1. Purpose of report:
To consider an application to review a Premises Licence.

2. Recommendation:

3. Brief Summary of Report:
Review application received on 25 th August 2015 from the Chief Inspector of Weights and Measures in respect of Smaczek, 306 Slade Road, Erdington, Birmingham, B23 7LU. No additional representations have been received from representatives of other responsible authorities or other persons.

4. Compliance Issues:
4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:
The report complies with the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Council's Corporate Plan to improve the standard of all licensed persons, premises and vehicles in the City.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

The Chief Officer of Weights and Measures applied on 25th August 2015 for a review of the Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for Smaczek, 306 Slade Road, Erdington, Birmingham, B23 7LU.

No additional representations have been received from representatives of other responsible authorities or other persons.

On 6th July 2015 inspections using a specially trained tobacco sniffer dog were carried out at a number of premises throughout the Birmingham area.

The inspections were intelligence led from information received via a number of sources that the premises were selling illicit tobacco products.

The inspection was carried out over the entire ground floor area of the shop premises which consisted of the main shop and a small stock room. Also included in the inspection were two separate storage areas outside, one of which was refrigerated.

During the inspection the sniffer dog detected a quantity of illicit tobacco concealed in a drawer under the floor behind the counter in the shop. A further quantity was detected in a plastic carrier bag located in the refrigerated outdoor store room.

The owner of the shop, Mr Kamil Sobocinski was present throughout and was evasive bordering on being obstructive throughout the course of the inspection.

The rear door to the shop which led out to the external storage areas was open upon arrival. This door became "locked" at some point during the inspection. It was believed to have been locked by a female on the premises who claimed to be a customer. It later transpired that this female was indeed the partner of Mr Sobocinski. It took over an hour to locate this woman in order that the door could be unlocked and a complete inspection undertaken. Mr Sobocinski claimed not to have keys to this door. On at least three separate occasions Mr Sobocinski was asked directly if there were any illicit tobacco products on the premises. On each occasion Mr Sobocinski denied having tobacco of any sort in the shop. He was, however, unsurprised when the sniffer dog indicated the presence of tobacco behind the counter and was aware of how the concealed unit holding the tobacco could be opened in order to access the products.

It is fairly clear that the concealed unit was designed to hold roughly one day's supply of tobacco for the shops customers. It was positioned under the floor by the cash register so was easily accessible for the shop assistant to obtain the tobacco when asked for it.

Background checks have shown that Mr Sobocinski has another shop, Smaczek Polskie Sklepy 2 Old Walsall Road Hamstead Birmingham.

This shop was visited by Trading Standards officers on 9th May 2014 as a result of a complaint alleging the sale of illicit tobacco from the premises.

During the course of this inspection a larger cardboard box containing various brands of illicit tobacco was discovered underneath the counter. Additionally a bag in the rear storeroom was found which also contained illicit tobacco products.

An inspection of the alcohol on the premises during this visit also resulted in the seizure of a quantity of vodka suspected of being non duty paid.

In total on 9th May 2014 – 210 packs/pouches of tobacco products and 11 bottles of vodka were seized. This seizure was passed to Sandwell Trading Standards as the premises fell within their boundary. The above was in addition to the 66 packs of cigarettes that were seized from the shop at 306 Slade Road on 6th July 2015.

The quantities indicate that Mr Sobocinski holds small amounts of tobacco in his shops, probably enough for one day. The small quantity is probably for two reasons:

- (i) So as not to draw attention to himself and his activities and
- (ii) To reduce his liability and losses in the event that his illicit stock is detected by the authorities.

Mr Sobocinski had clearly gone to some trouble to conceal tobacco products found on his premises. It would have proven almost impossible to have found the concealment within the shop in a normal inspection situation. The use of the sniffer dog was essential to the success of the operation.

Having considered all the matters related to this case it is thought that Mr Sobocinski, the premises licence holder at Smaczak has breached two of the licensing objectives, in that he has put his customers health and safety at risk and gained an unfair advantage over other local businesses by evading the payment of tax on these products.

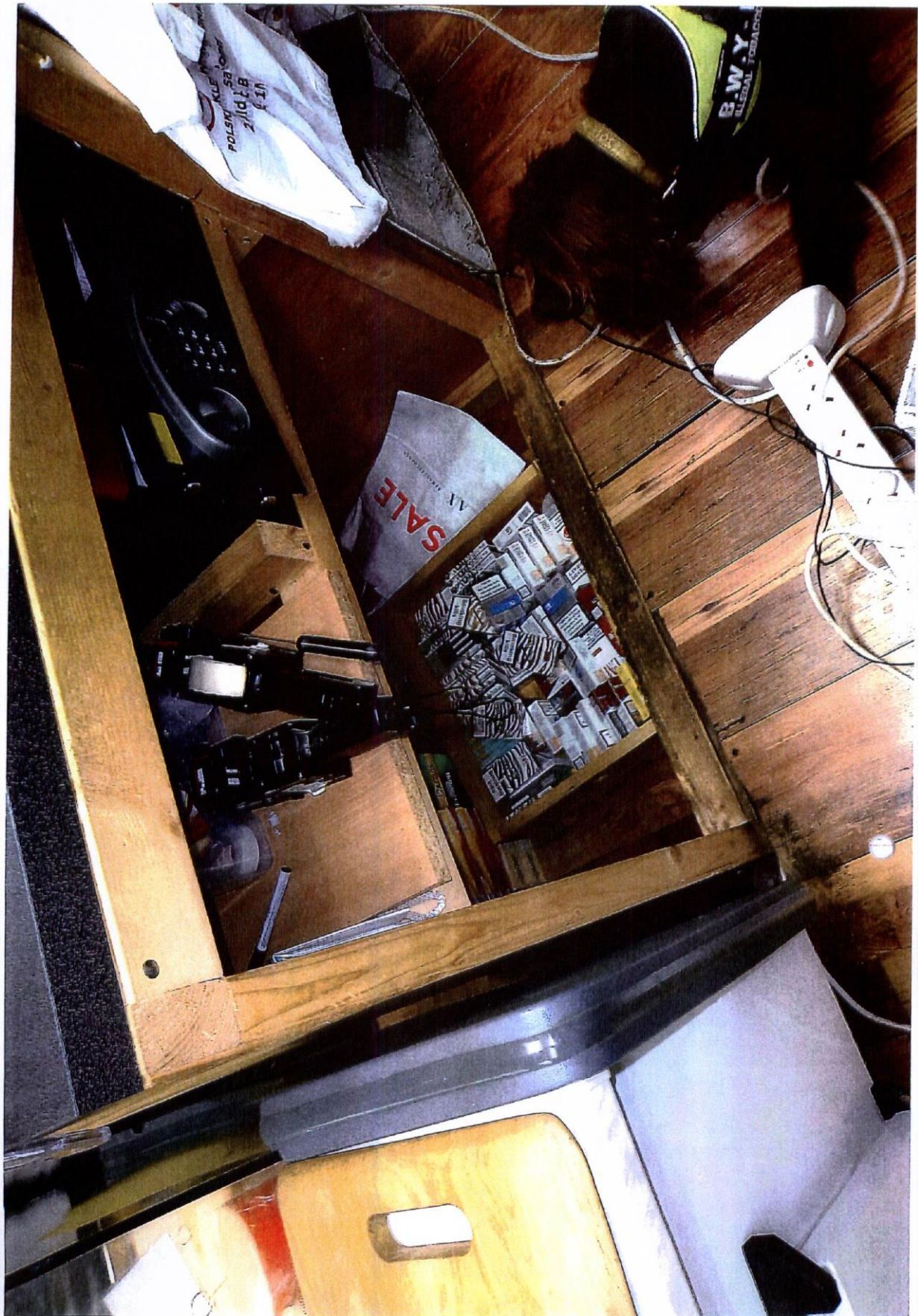

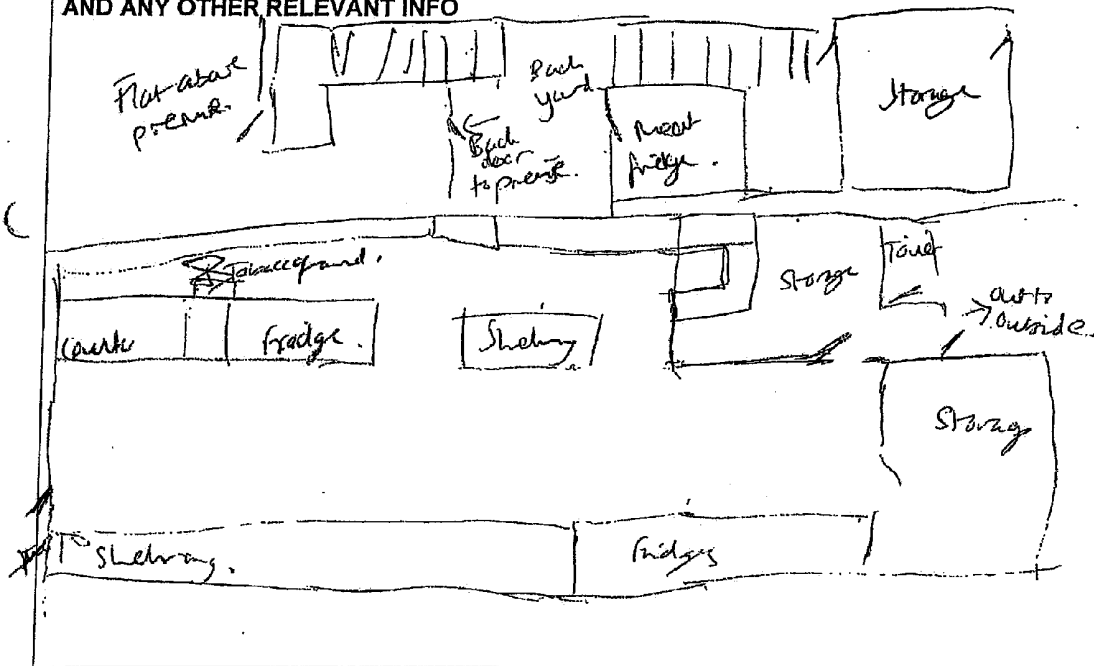

The Premises Licence holder shall ensure that notices stating "No sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age" will be displayed on the premises.

The Premises Licence holder shall ensure that notices stating "It is illegal for persons to buy alcohol on behalf of persons under 18 years of age" will be displayed on the premises.

The Premises Licence holder shall ensure that notices stating "Persons attempting to purchase alcohol on behalf of persons under 18 years of age will be barred from the premises" will be displayed on the premises.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm

A 'Challenge 21' policy will be operated on the premises with notices being displayed on the entrance to the premises and the behind the counter.

The Premises Licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained and regularly refreshed to enforce the 'Challenge 21' policy.

The Premises Licence holder shall ensure that all alcohol sale refusals are noted in a refusal register which can be inspected by any Responsible Authority upon request.

The premises will only accept valid forms of identification such as a passport, photo driving licence or a recognised proof of age card.

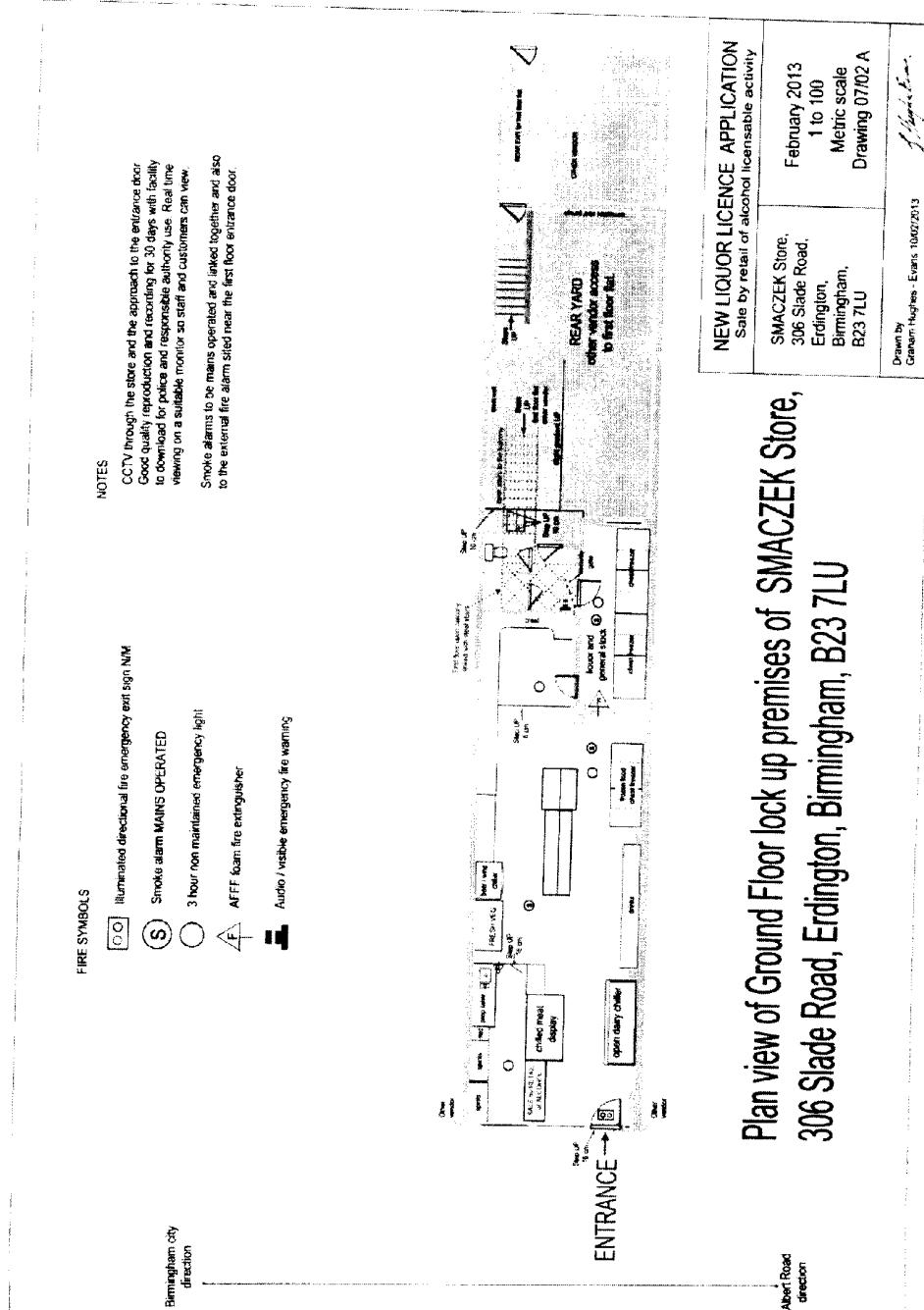

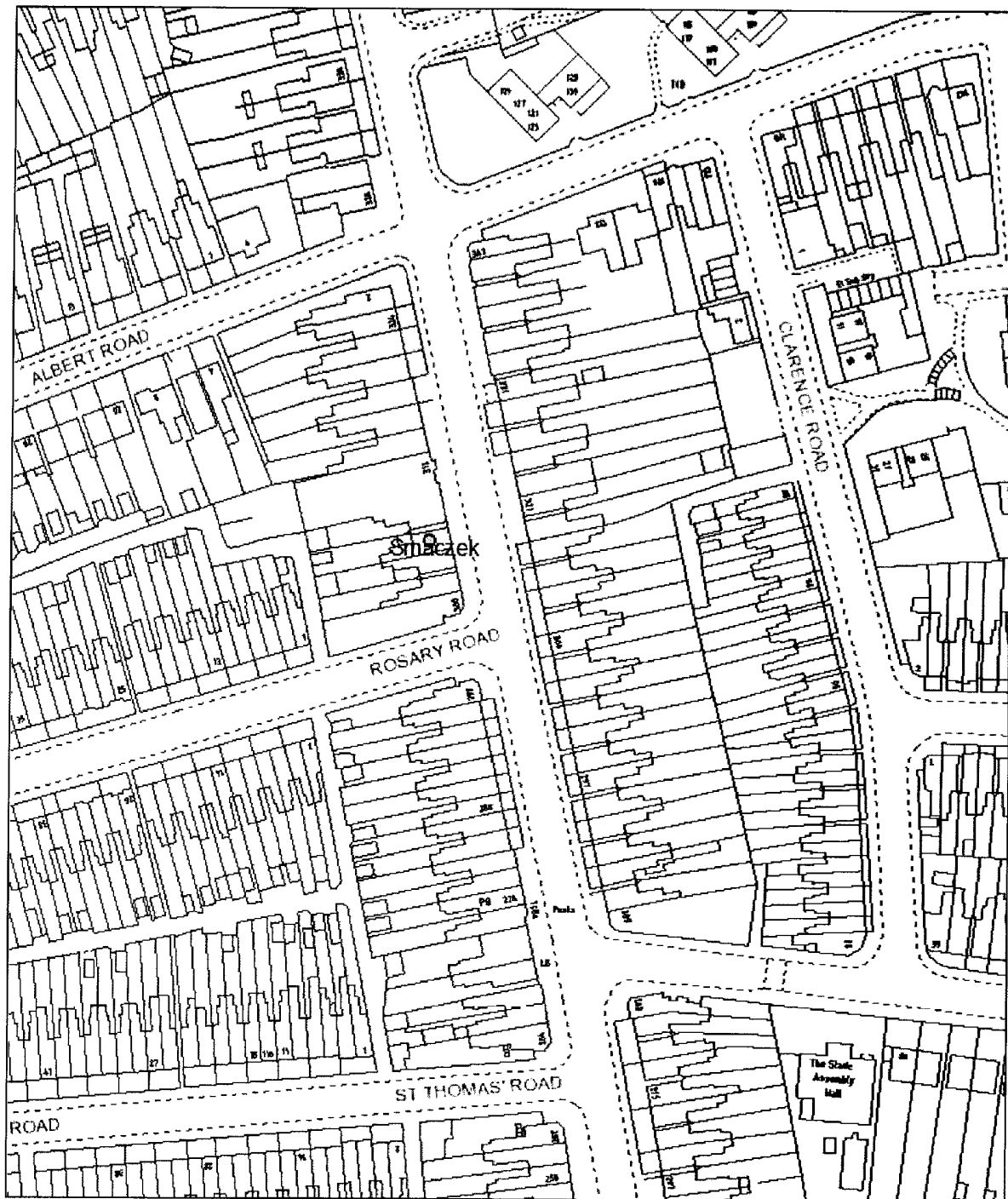
