Possession of Property in Bartley Green

Birmingham City Council recently won a full appeal against a perpetrator of anti-social behaviour following possession of their property in Bartley Green. Unfortunately, the perpetrator has appealed and the case is being brought before the Court of Appeal on 27th September in London.

Eviction - Blandford Road

An order of outright possession was recently obtained for a property in Quinton for Rent arrears, ASB & damage to the property. The District Judge stated that BCC had established that the neighbours had been subjected to distressing & upsetting ASB linked to the subject address. The Judge accepted that BCC had tried to engage with the perpetrator who had not cooperated or complied with the standards of good neighbours which had resulted in incidents including shotguns, cannabis, motors revving and other ASB which met the grounds for possession.

Full Injunction – Bartley Green

A full injunction was awarded with a power of arrest on a tenant in Bartley Green. This tenant has been both violent and aggressive to other tenants in the local area, who are now protected by this full Injunction. Officers are working in close partnership with West Midlands Police to ensure the order is monitored and any potential breaches are suitably dealt with.

Travellers in Quinton – 2 encampments successfully moved on in Quinton. Really good multi-agency approach through linking in with elected members, West Midlands Police, Regulation & Enforcement, and land owners.
