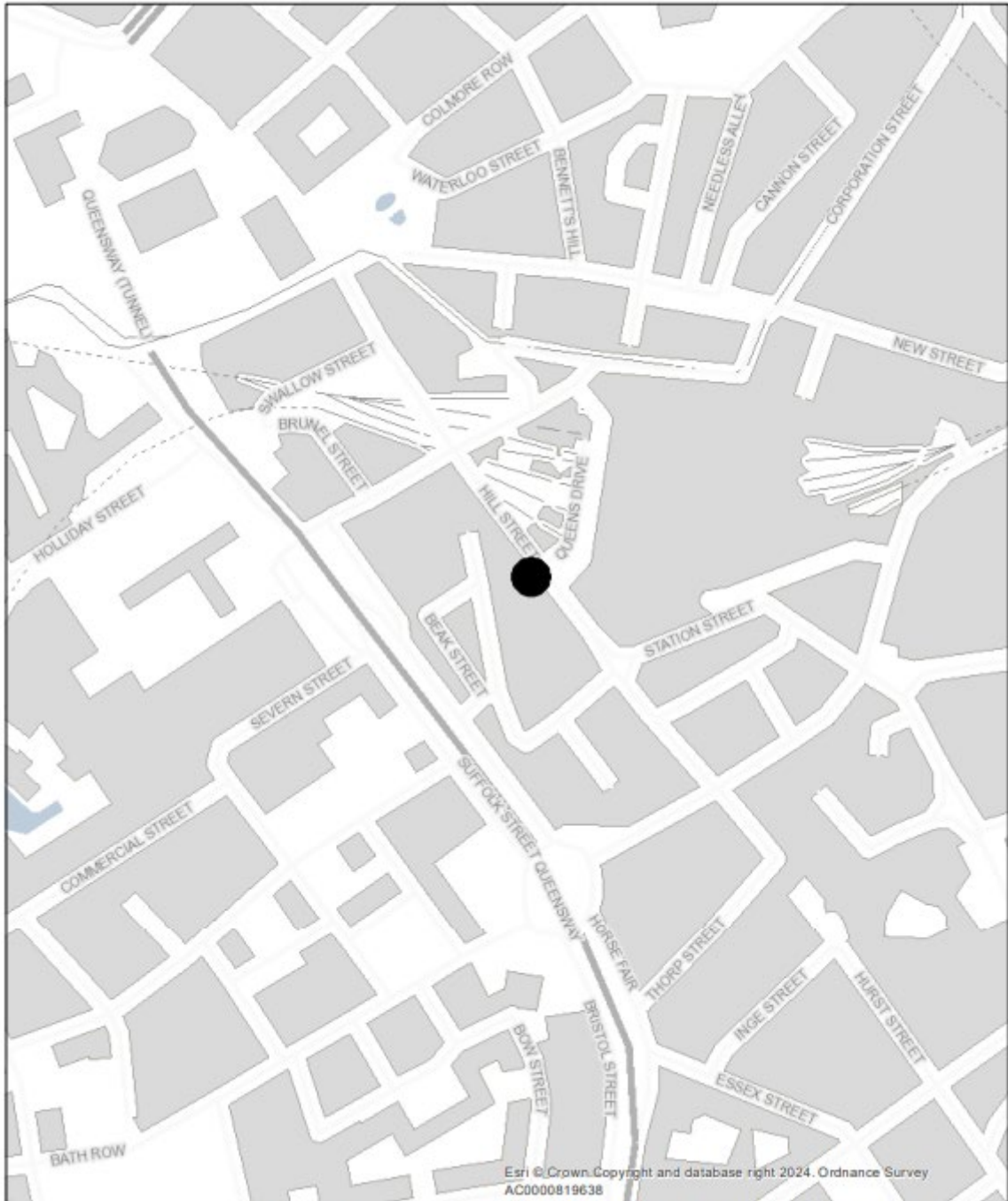
The premises will operate a dispersal policy which will include the actions to be taken on the dispersal of person(s) who have been ejected from the premises.

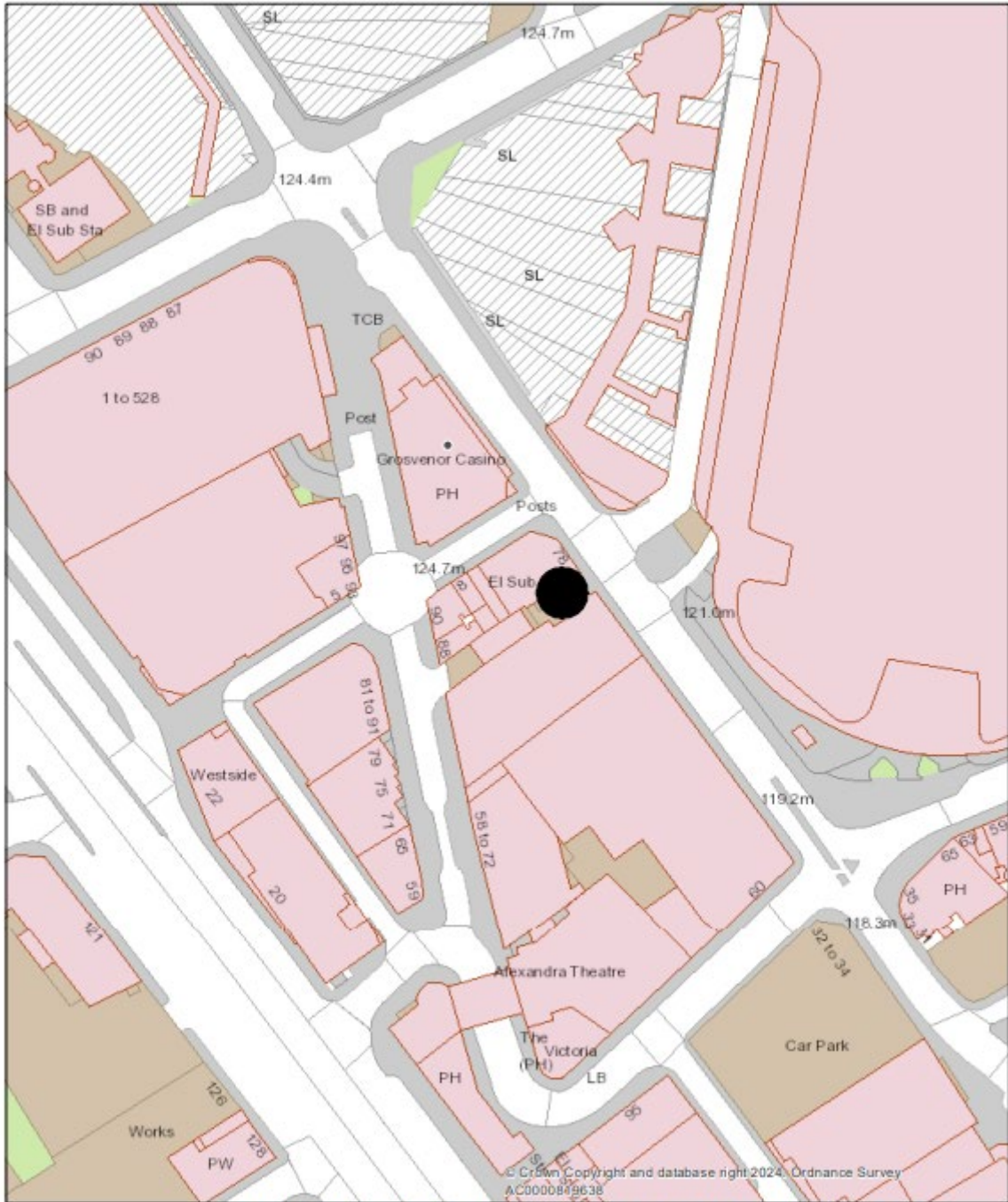
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
