MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING

1. Waste Management- Justin Hillyer

- Christmas Collection – It was acknowledged that changes to collection days over the festive period had been flawed causing confusion .
- Perry Barr depot and recycling centre final open after a long than anticipated refurbishment
- Mobile Household recycling centre
- Thanks, by the Cllrs to Justin's team for there swift action removing graffiti in the Town.

2. Local Police Team update -

- Overall crime statistics are down year on year by 9%, discussion on distortion of the statistics where there are low volumes of reported crime .Cllrs were pleased that overall crime was down
- Discussion on serious violent crime and the latest Police initiatives.
- Cllr Pears asked if the Police could attend the next meeting on 13th June , David Jermaine to add to team diary .

3. Brum Breathes Funding Proposal for Roughley – Brum Breaths proposal for Roughley Ward- Cllr Ewan Mackey outlined a proposal to bid for funding for a crossing on Little Sutton Road, Roughley. This would not only allow easier/safer pedestrian access to local shops at the crossing point it would also allow safer passage to school for children attending Moor Hall Primary School who wish to walk/cycle to school but currently prevented by the

very busy Road at an estimated cost of £5,000 to Birmingham City Council the remainder being picked up by Royal Sutton Coldfield Town Council. **This proposal was supported by the residents at the meeting unanimously.**
