1. Purpose of report:

Premises to remain open to the public from 12:00midday until 1:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 12:00midday until 2:00am (Friday and Saturday).

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 19th March 2020 in respect of Mars Pizza, 130 Alcester Road, Moseley, Birmingham, B13 8EE.

I am writing on behalf of the Chantry Road and Park Hill Residents Association to object to this application.

I was disturbed to learn that Mars Pizza may have been operating hitherto without appropriate licensing for its late-night refreshment activities. This business already has something of a reputation in the area for operating without following proper business waste disposal procedures. In fact, I had to report the business to Environmental Health as recently as December 2019 because staff at the business were observed burning rubbish in a small asphalted area at the rear of the premises – notwithstanding that a new apartment block had been constructed just metres away. This was a VERY serious breach of basic safety procedures demanded of every citizen and business in a built-up area simply to protect the lives of nearby residents.

The current application is to allow opening on: Sunday – Thursday 12.00 – 01.00 Friday & Saturday 12.00 – 02.00

I struggle to understand why the business needs to open so late, particularly during the working week and given the proximity of the business to residential accommodation. The application as it is should be refused in order to prevent public nuisance. It might be more reasonable to ask the business to close by 00.00 hours daily, and to require it to commit to adherence to proper business waste disposal procedures.

Ref: Representation against application no. 115234, Mars Pizza.

I would like to object to the granting of the licence for the sale of late night refreshments for Mars Pizza. I live in the block of flats adjacent and behind Mars Pizza, Moseley Central. The main point of objection is that it will create a public nuisance. It will create a greater amount of food and drink waste that will block and litter my driveway and pavement.

The driveway to access my block of flats runs alongside Mars Pizza. Mars Pizza's bins have been overflowing for months and their waste has been strewn across the path and drive to my flats. I have attached photographic evidence that details the clear and consistent nature of this issue. I have previously contacted Birmingham Council and the Environmental Health department, who physically inspected the area because of the recurring problem. My local councillor, Kerry Jenkins, wrote to me and I have been collating further evidence to return to her. By extending the hours of hot food served, this will increase the spilled waste associated with fast food: plastic gloves, bones, raw meat, empty cans and paper towels for example. I have repeatedly advised Mars Pizza that they need an extra bin to cope with the mess but they have been uncooperative. Mars Pizza do not currently possess the bin capacity to manage the extra waste that arises with additional operating hours and this will create a nuisance to Moseley Central.

Another objection I have is that the extended hours will create further blockage on my driveway. Despite Moseley Central drawing double yellow lines and installing CCTV and parking notice posters, Mars Pizza have continued to park on our drive for their business use. This cannot happen as it belongs to Moseley Central and prevents residents, deliveries and maintenance from accessing their homes and vital services for the block throughout the day and night.

In the event that the licence is granted, a condition should be added that Mars Pizza should acquire and use an additional bin to manage the increased waste, especially as the business is already struggling to cope.

I am unaware if the application is for a new licence or a renewal but I strongly believe that my representation is relevant either way. In light of recent events, I thought that contacting you by email would serve as the best method of correspondence.






