To deliver £5m in savings from the Supporting People and Third Sector Grants funded services using a range of approaches which aim to minimize any possible negative impacts for Citizens, Communities and Service Providers.

A proportion of the funding for Supporting People Services include the delivery of housing support services for young people including those leaving care, leaving young offender services and those that are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

Domestic Violence refuge provision provides safe access to women and their children.

Third Sector Grants and Supporting People funded services provide a range of support functions all aimed at enabling vulnerable adults and their children to live independently within the community for as long as possible avoiding the need to access statutory adult social care, health services

Supporting People funded housing support services enable vulnerable people to live independently within the community. Services include access to supported housing, tenancy support and support to access permanent housing.

Support Planning for vulnerable adults includes the ability to succeed economically. This includes support for the most vulnerable and furthest away from the labour market to start the journey towards paid work.

Supporting People services are also match funded to ESF initiatives which provide an additional resource to support vulnerable people with their employment aspirations.

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Comment:

There are currently 31,000 vulnerable adults (including children and families) supported by the two funding streams. The proposed mitigations will mean that there is no negative impact for service users or stakeholders for this financial year. The Equality Analysis will be reviewed alongside the planned activity for this year to establish a strategy for the delivery of third sector and supporting people services in the future within the contexts of the resources available for 2018/19.

Comment:

Whilst for the majority of employees funded by these services, there will be no impact. Two Supporting People funded providers have either served notice on their contracts or requested a variation to reduce their contract capacity due to under utilisation or high void levels. At this stage it is not clear if the staff employed will be faced with a redundancy situation or redeployment.

2.4 Analysis on Initial Assessment

The proposals set out in the Cabinet Report to deliver the savings requirements for 2017/18 through a combination of the activity set out below will limit any adverse impacts for Citizens, Communities, Employees and wider stakeholders.

1) Capturing savings from contract performance management of the SP contracts, activities include under utilization, spare capacity generated from the first quarter of mobilization for the disabilities contracts, moving some services into alternative funding streams (SP and Third Sector).

2) Use of the Better Care Funding for this year whilst a strategy for third sector investment is developed.

3) Two SP funded providers requesting to end or reduce their agreements with the local authority. In the case of one provider, this is an internal business decision in light of both welfare reform changes and also the need to review supported accommodation where there have been historic under occupancy levels. The second provider is opting to end their service. Work will be carried out to match any remaining service users with other SP funded services for continued support.

The Proposals set out in the Cabinet report include the development of a strategy to deliver the savings for 2018/19 which will be set within the context of the approach to future third sector funding which supports people to live independently within communities and the wider review of SP services taking into consideration government welfare reform changes to supported housing.

During the remainder of 2017/18 an equality impact log will be maintained alongside the development work and a full EA will be completed as required for the proposals for 2018/19.

The services commissioned currently support 31,000 vulnerable people aged 16 plus. The support delivered enables people to 1, live independently, 2, access services which support their specific needs 3, make a full contribution to society 4, support to secure services which minimize any disadvantages as a result of their age for example; support for young people to access secure housing. some landlords are reluctant to provide housing to young people due to concerns relating to their possible in experience as tenants. Older people are supported to overcome isolation and remain active. Homeless Families impacted by welfare reforms are supported to access their full entitlement of benefits to avoid repeat homelessness as a result of affordability issues.

3.1.2 Age - Impact

The current services meet the needs of Adults aged 16+, including families and young people. The Supporting People funded services deliver housing related support to enable vulnerable people to live independently within their own homes and prevents homelessness or repeat homelessness. 3.10 Concluding Statement on Full Assessment

The savings requirements for 2017/18 have been generated through a combination of contract and performance management, provider offers and alignment to some services to alternative funding streams. This has removed or minimized any possible negative impacts for Citizens, Communities, Providers and wider Stakeholders.

Further savings are nevertheless required by 2018/19 in order to deliver the £5m. These savings will be delivered within the context of the following;

1) The establishment of a local authority strategy for the future investment in third sector provision

2) Closer alignment of services to the future vision for adult social care

3) Use of the Improved Better Care Fund to commission prevention services which support people to live independently within their local communities.

4) Further considerations including the proposed welfare reform changes relating to supported housing which will begin to be clarified by central government and DCLG over the next year.

Therefore an impacts log will be created in order to capture step by step any negative impacts or impacts currently not known whilst any proposed activity or changes set out above take place. The action plan set out in this EA will ensure that the appropriate consultations take place. Further EA will be created as part of any re design or commissioning activity.
