## 1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises) to operate from 08:00am until 03:00am (Sunday to Thursday), 08:00am until 05:00am (Friday), and 08:00am until 06:00am (Saturday).

To permit the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of plays, films, indoor sporting events, boxing or wrestling entertainment, live music, recorded music, performances of dance and anything of a similar description, to operate indoors only, from 08:00am until 03:00am (Sunday to Thursday), 08:00am until 05:00am (Friday) and 08:00am until 06:00am (Saturday).

To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment to operate from 11:00pm until 03:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00pm until 05:00am (Friday and Saturday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 08:00am until 04:00am (Sunday to Thursday), 08:00am until 06:00am (Friday) and 08:00am until 07:00am (Saturday).

Other dates and times as specified in the application.

#### 2. Recommendation:

#### 3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2016 in respect of the Quantum, 30 – 34 River Street, Digbeth, Birmingham, B5 5SA.

Representations have been received from 3 responsible authorities and from other persons.

West Midlands Police wish to object to the above premises licence application (reference 69837, 30 – 34 River Street, Digbeth)

The applicant, or those connected to the applicant have made numerous application for this premises. At the last hearing, through their licensing consultant, Mr Hopkins of GT Licensing made a number of concessions to reassure those who had made representations. In spite of these concessions to the application (which included hours reduction and a limit of 25 non-standard events per year) the committee still determined to refuse the licence application.

WMP have looked at this application and view it as a backward step from what was offered by GT Licensing during the previous hearing. The application is not substantially different to cause us to amend our previous objections.

WMP have met with Kennith Marks, the new Director of QEC Limited to discuss the licence application. As with previous applications, Mr Marks was keen to explain to WMP the positive impact that the venue has had hosting exhibitions and charitable events. Whilst this is commendable, this is not the element of licensable activity that causes WMP concerns around public nuisance or crime and disorder. Mr Marks explained that the venue would not be primarily used as a late night club, but that this element of the business was essential to generate funds to sustain other elements.

WMP suggested to Mr Marks that he seeks professional advice on the application, as the current application was more generous in its hours of operation that the one which had previously been refused.

Dear Sir/Madam,

As a representative of the responsible authority (Planning) I would like to raise a representation to the licence application for 30-34 River Street on the grounds of public nuisance. I am concerned regarding the proposed hours of operation to 4am Sunday to Thursday, 6am on Fridays and 7am on Saturdays. These hours of operation are likely to negatively impact nearby residents (The Bond on Fazeley Street) in terms of noise and disturbance both from regulated entertainment and comings and goings and for this reason, it is unlikely that planning consent would be forthcoming. I note the premise is extensive in size, therefore there is capacity for a significant number of people which is also of concern.

Paragraph 123 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2012 states that 'planning decisions should avoid noise from giving rise to significant adverse impacts on health and quality of life as a result of new development; mitigate and reduce to a minimum other adverse impacts on health and quality of life arising from noise from new development'.

In addition it is noted that the premises do not have planning consent to operate as a Nightclub or Exhibition Centre.

We act for The Bond Company and write in response to the application which has been made by QEC Limited for a Premises Licence in respect of 30-34 River Street, Digbeth, B5 5SA.

Our client operates two sites in the immediate neighbourhood at 180-182 Fazeley Street and Floodgate Street providing commercial accommodation 24/7 for businesses and four private residential units. The Bond also provides hospitality facilities from its premises on a number of occasions every year.

Our client has instructed us to write to the Licensing Authority setting out its representations to the above application which it makes both in its own interests and those of both its commercial and residential tenants.

The Bond Company together with three of its residents in person made representations in respect of the two premises licence applications which were previously made for a premises licence for these premises within the last twelve months and which have on both occasions been refused by the Licensing Committee.

It should be noted that following shortly after the refusal of the last Premises Licence application our client's premises were vandalised with graffiti being sprayed on the street walls on several ocassions and 6 windows were smashed by bricks being thrown through. We are advised that one tenant nearly suffered serious injury.

More concerning, a campaign was then undertaken against two of our tenants who lived on Fazeley Street (who had made personal representations in respect of the Quantum application). This involved posters being distributed around Digbeth, falsely stated to be from a local Residents Association identifying the two gentlemen by name and photograph and alleging them to be "paedophiles". The posters were displayed publicly in the vicinity of their homes and were also malled directly to Commercial Tenants of The Bond Company. These matters were investigated by the police

Our client has grave concerns that should the licensing committee grant this premises licence in respect of the premises at the third time of asking, the provision of licensable activities under it will have a detrimental impact on the local area, to The Bond Company as a business and to its commercial and residential tenants.

In October 2015 under two separate TENs granted in respect of the applicant's current premises that continued until 4AM we are advised that excessive noise was a real issue for our client's tenants. On the 24/25<sup>th</sup> October 2015 we are advised that noise was so intense in the Fazeley Street flats that floors, walls and ceilings were vibrating, causing disturbance and lack of sleep to the tenants. The subsequent event run at the premises on the 31<sup>st</sup> October 2015 resulting in the residents being subjected to similar levels of noise and disturbance and led to them submitting two complaints and two requests for call outs to the City's Environmental Health department.

Our client does not consider that to grant a licence that would enable these premises to be operated throughout the night on a daily basis would be appropriate. The objectives set out under the Licensing Act 2003 will not be upheld and the building and its location are totally inappropriate for providing regulated entertainment and the sale of alcohol throughout the night. The premises will essentially be used a Night Glub not conference or banqueting as set out in the applicant's application.

As has already been demonstrated by the operation of the premises during previous Temporary Events in October 2015, sound generate inside the premises will cause considerable noise, vibration and disturbance throughout the night to those both living and working in the area.

The dispersal of customers leaving the premises throughout the night will cause noise and disturbance, not just at closing and it will inevitably lead to an increase in anti-social behaviour in the area. The sale of alcohol until the early hours will clearly exacerbate these issues.

Excess noise will also be generated by the congregation of persons throughout the night in the proposed smoking area to the rear of the premises.

The picking up and dropping off by taxis and other vehicles will cause additional disturbance throughout the night, not just outside the premises but throughout the local area.

The property is a former factory which has the appearance of requiring a significant amount of investment and was never designed to be used as a nightclub. Our client also has grave concerns about the safety of the premises and the necessary routes of escape that also rely on exit over land belonging to a third party.

Regardless of any measures that the applicant may propose, the impact on the local area, The Bond Company and its tenants who are entitled to live and work in a peaceful environment will be significant. Our client would kindly ask the Licensing Authority to consider our clients representations in this matter and to reject this third application for the premises licence.

I am writing to object to a licensing application (details below), which we feel will be of detriment to Digbeth if approved.

There are a number of reasons we would like to object to this application. Firstly, the application is requesting incredibly long opening hours and the ability to sell alcohol pretty much around-the-clock. There is no precedent or history of late night venues on River Street or the adjoining roads, which tend to focus on small industrial operations and creative pursuits. We feel that this proposed type of venue is not in-keeping with the area, which is also home to many residents. Digbeth Residents Association is not averse to development, providing it is sensitive to its surroundings, and we have supported many planning and licensing applications in the past. This application, however, does not fall into either the positive, welcome, or beneficial categories.

Secondly, this type of venue is likely to attract lots of vehicular traffic, for which River Street is simply not built for. Digbeth already has an issue with inconsiderate parking (our local police officer Tracey Pickering regular posts photos of inconsiderate drivers on River Street and adjoining roads on Twitter - see here). This venue is likely to exacerbate this issue, extending it from a day time problem to a night time problem too. The Rainbow also suffers from this fate, which causes Digbeth High Street and Adderley Street to become completely blocked with parked taxis at the end of an event.

Thirdly, and this is certainly not an insult to the licensing committee, but we worry that this venue may open and operate despite official edicts not to. We are under the impression that the budding entrepreneurs wanting to open this venue fall into the same category as those responsible for Havana Shisha Lounge. Havana was refused planning permission back in January, yet STILL continues to operate to this day. (More information here.) Even if a licence to operate is refused, we are concerned about the powers of a short-staffed and already stretched Birmingham City Council to enforce

Last, but by no means least, we have reason to believe (on good authority) that the applicants for this licence were also responsible for a smear campaign against two innocent upstanding citizens earlier this year, issuing dozens of illegal posters brandishing the two individuals as sexual deviants and predators. Not only did this dismal campaign tarnish the names and reputations of two perfectly innocent people, causing them to have to take steps to change their appearance, jobs, homes, and every single part of their identity, they also used the name of Digbeth Residents Association to add credibility and gravifas to this shameful act. Clearly, the fact that two lives were ruined is far more important than the reputation of a voluntary organisation I have worked to build over five years, but it does cause me huge concern as to what could be considered as 'acceptable' business practices by these applicants.

- 1) Door supervisors stationed outside the frontage of the premises will wear high visibility jackets /coats and will have their SIA badge held in a clear arm sleeve holder. Door supervisors inside the premises will wear hi visibility waist coats, again with the SIA badge positioned in a clear arm sleeve holder in visible view to the public.
- The CCTV system shall record and store images for a minimum of 28 days. Images to be made available to West Midlands Police and Local Authority officers immediately upon request
- 3) The Licence Holder shall ensure the conduct of patrons leaving premises will be supervised and monitored to minimise potential nuisance. Similarly, conduct of the general public in the vicinity will be monitored and the Police advised of inappropriate behavior/unlawful activity
- 4) No licensable activities after 1am In(main Hall) area 31,32,33 River st Highlighted purple on site separation plan
- 5) Maximum capacity of 200 seated persons, segregated with security Fencing. Post 1am in area: 31, 32, 33 River st highlighted purple on site separation plan.
- 6)The responsible person must ensure that" (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures" (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- 1) SIA registered door supervisors profiles will be retained for all staff that are working in the premises or have been working at the premises in the last 3 months. Profiles are to be proof of identity (photocopy of driving licence or passport) and proof of address (utility bill or bank statement). Proof of address is not required when proof of identity is a new photo driving licence. Profiles are to be available for inspection on request by a responsible authority.
- 2) The premises will risk assess its standard operating procedures covering seven days a week, included in this risk assessment will be any security provisions. A copy of risk assessments to be made available to West Midlands Police Licensing Department (Steel house Lane).
- 3) An incident log book will be kept and maintained on the premises, and will be made available for inspection by West Midlands Police and responsible authorities
- 4) A Challenge 21 initiative to be operational at the premises. Smoking area will be located out the rear fire exit into private owned car park for larger events. Smoking area will be cordoned off with double fencing to prevent anything being passed through. The area will be manned by SIA licensed security officers.
- 5) A zero tolerance drugs policy will be implemented at the premises. Any person who is considered to be under the

influence of drugs or excessive alcohol is not permitted entry on the premises.

- 6) Search facilities will be available at entrance(s) when identified as necessary by Risk Assessment. Persons suspected of being unlawfully in possession of drugs will be searched. Door staff will understand that only the Police have right to search without consent. However, any person declining **be**ing searched by door staff will not be granted access to the premises.
- 7) A pre-event evaluation will be carried out to assess the appropriate number of Door Supervisors and Event Stewards required for an event where licensable activities take place. Number of door supervisors will vary depending upon audience profile including risk of heavy drinking, drugs or weapons
- 8)The licence holder shall ensure For events where children (i.e persons under the age of 16 years)will be unaccompanied by adults, shall carry out a Pre-event Evaluation to ensure that there are adequate staffing levels at the premises based on the number of children anticipated to be present.
- 9 )Front of Stage Barriers used for Regulated Entertainment Events a suitable and sufficient front of stage barrier will be in position for each event, unless risk assessed. The decision to not have a front of stage barrier may only be reached following the completion of a suitable and sufficient risk assessment that is documented and demonstrates that the risk can be adequately controlled through other means

#### c) Public safety

- 1) The CCTV system to be in full working order at #ll times when the premises are open for licensable activities.
- 2) Venue to ensure the entrance area together with the queuing area to be well illuminated by secure lighting to a high standard and maintained.
- 3) First Aid A Pre- Event Evaluation carried out on each prospective event will assess the need for medical and first aid cover, having regard for the nature or the event and the numbers of public expected to attend. Access for Emergency Vehicles A suitable access route able to accommodate emergency vehicles will be maintained clear and free from obstruction at all times.
- 4) Public Event" means any event to which members of the [public may gain admission without any qualification, whether or not for payment. Private Event" means any other event restricted to an identifiable group or class, which may include persons attending by invitation or ticket, whether or not for payment.
- 5) Drinks containers No glass or glass bottles containers beverages of any kind, whether open or sealed, shall be given to persons attending a Public Event, b) those attending a Private Event inside the premises except that glasses and bottles containing beverages may not be removed from these areas except in plastic, paper or safety glass container. c) Stand Hospitality Catering at an Exhibition (whether a Public Event or Private Event) Beverages may not be removed from the building
- 6) Extra external Lighting on entrance for queuing. CCTV and spot lights overlooking Car park Area
- 7)A FIRE RISK ASSESSMENT AND EMERGENCY PLAN WILL BE PREPARED & REGULARLY REVIEWED. STAFF WILL BE GIVEN APPROPRIATE FIRE SAFETY TRAINING

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

ENTERTAINMENT OR DEREGULATED MSICAL ENTERTAINMENT SHALL BE AUDIBLE AT THE CURTILAGE OF THE NEAREST NOISE SENSITIVE PREMISES.

- 5) PERFOMERS, DJ'S , MC'S OR OTHER PERSONS PROVIDING AMPLIFIED MUSIC SHALL ONLY BE PERMITTED TO PLAY THROUGH A NOISE LIMITER IF ONE IS REQUIRED TO BE USED IN THE RESPECTIVE ROOM WHERE THEY ARE PERFORMING. THE DUTY MANAGER AND STAFF SHALL ENSURE THIS REQIREMENT IS COMPLIED WITH.
- 6) DURING REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT OR DEREGULATED MUSICAL ENTERTAINMENT ALL DOORS AND WINDOWS IN THE PERFORMANCE ROOM CONCERNED SHALL BE KEPT CLOSED EXCEPT FOR ACCESS AND EGRESS.
- 7) DURING EVENTS OR FUNCTIONS WHERE MUSICAL ENTERTAINMENT IS BEING PROVIDED AFTER 21.00 THE PREMISES LICENCE HOLDER, DPS OR DUTY MANAGER SHALL UNDERTAKE HOURLY CHECKS OUTSIDE THE NEAREST NOISE SENSITIVE

- 8) A PHONE NUMBER WILL BE PROVIDED FOR NEARBY RESIDENTS TO CONTACT THE VENUE MANAGER / DUTY MANAGER WITH ANY CONCERNS OR COMPLAINTS AND THE PHONE NUMBER WILL ALSO BE DISPLAYED OUTSIDE THE MAIN ENTRANCE. - 9) A QUARTERLY MEETING SHALL BE OFFERED IN WRITING TO NEARBY RESIDENTS TO DISCUSS ANY CONCERNS ARISING.
  10) THE SMOKING AREA WILL BE LOCATED IN THE REAR PRIVATELY OWNED CAR PARK AND SHALL BE COVERED BY CCTV
  CAPABLE OF PROVIDING EVIDENTIAL STANDARD IMMAGES IN ANY LIGHT QUALITY.
- 11) FOR LATE NIGHT OR LARGER EVENTS THE CAR PARK AND ACCESS TO IT WHEN IN USE AS THE SMOKING AREA SHALL BE PATROLLED BY SIA LICENSED DOOR SUPERVISORS WHEN ON DUTY OR BY STAFF AT ALL OTHER TIMES.
- 12) THE QUEUEING AREA FOR EVENTS OR FUNCTIONS WILL BE WESTWARD ALONG RIVER STREET AND AWAY FROM NEARBY RESIDENTS.IT SHALL BE SUPERVISED BY DOOR SUPERVISORS WHEN ON DUTY OR MONITORED BY STAFF AT OTHER TIMES.

  13) AT THE TERMINAL HOUR FOR LICENSABLE ACTIVITIES, THROUGHOUT THE CONSUMPTION PERIOD AND AT CLOSE SIA LICENSED DOOR SUPERVISORS SHALL BE PLACED ON THE DOOR AND IN RIVER STREET TO REMIND DEPARTING CUSTOMERS TO LEAVE QUIETLY AND NOT TO LOITER IN THE AREA AND TO DIRECT THEM AWAY FROM THE NEARBY RESIDENTS. - 15) APPROPRIATE NOTICES WILL BE DISPLAYED BY THE EXITS ASKING CUSTOMERS TO LEAVE QUIETLY, NOT LOITER IN THE AREA AND NOT TO TAKE DRINKS, GLASSES OR BOTTLES OUTSIDE THE PREMISES.
- 16) WRITTEN QUEUEING AND DISPERSAL POLICIES ARE TO BE IN FORCE AND SUBMITTED TO POLICE AND BCC LICENSING.
  STAFF INCLUDING DOOR SUPERVISORS SHALL ENSURE THE CONDITIONS APPLICABLE UNDER THE POLICIES ARE COMPLIED
- 17) STAFF WILL CALL A TAXI / CAB FOR ANY CUSTOMER WANTING ONE AND TELEPHONE NUMBERS WILL BE DISPLAYED FOR LOCAL CAB FIRMS.
- 18) THE PREMISES LICENCE HOLDER SHALL ENSURE THAT LOCAL TAXI FIRMS ARE REQUESTED TO TELL DRIVERS TO TURN OFF ENGINES WHILE WAITING AND NOT TO SOUND THEIR HORNS. CUSTOMERS WILL BE REMINDED NOT TO SLAM CAR DOORS.
- 19) THE STREET AROUND THE PREMISES SHALL BE SWEPT AFTER ALL EVENTS BUT NOT BETWEEN 21.00 AND 08.00 20) NO DELIVERIES OF GOODS SHALL BE RECEIVED OR REMOVAL OF RUBBISH ESPECIALLY GLASS ITEMS TAKE PLACE BETWEEN 21.00 AND 08.00.
- e) The protection of children from harm
- 1) No children shall remain in the licensed premises past 21:00 hours when the premise is being used as a late night venue.
- 2) The licence holder shall ensure For events where children (i.e persons under the age of 16 years) will be unaccompanied by adults, shall carry out a Pre-event Evaluation to ensure that there are adequate staffing levels at the premises based on the number of children anticipated to be present.
- 3) Cinema Films Where a program includes a film in the 12A, 15 or 18 category no person appearing to under the age of 12 (and unaccompanied in that case), 15 or 18 as appropriate shall be admitted to any part of the programme; and the licence holder shall display in a conspicuous position a notice stating this. Where films of different categories from part of the same programme, the notice shall refer to the oldest age restriction.

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



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
