The Chair introduced the Members and officers present and explained the hearing procedure.

The Chair asked if there were any preliminary points for the Sub-Committee to consider.

Points made by Mr Craig:

- Some issues had been raised prior to the application being submitted and this would be ventilated in due course.
- Compliance Officers from Birmingham City Council's Licensing Section had visited the premises since the application was submitted.
- Concerns and issues were raised by local neighbours however, no representations had been made.
- Mr Craig had provided direction to the client which were now being adopted.
- WMP had queries around risk assessments The premises had not undertaken these until Mr Craig's involvement.
- The risk assessment and matters were now completed however, he had not had the opportunity to review the detail with his client. The premises have not had the opportunity to implement this.
- Mr Craig thought the Sub-Committee would be better placed to evaluate the application once the measures were put into place. This would ensure the licensing objectives were better promoted.

<u>Licensing Sub-Committee C – 06 October 2021</u>

- Following discussions with Mr Taj, WMP and Mr Key, Environmental Health, neither objected to an adjournment for their owns reasons.
- Mr Craig noted the comment from Environmental Health around a planning matter that required more clarity.
- WMP would need to speak to the Community Officers on the ground. This
 would give an opportunity for a site meeting before a decision was made.
- Mr Craig apologised for any inconvenience caused to the Sub-Committee.

On this basis, Mr Craig requested for an adjournment for the hearing.

The Chair requested Mr Taj, WMP to share their views on the proposal for an adjournment.

Points made by Mr Taj, (WMP):

- Mr Taj agreed with Mr Craig's points for an adjournment.
- Several documents had been requested which had not been received therefore, more time would be required to make a fair assessment of the application.
- He noted the documents requested were now available however, going through the process of implementation.
- He had requested a site visit which would be arranged shortly.
- Mr Taj was awaiting additional detail from the Local Neighbourhood Police which would assist in assessing the application.

The Chair requested Mr Keys, Environmental Health to share their views on the proposal for an adjournment.

Points made by Mr Keys, (Environmental Health):

- Mr Key did not believe the risk assessment would change the position for Environmental Health however, he would review what would be submitted.
- He had no objection to an adjournment.

1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence.

The application seeks to make the following amendments to the premises licence:

- Extend the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol to 00:00 midnight Sunday to Thursday and extend the terminal hour for films to 00:00 midnight on Sundays.
- Add the provision for Late Night Refreshment from 23:00 until 00:00 midnight Sunday to Thursday.
- To begin licensable activities (films and the sale of alcohol) from 10:00 on Sunday.
- To extend the terminal hour for opening hours to 00:30 the following day Sunday to Thursdays and, by an extra 10 minutes on Friday and Saturday, to 01:00 the following day.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition: - (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (D x V), where – (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made: (a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC), where the film has been classified by that Board, or (b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20(3)(b) (s74(3)(b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

Embedded Restrictions

On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with operating schedule

2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Regulated entertainment is permitted to take place inside the premises only.

The licensee will ensure that staff are trained in the standards required by the relevant legislation and as required by company policy.

The voluntary closure policy for the operation of these premises is 30 minutes after the approved closure time for the supply of alcohol.

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

The pub manager is required to actively participate in and support the local Pubwatch scheme (where active).

The licensee will ensure that text and/or radio pagers, where already used will continue to be used on the premises during the hours of operation.

Existing CCTV system will continue to operate during the hours of operation.

The licensee will ensure that there will be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate consumption of alcohol.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

The licensee will extend existing policies to cover the increase in hours of operation.

The licensee will ensure internal health and safety due diligence and incident reporting system will continue to operate during the additional times.

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

The licensee must where necessary implement reasonable steps to recognise the rights of local residents and encourage customers to leave the premises quietly.

The manager is required to liaise with local neighbours as part of their duties and resolve any reasonable concerns.

No consumption of alcohol or other refreshments shall be allowed in any outside area after 23:20 hours Monday to Saturday (inclusive) and 22:50 hours on a Sunday.

The outside area at the front of the premises (patio area immediately outside the front lobby on Lickey Road) is permitted to be used exclusively for smokers after 23:20 hour Monday to Saturday (inclusive) and 22:50 hours on a Sunday.

The beer garden shall be cleared of all customers by 23:20 hours Monday to Saturday (inclusive) and 22:50 hours on a Sunday.

The doors to the beer garden will be closed from 23:20 hours Monday to Saturday (inclusive) and 22:50 hours on a Sunday.

Smokers can be readmitted to the premises after 23:00 hours on a Friday and Saturday.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm

The licensee will promote the protection of children from harm through a commitment to health and safety in the operation and maintenance of the premises.
