The Chair introduced the Members and officers present and explained the hearing procedure.

The Chair asked if there were any preliminary points for the Sub-Committee to consider.

Points made by Mr Craig:

- Some issues had been raised prior to the application being submitted and this would be ventilated in due course.
- Compliance Officers from Birmingham City Council's Licensing Section had visited the premises since the application was submitted.
- Concerns and issues were raised by local neighbours however, no representations had been made.
- Mr Craig had provided direction to the client which were now being adopted.
- WMP had queries around risk assessments - The premises had not undertaken these until Mr Craig's involvement.
- The risk assessment and matters were now completed however, he had not had the opportunity to review the detail with his client. The premises have not had the opportunity to implement this.
- Mr Craig thought the Sub-Committee would be better placed to evaluate the application once the measures were put into place. This would ensure the licensing objectives were better promoted.

- Following discussions with Mr Taj, WMP and Mr Key, Environmental Health, neither objected to an adjournment for their own reasons.
- Mr Craig noted the comment from Environmental Health around a planning matter that required more clarity.
- WMP would need to speak to the Community Officers on the ground. This would give an opportunity for a site meeting before a decision was made.
- Mr Craig apologised for any inconvenience caused to the Sub-Committee.

On this basis, Mr Craig requested for an adjournment for the hearing.

The Chair requested Mr Taj, WMP to share their views on the proposal for an adjournment.

Points made by Mr Taj, (WMP):

- Mr Taj agreed with Mr Craig's points for an adjournment.
- Several documents had been requested which had not been received therefore, more time would be required to make a fair assessment of the application.
- He noted the documents requested were now available however, going through the process of implementation.
- He had requested a site visit which would be arranged shortly.
- Mr Taj was awaiting additional detail from the Local Neighbourhood Police which would assist in assessing the application.

The Chair requested Mr Keys, Environmental Health to share their views on the proposal for an adjournment.

Points made by Mr Keys, (Environmental Health):

- Mr Key did not believe the risk assessment would change the position for Environmental Health however, he would review what would be submitted.
- He had no objection to an adjournment.

At 1016 hours, the meeting was adjourned in order for the Sub Committee to make a decision and all parties left the meeting. The Members, Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager conducted the deliberations in private.

1. Purpose of report:

To consider representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises) to operate from 2:00pm until 2:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 2:00pm until 4:00am (Friday and Saturday).

The provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of live music and recorded music, to operate indoors only, from 11:00pm until 2:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00pm until 4:00am (Friday and Saturday).

To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment, to operate indoors only, from 11:00pm until 2:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00pm until 4:00am (Friday and Saturday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 2:00pm until 2:30am (Sunday to Thursday) and 2:00pm until 4:30am (Friday and Saturday).

2. Recommendation:

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 1st September 2021 in respect of Diamond Lounge, 92 – 96 Hospital Street, Birmingham, B19 3QP.

Ghebremichael Habtom applied on 1st September 2021 for the grant of a Premises Licence for Diamond Lounge, 92 – 96 Hospital Street, Birmingham, B19 3QP.

WMP wish to object to the grant of this premises licence.

The applicant seeks to operate a lounge supplying alcohol until 02:00 in the week and until 04:00 at the weekend. The application offers some robust conditions, which if complied with, should promote the licensing objectives within the premises. WMPs concern is that the late hours requested and the supply of alcohol will attract crowds into an area already experiencing significant alcohol related crime and ASB issues. WMP believe that the granting of this licence will further magnify the issues being caused in this location. This will undermine the public nuisance and the crime and disorder licensing objectives.

The area is remote and surrounded by a number of businesses, some of which work extended hours. The layout of the road junction and the availability of large amounts of road parking will lead to dispersal issues from this premises. This will negatively impact local businesses and will not promote the crime and disorder licensing objectives.

It is believed that events have taken place already at this location and that it has already caused significant numbers of vehicles to attend.

I am responding on behalf of the Environmental Health team as a responsible authority in respect of a new premises licence application for Diamond Lounge, 92-96 Hospital Street, Birmingham, B19 3QP and I formally raise a representation based on my concerns that the grant of the licence will not support the promotion of the licensing objective relating to the prevention of public nuisance.

The application is for sale of alcohol between 14.00 – 02.00 Sunday to Thursday and 14.00 – 04.00 on Friday and Saturday and late night refreshment, live music and recorded music between 23.00 – 02.00 Sunday to Thursday and 23.00 – 04.00 on Friday and Saturday. The premises is located in an area which is mixed commercial area with nearby residential development. The site currently has planning permission for office use and is a two storey building with a flat roof and the rear area is an open plan yard. The drawings submitted indicates a two Storey structure to the right of the premises which does not exist. There is no permission for the operation of a lounge, kitchen, bar, cafe or restaurant under the planning regime.

The plan indicates a significant seating area with over 150 seats, a small kitchen but does not provide information on smoking areas or external areas of the premises. The applicant has suggested some conditions but these are wholly inadequate to address the potential adverse impacts. Based on the information provided there could be a significant noise from the use of the premises (particularly the external areas), music breakout from a building which is not designed for acoustic performance and noise from patrons exiting and entering.

The fundamental issue is the late hour requested and inadequate conditions and I cannot support the hours requested and my concerns could not be addressed by conditions hence my representation.

I write in regard to the deadline for consultation for the Diamond Lounge nightclub on 92-96 Hospital St and to register my objection under the following 3 areas:

1. The prevention of crime disorder
2. Public Safety
3. The prevention of public nuisance

I am very concerned about the proposed plans for a drinking licence and to play music from 2pm at the proposed night club Diamond Lounge. I believe that this will be a significant disruption to the education of our students and the safety of their families. CCTV images show abuses of public safety, visitors to the nightclub are urinating and defecating in the streets and the school grounds, the disposal of alcoholic beverages, drug paraphernalia and takeaway food has found its way into the school playground.

Staffs are trained as appropriate in respect of relevant licensing law. The open nature of the Lounge allows for good viewing coverage. CCTV is installed covering both inside and outside the premises.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Staff other than personal license holders involved in the sale of alcohol are to be trained under the Licensing Act 2003 prior to being allowed to sell/ supply alcohol. All training is to be documented and signed by the Premises License Holder and the trainee. All training records are to be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request.

All windows to be closed and remain closed while regulated entertainment is taking place after 2000 hours except for ingress and egress or cases of emergency.

The volume of all entertainment/music will be controlled by the DPS, premises licence holder or their nominated representative and not the DJ, artist or persons hiring the venue.

The premises will deploy door staff from 22.00hrs when trading past 22.00hrs. Door staff will sign on and off duty. No persons will be allowed to enter the premises between Sunday and Thursday after midnight and on Friday or Saturday after 0200 hours.

The premises will operate a dispersal policy which will be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request.

If the premises is hired out or any promoted event with/by a third party the premises will notify West Midlands Police Central Licensing Team (by email) a minimum of 28 days prior to the event taking place. This notification will be accompanied by a risk assessment tailored for that event. As well as the security plan the risk assessment will include the

names, addresses and dates of birth of the person(s) hiring the room or promoter. It will also include the real names and stages names of any artist, DJ, band or performer.

c) Public safety

A fire risk assessment will be conducted. Any findings will be actioned and the premises made safe in the allocated time of the risk assessment.

All sofas and furnishings will comply with the BS 7166 regulations (to a minimum of crib ignition source 5)

Suitable fire alarm will be installed which meets the BS 5839 standards and a copy of the certificate will be made available to responsible authorities. The system will be tested weekly and records will be kept. Any faults will be recorded and rectified by an approved competent person.

The emergency lighting system will be installed to the BS 5266 standards to ensure all exits routes are illuminated in the event of a power failure. The system will be tested monthly, and records kept.

A robust evacuation procedure will be documented and all staff on induction will be trained in these procedures to ensure that all relevant persons are evacuated safely in the event of a fire. Refresher training will be conducted annually, and records kept.

The Designated Premises Supervisor is aware of his responsibilities to the staff and customers in respect of public safety and will take all reasonable steps to ensure the maintenance of all provided safety arrangements and equipment in accordance with the requirements of current installations.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All deliveries will be received between 07:00 and 18:00.

The Designated Premises Supervisor or other competent person shall carry out observations in the vicinity of the premises on at least two intervals between 23:00 and 02:00 (Monday – Thursday, Sunday) and 23:00 and 03:00 (Friday and Saturday) whilst live music or recorded music is playing in order to establish whether there is a noise breakout from the premises. If the observation reveals noise breakout at a level likely to cause disturbance to the occupants of properties in the vicinity then the volume of music shall be reduced to a level that does not cause disturbance. A record of such observations shall be kept, records shall be completed immediately after the observation detailing the time, location and duration of the observation, the level of noise breakout and any action taken to reduce noise breakout. Records shall be available at all times upon request to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority, Environmental Health Department or the Police.

All doors shall be kept closed except for the purpose of access/egress during the performance of regulated entertainment.

The Licence Holder shall erect prominent, clear and legible signage inside the premises requesting patrons to be considerate of local residents when leaving the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

We recognise the importance of protecting children from harm and this is supported by our commitment to health and safety in the operation and maintenance of the premises and also our approach to managing the risk of under age drinking. The Designated Premises Supervisor and staff will at all times remain aware of their responsibilities under the objective, including that alcohol shall not be sold to anyone under the age of 18. Staff on duty will be trained and made aware of a challenge 25 policy and the requirements and the need to demand an acceptable form of age id. Training records will be maintained and updated by DPS every six months.

No persons under the age of 18 will be allowed to be on the premises after 2200 hours.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity – such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

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If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at <https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work>) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be checked online. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

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- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
