Star Pubs & Bars Limited applied on 11th November 2016 for the grant of a Premises Licence for the Acorn, High Street, Erdington, Birmingham, B23 6SJ.

West Midlands Police formally make representation to the issue of a new licence to Star Pubs & Bars Ltd for the premises Acorn, High Street, Erdington B23 6SJ by Birmingham City Council.

West Midlands Police believe that if this licence is issued it would undermine the following licensing objectives –

- **The prevention of crime and disorder – The premises has had a long history of issues involving crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour. The premises have been subject to two licensing reviews in the past 6 years with the most recent review seeing the licensing committee revoke the licence.**
- **Public safety – Over the past 6 years the two reviews were evidence by the amount of persons injured through drink related assaults and wounding's.**

West Midlands Police believe that regardless who holds the licence or any changes in DPS at the location the issues will continue.

Dear Licensing

Myself and Cllrs Alden and Beauchamp wish to object to the new premises licence application that has been made for the Acorn.

The licence for the Acorn was considered by Licensing Sub-Committee C back in August following a review served by West Midlands Police on grounds of Crime & Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance. We along with local residents supported the Police with their Review due to ongoing problems that were being experienced at the premises and within the immediate vicinity. After considering all of that evidence, the Sub-Committee determined to revoke the licence.

We appreciate that this new application has been made by Star Pubs and Bars, who own the site but leased it to Sheldon Inns, who were responsible for the problems that were experienced. We have concerns that given the premises have been leased to a troublesome company already, that the same would occur and so the problems that have been experienced on the High Street would resume. The issues of public nuisance were primarily around noise, abusive language from customers, who would often be out the front of the premises drinking and smoking. This contributed to providing an unsavoury environment on the High Street, which would effect residents, shoppers and visitors.

This would especially be the case for if the Acorn was to re-open, it would immediately attract the exact same clientele who were responsible for much of the crime & disorder and public nuisance which both we and the Police receive complaints about, and was evidenced as the Sub-Committee hearing. Any re-opening of these premises will just allow the problems to continue.

However, should the Licensing Authority be minded to grant the application, it is important that proper management is put in place for the premises and efforts are undertaken to ensure that any premises operating at this site is very different to that of the Acorn.

We had the opportunity to meet with a representative of Star Pubs and Bars Ltd yesterday and made this clear to them. The utmost effort must be made to ensure any premises is a complete contrast to the Acorn to avoid the same mistakes and issues occurring. As part of our discussions, it was suggested that the following would be needed as a minimum to ensure that this has the potential to be achieved:

1. The name of the premises be changed from the Acorn to something different, with a preference for a local name that would have meaning for Erdington.
2. That a refurbishment takes place of the premises to help make it look visually and aesthetically different to the Acorn

3. That some form of food provision be provided, in keeping with other pubs in the local areas such as Wetherspoons.
4. Only ambient background music is to be used at the premises, with the except of Fridays and Saturdays where entertainment may be provided. Any entertainment provided would need to be approved by the Police as this contributed to attracting a troublesome clientele.
5. Engagement takes place with local residents, with a contact for them to approach should there be any issues from the premises.

The above five proposals would go some way in making the new premises very different to the Acorn and attract a better clientele that would previously went to the premises.

Regardless of the above, we still wish to object to the above premises application that has been made and request to speak before the Licensing Sub-Committee in due course.

Sir,

On 26 August 2016 I attended a hearing at the Council House regarding The Acorn Public House in Erdington High Street and, as a resident who lives in a nearby side street, spoke strongly in support of the revocation of the license, as proposed by West Midlands Police and fully supported by local Councillors Gareth Moore, Robert Alden and Bob Beauchamp. In spite of the Council's decision to revoke the licence following damning Police evidence that showed management incompetence at a high level which, apart from allowing the running of a disorderly house, condoned the licensee giving false evidence to the Police and destruction of potential evidence in connection with criminal activity, the Premises License Holder lodged an appeal with the Magistrates Court which is to be heard at a date sometime in February 2017.

I have since learned that the Company which owns the Acorn has made a new license application separate to the current appeal by the Premises License Holder. In effect this means that the same people hope to continue trading in the same place, except under another name, with the same customers, thus perpetuating the same serious anti-social problems which will continue to adversely affect the residents, shoppers and traders of Erdington.

The Acorn is situated halfway up the High Street close to Iceland, one of the main food supermarkets in Erdington and next to the Drop-in Health Centre, both of which attract a large number of customers. Shoppers from the number 11 bus route walk up the length of the High Street, as do school children. The premises is a blight on the High Street with its foul mouthed customers blocking the pavement, arguing, smoking, dropping cigarette packets and nub ends and, on occasion, drinking alcohol. I'm not the only woman who finds their presence intimidating and prefers to cross the road to circumnavigate the Acorn frontage, despite the fact that I live round the corner nearby!

In May 2013 the Hairy Lemon licensed premises, also on the High Street, had its license withdrawn because of serious public disorder, criminal activity and anti-social behaviour. I attended the Hearing and spoke in support of the revocation. I also made the comment at the time to the Police Licensing Officer that the clientele and the problems would migrate down the High Street to the Acorn and inevitably this has proved to be the case. Erdington has enough anti-social problems without allowing such an infamous trouble spot to continue. The area is struggling to achieve urban regeneration and the continuation of this licensed premises is detrimental to the safety and confidence of the public, the commercial interests of local traders, and future investment in the High Street.

I urge you to refuse the application for a new license for the premises of the Acorn, High Street, Erdington in the interests of the prevention of crime and disorder, anti-social behaviour and public safety.

We wish to oppose the appeal for the new licensing application for the Acorn Public House, Erdington High Street for the following reasons.

We have to walk past this pub on almost a daily basis, this is usually an unpleasant experience and frequently quite intimidating. More often than not, the jukebox can be heard from our house. We know the music has come from the pub as we've walked up the road to investigate where the noise is coming from!

The entrance and pavement outside are usually littered with drunken patrons, the doormen seem reluctant to get involved. This is intimidating for passing shoppers and anyone wishing to use the walk in centre. The pavement is frequently spattered with blood.

Little children should NOT be stood on the doorstep of the pub witnessing their parents getting drunk and becoming more and more rowdy as the afternoon wears on.

We have witnessed at least two violent incidents one of which was heavily publicised on social media, not a great advert for Erdington High Street.

The Acorn pub like the Hairy Lemon before it has become a blot on Erdington High Street.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises shall promote the Challenge 21 Policy by training staff on different id methods. This training will be carried out monthly and be recorded on the premises. The Challenge 21 Policy is to be displayed at all times.

All staff shall be trained monthly both on signs of drug abuse on persons and how to look for signs of use on the premises. Training will also be given on signs of persons drinking to excess. A training record must be kept on the premises and made available to the responsible authorities immediately upon request.

The Licence Holder or DPS will play an active part in the local pub watch scheme and work closely with other members in the watch and be represented at all prearranged meetings.

The CCTV system at the premises is to be installed to the satisfaction of West Midlands Police. It must include additional cameras in the bar area and on the main door entrance both inside and out. It will be digitally recorded for up to 31 days and must be made immediately available on request to all responsible authorities. It must be in operation during opening hours with one hour overlap an hour before opening and an hour after closing. All members of staff are to be trained in the operation of the complete system.

All door staff shall be SIA trained. They will be in place from 19:00 on Friday and Saturday evenings and up to 30 minutes after closing. They will also be in place for any function night, either private or run by staff from the location. All door staff will wear as a minimum a florescent high visibility tabard jacket which will display door supervisor to the front and rear. All door staff must book on and off duty and their profiles must be recorded on the premises, this record to be made available on request by any responsible authority.

The local Policing team and Police Licensing Officer must be informed of any events and be given 28 days notice in writing. Details should include the nature of the event, name and address of booking party, number of persons attending and a full risk assessment for each event. If the Police have any concerns with the event in relation to the four Licensing objectives, then the Police shall have the ability to veto the event.

There is to be no right of entry or re-entry after 23:00.

c) Public safety

All emergency lighting will be checked on a monthly basis.

Staff are to be required to be alert and attentive with regard to broken glass.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

When entertainment is provided all doors and windows, save for exits, are to be kept closed.

Prominent signs are to be displayed requesting customers vacate the premises quietly and have regard for local residents.

Music levels will be reduced considerably 30 minutes before last drinks are served to encourage customers to begin to leave the location as this will indicate the night is ending. It will also reduce noise escaping from the premises through the opening and closing of the main door when customers leave, thereby reducing annoyance to local residents.

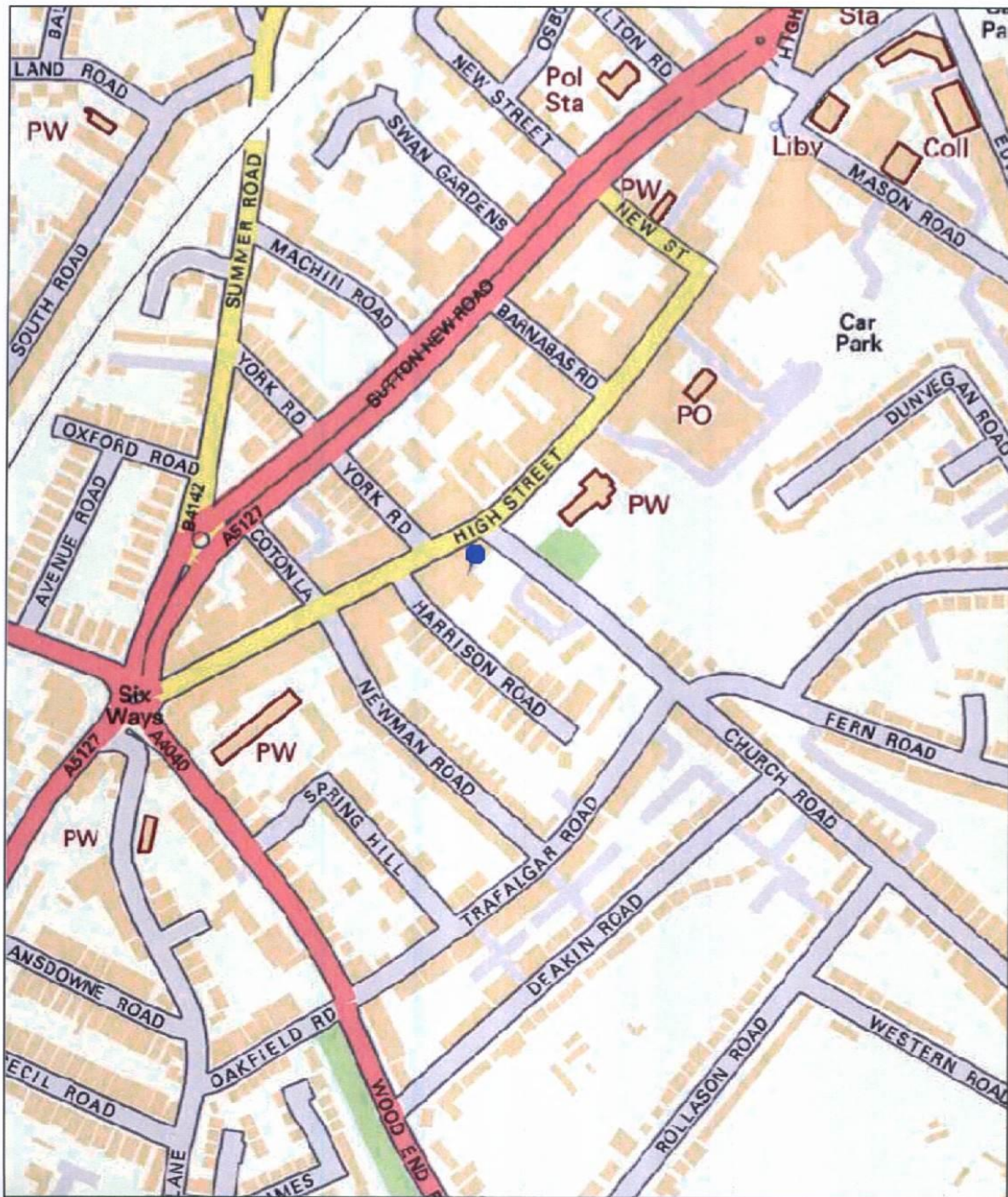

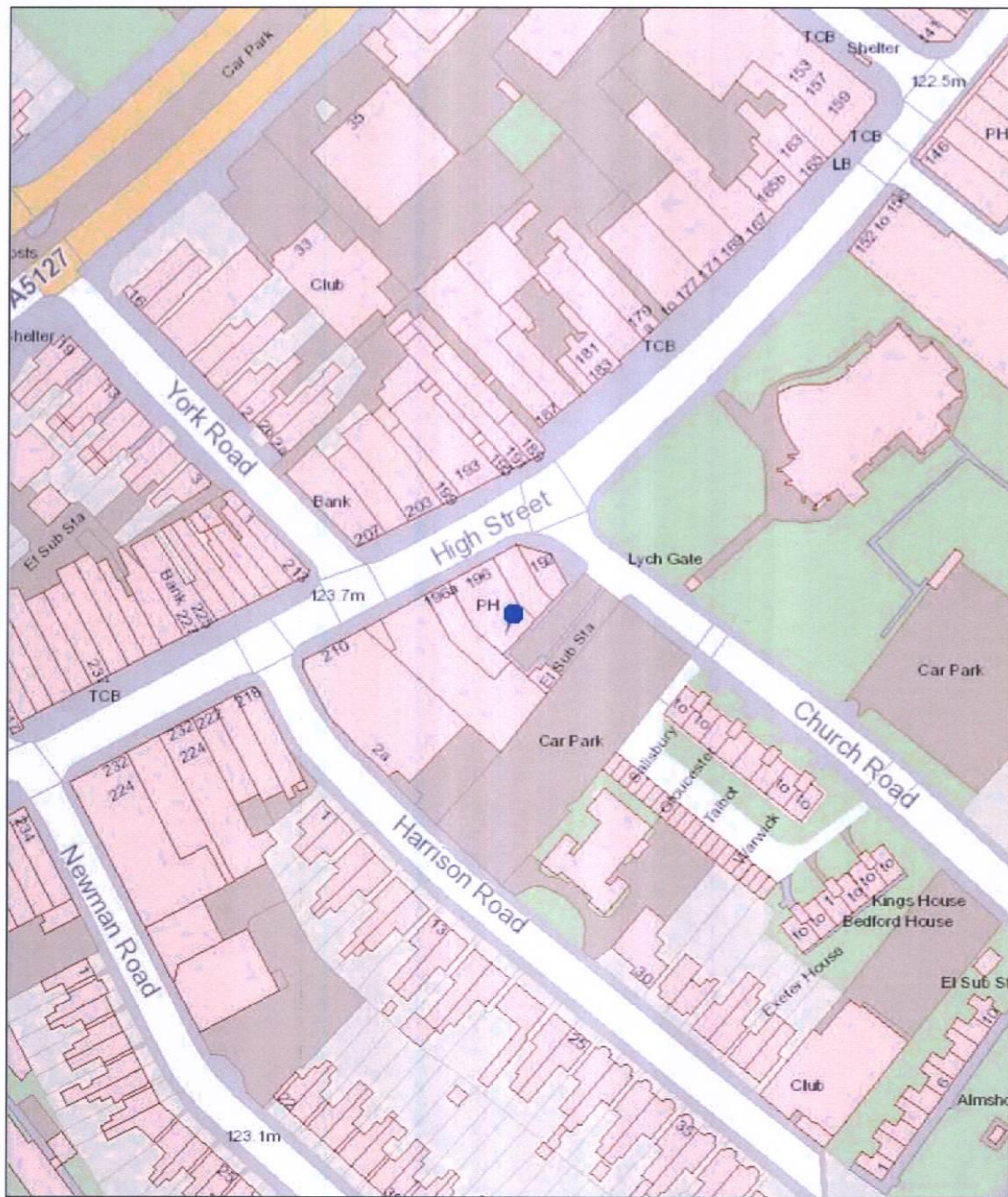

I am writing regarding the proposed change of Hours at the Slug and Lettuce High Street Harborne your Application reference 99698.

It is with some trepidation that I am making this representation as we are more than aware that living in such close proximity of the Hight Street, that it is inevitable, subsequently at certain times we have to be tolerant to Noise and Nuisance, and we have stood fast to this view, however this tolerance has to have some measurable perimeters, extending the hours is unacceptable.

We have had an accumulation of incidents over the last few years – rubbish and sick strewn along the street, Fighting and shouting in our street, urinating up walls and windows, noise from the venue. We accept it's something we live with, but extending this to such a late hour is not a good thing for the community, I am surprised that the operator has decided to do this, its dangerous, irresponsible and inconsiderate.

Looking carefully at the four licensing objectives stated in the Licensing Act 2003, the new proposed trading hours for this Public House raise several issues regarding The prevention of crime and disorder, Public Safety, The prevention of public nuisance and The protection of children from harm.

Within most of four categories issues could be raised, I have therefore decided to object primarily "The Prevention of Public Nuisance" mainly from noise pollution both from the Venue and the customers leaving the Venue, as I attained to earlier the current License allows for the venue to be cleared by 1.30 at night, which is bordering on the cusp of acceptability, however extending these hours by one hour to 2.30 exasperates the situations and in reasonable terms is unacceptable with so many residential properties so close. The principle that this nuisance could extended to the other category of The Protection of Children (is it reasonable too expect a young child to be disturbed by revellers at 2.30 or 3.00 in the morning?).

Extending these thoughts too the other two categories The prevention of Crime and Disorder & Public Safety, I would also question the local police regarding the ability to contain any disturbance from the venue should it arise, historically the customers from this venue have been "Boisterous" - so taking into consideration the budget cuts having to be dealt with, along with such an isolated venue (most Young Person Late night venues are zoned) at this time in the morning, I would suggest that resources may be stretched at this time in the evening. Further to this I would like to ask the Licensing Inspector to look at the track record of this venue regarding such matters.

Harborne is a primarily a residential area, with the Slug and Lettuce currently been one of the last venues to empty, generally speaking the area has calmed down by 2.00 because of this any problems attributable to the venue are easily identifiable, again I would venture it would be an unsafe decision to grant this to be extended too 2.30/3.00.

I would also like to draw attention to the fact that the venue has shown disregard too some of its Operating conditions, a specific example is the requirement to display "Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly" They simply don't have any - I Checked, this is among other indiscretions. We hear noise from the venue all the time.

Can you please guide me regarding this representation, and if I need to distribute it to any other parties, or whether this is something that you would deal with ?

Finally I would like to thank you for your time, and assure you that I am not simply been small minded about this matter, the extending of the hours for this venue is something I am genuinely concerned about.

Given the changes proposed, the applicant has carefully considered the application, the effect of the licensing objectives and the Council's Licensing Policy. Pre-consultation has taken place with the Police Licensing Officer and Environmental Health Officer prior to submission of the application. The applicant believes the hours sought, coupled with the existing measures in place are unlikely to have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives.

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Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2) In this condition:— (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

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(3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made: (a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC), where the film has been classified by that Board, or (b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20(3)(b) (s74(3)(b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

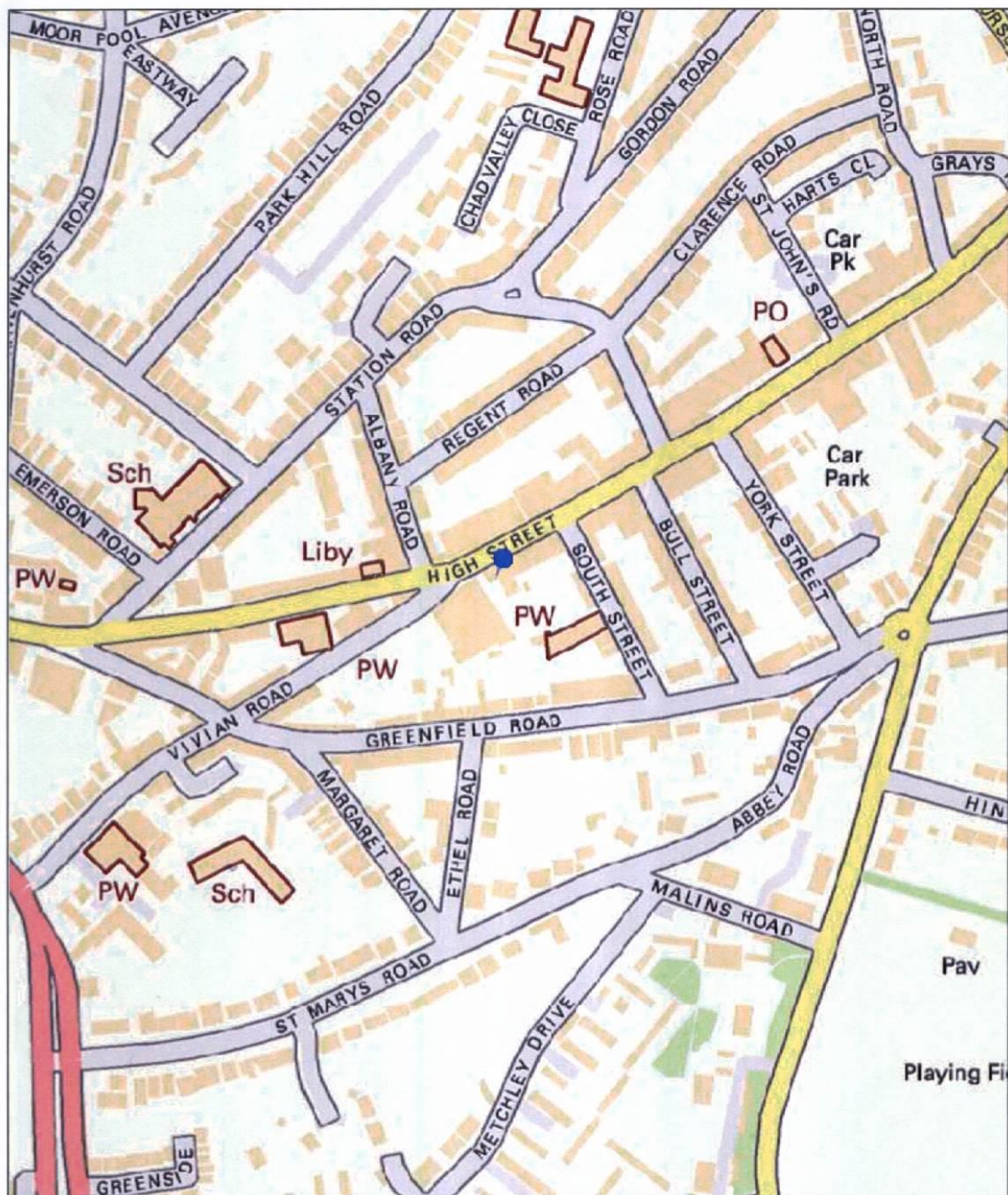

The Licence Holder shall install a noise limiter at the premises to be calibrated at a level set by Environmental Health.

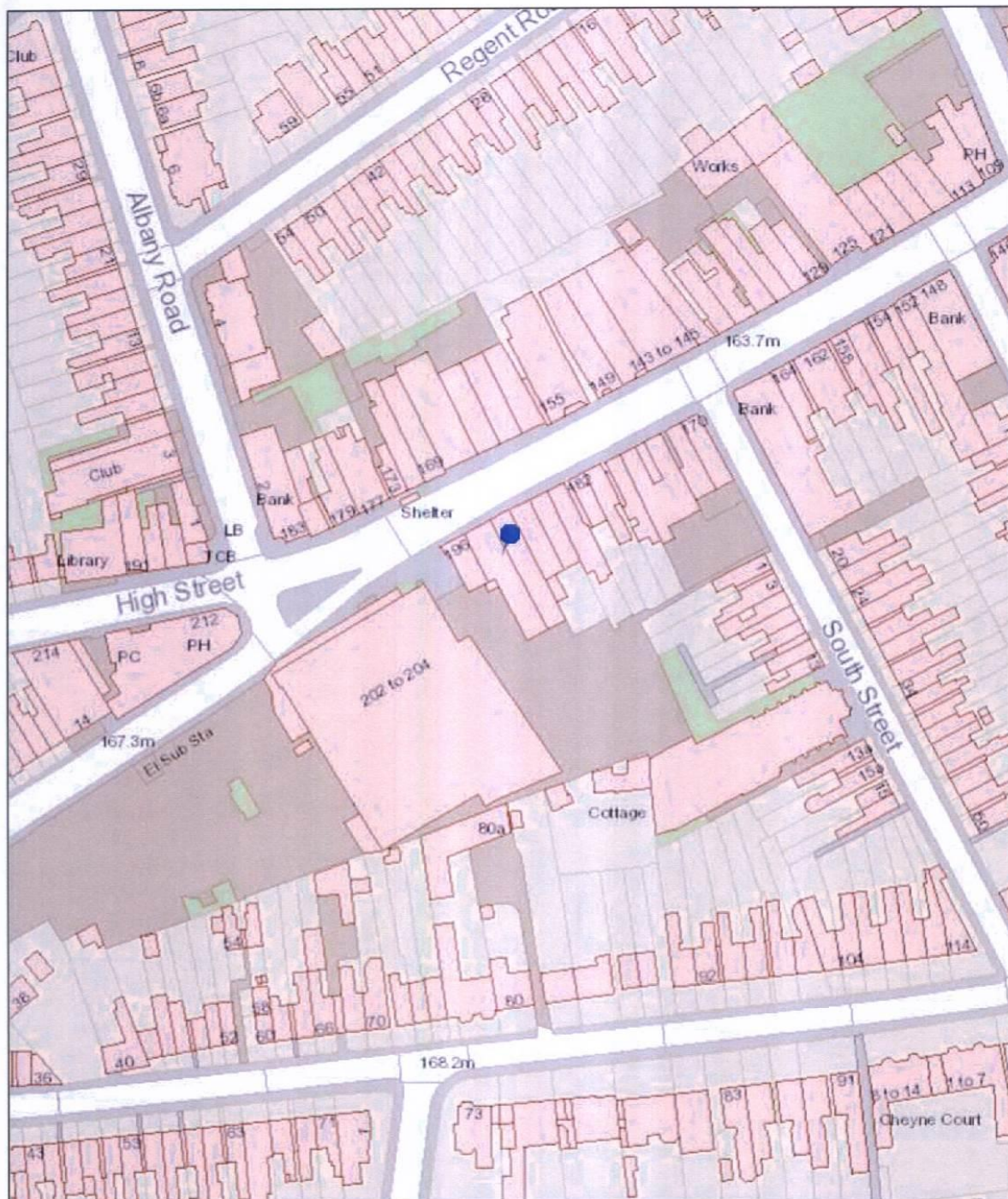
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
