### Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:— (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$ , where:— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where

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the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made: (a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC), where the film has been classified by that Board, or (b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20(3)(b) (s74(3)(b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

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**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with operating schedule**

**2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

- No adult entertainment or services are permitted on the premises, with the exception of AWP machines.
- Regulated entertainment is permitted to take place inside the premises only.
- The exhibition of films to be limited to the use of video jukebox and occasional karaoke only.
- The licensee will ensure the premises respect Spirit Group's Approach to Responsible Drinking.

**2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder**

- If a disk jockey is used on any night at the premises, then he/she will ask patrons to leave the premises quietly.
- The licensee shall ensure that all instances of crime and disorder are reported to the police and an incident log book will be kept and maintained on the premises.
- When door staff are used on the premises they will be Security Industry Authority (SIA) approved and operate in accordance with the Security Industry guidelines.
- The licensee shall ensure a zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times on the premises.

**2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety**

- Occupancy figures will be no more than stated on the latest Meridian Fire Risk Assessment, which is available for inspection upon request.

**2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance**

- The licensee shall ensure additional patrols are carried out by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when entertainment is being offered within the premises.
- Notices will be displayed on the premises, asking customers to respect local residents when leaving the premises.
- Soft drinks and non-alcoholic refreshment will be available during any extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises.

**2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm**

- Whenever children are permitted on the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises will be suitable for persons of that age.
- Persons under the age of 16 must be supervised by an accompanying adult at all times.
- Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks will be available.
- Persons under the age of 18 are not permitted to play on Section 34 permitted AWP machines.
- Persons under the age of 16 are not permitted in the area immediately adjacent to the bar servery.

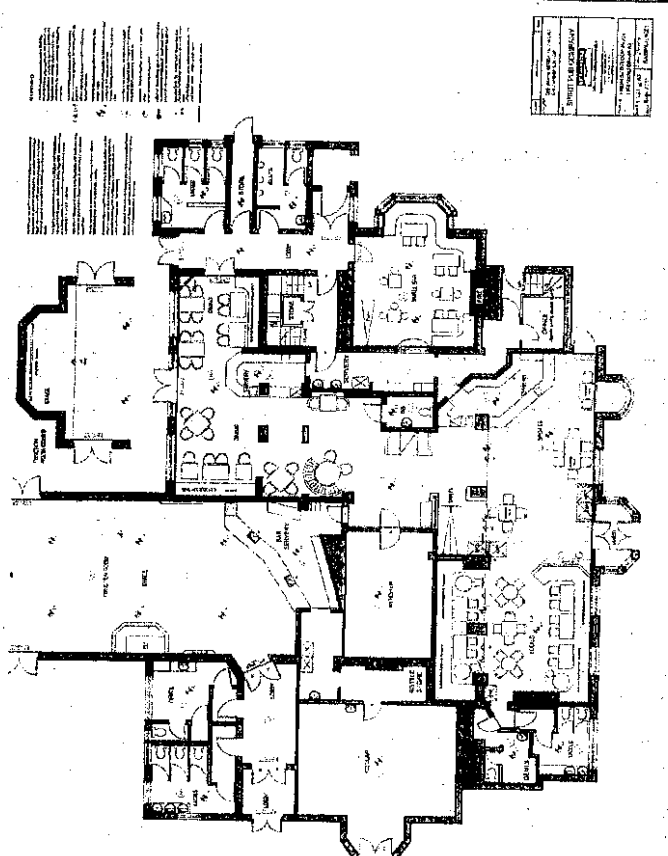

**Use of Gaming Machines by persons under the age of eighteen**

As you may know we are the Licensing Solicitors for Star Pubs & Bars Limited & Punch Partnerships (PTL) Limited.

You may also appreciate that the Premises Licence for your pub is held by Punch Partnerships (PTL) Limited. As a responsible Licence Holder it is felt necessary to take steps to ensure that Gaming Machines are not being played by persons under the age of eighteen and for that purpose Punch Partnerships (PTL) Limited have engaged Serve Legal to carry out an exercise to ensure that persons who appear to be under the age of eighteen are being properly challenged by either you or your staff.

I am sorry to say that as part of that operation your premises failed this test purchase on 04/10/2019 and a proper challenge was not made when an attempt to use the Gaming Machines was made by somebody who whilst over eighteen appears under eighteen.

As such, Punch Partnerships (PTL) Limited is not satisfied that sufficiently robust procedures are in force at your premises.

As an immediate action we require that you address this with all members of staff to ensure that they are aware of the legal requirements. To aid you in this we enclose with this letter the following: -

1. Gambling Commission – Guide to Gaming Machines in Pubs
2. Relevant signage to display in the vicinity of the machines
3. Incident log – for recording refusal of use of the machines

On your next business review meeting your BDM will be following up to ensure this training has been completed.

Allowing persons who are under the age of eighteen to use your gaming machines renders you and your staff liable to prosecution and the

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Premises Licence is placed in danger. It is essential that proper safeguards are put in place to ensure that this does not take place.

Please also note that according to your agreement with Star Pubs and Bars Ltd you are obliged to ensure that the Premises Licence is not prejudiced in any way.

Your agreement may be terminated by Star Pubs and Bars Ltd where you are found to be in breach of your obligations, unless you can demonstrate a marked improvement in your standards of operating. Please be aware that should another failure occur, further action may be taken.

A further test purchase will take place in the future.

You should check your premises licence in order to remind yourself of the conditions contained within it, paying particular attention to those conditions relating to children and any Age Verification policy that you may be required to have in place to comply with your licence.
