## MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING INCLUDING LOCAL CONCERNS:

- 1. General update given by John Green from Waste management
- 2. Street Cleaning missed collections and next day collections.
- 3. Discussion on the loss of free bulky waste collections bulky waste collections currently cost £35 for 6 large items or twenty black bags residents believe this has led to the increase in fly tipping across the Ward and the City.
- 4. Mobile Household recycling collections, leafleting, and potentially using social media to advertise them.
- 5. Green Waste recycling resident not happy with paying for this service
- 6. Household collection 400,000 households' collections are made every week
- 7. Resident said the service was good overall, problems arise when reporting missed collections

- 8. HMO's bins not being emptied due to mixed up recycling, residents said that this needs to be addressed they suggested that the bins are emptied and that the residents of the HMO's need to be made aware of what can and cannot be recycling. Action John Green to request if the bins could be emptied.

- 10. Assisted collections for people with a disability help with collections
- 11. Explanation given on the slab in the cab
- 12. Lack of grass cutting in parks reasons no mow May and budget savings
