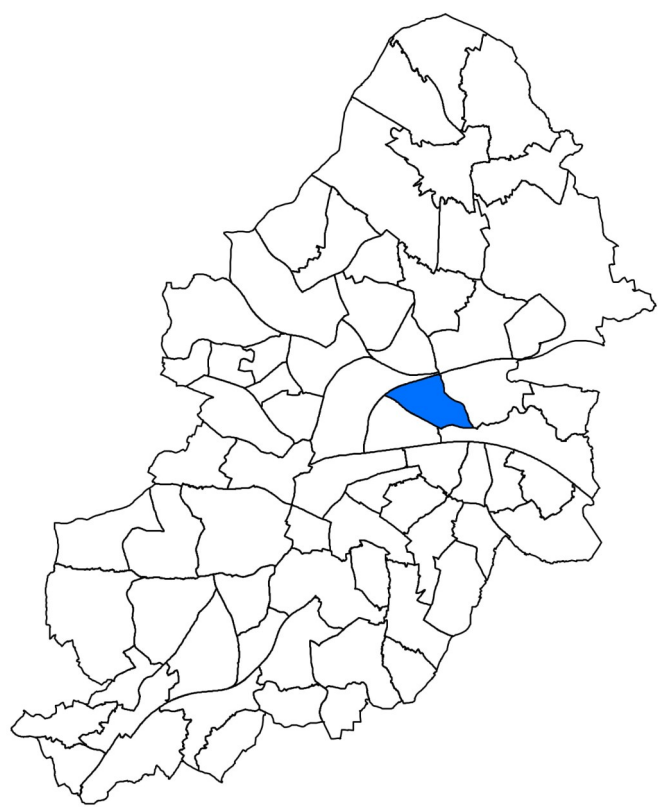


Ward End Ward Factsheet



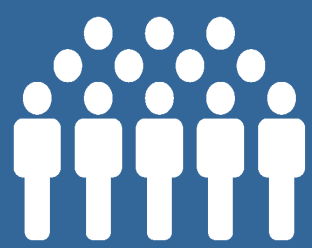

Ward End Ward is located in the inner city to the east of the city centre. It has a population of 12,255 making it the 37th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a significantly younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Ward End is amongst the city's more deprived wards and has average income levels below the Birmingham average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.

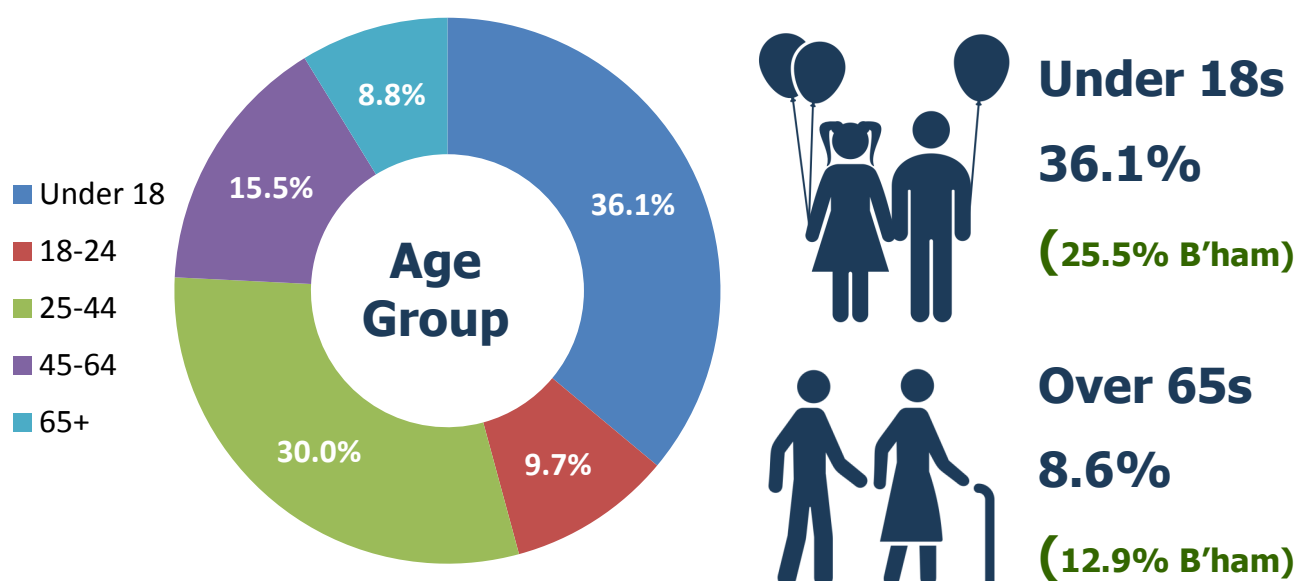

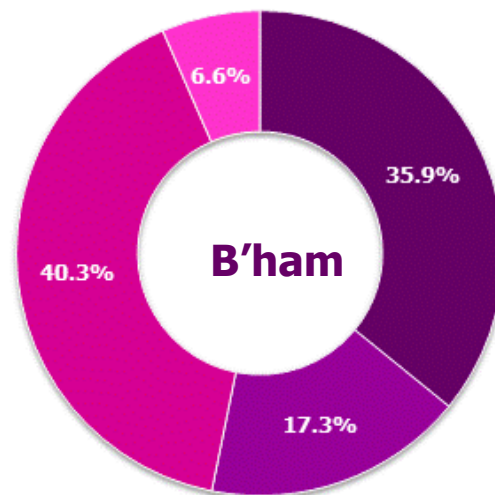
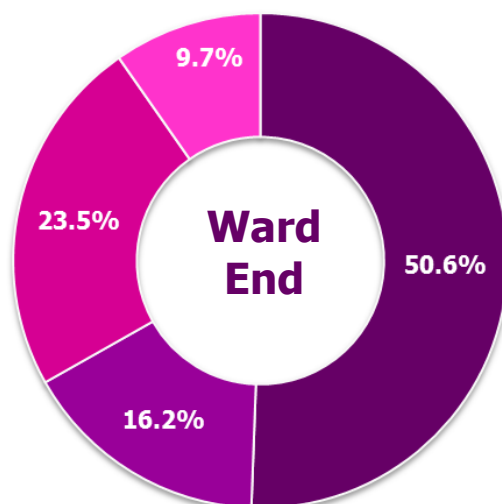
