#### **TABLE 1**

##### **Policing**

- Local Police in area
- Police Station retained

##### **Environment**

- 2 for 1 trees
- More greening
- Wild flower areas
- Support for local groups to be pro-active

##### **Community Facilities**

- Need more for all ages including young people

##### **Young People**

- BCC be an enabler
- Set up consultation opportunities across the ward for young people

##### **Poverty**

- Encouraging the avoidance of food waste
- “Sharing”

- Residential and Commercial
- Wider Resident Parking Zones
- Park and Ride

- Youth Facilities/ Provision
- Engagement and developing Inclusivity across the ward

#### **Parking**

- QE/ University and Central Harborne
- Resident Parking Schemes
- Implement Stress areas solutions

#### **Traffic Management**

- Road Improvement Schemes
- Parking Enforcement
- Road Safety

#### **Highway Maintenance**

- Road surfaces
- Pavements
- Lighting
- Drain clearance/ litter clearance and flytipping
- Tree planting and maintenance

#### **Harborne High Street**

- Vacant properties/shops
- Rates – return to local authority
