West Midlands Police have applied for an expedited review of the premises licence in respect of Cross Keys Banqueting and Catering, 81 Steward Street, Spring, Birmingham, B18 7AF.

The application has been made under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 (as amended) and has been accompanied by a certificate signed by a senior member of the force, stating that in their opinion the licensed premises have been associated with serious crime and disorder. (See A and B above)

In accordance with the regulations, the licensing authority has given the premises licence holder and responsible authorities a copy of the application for review and a copy of the certificate.

This hearing has been arranged in order to consider whether it is necessary to take any interim steps in respect of the licence pending the determination of the review. The Premises Licence is included at item C.

The interim steps that must be considered at the hearing are:

- Modification of the conditions of the premises licence;
- Exclusion of the sale of alcohol by retail from the scope of the licence;
- Removal of the designated premises supervisor from the licence;
- Suspension of the licence

I am a Superintendent in West Midlands Police.

I am giving this certificate because I am in the opinion that the procedures under the Licensing Act are inappropriate in this case because the standard review procedures are thought to be inappropriate due to the seriousness of the crime, and the serious management failings of the premises concerned.

This venue has previously been engaged with by licensing officers and is aware of their operating hours for licensable activity.

An incident takes place in the inside the premises, hours after the permitted hours for licensable activity. This incident results in a man in his 40's tragically suffering fatal injuries.

I have considered the use of the normal review procedure but I do not feel this would be appropriate in these circumstance due to the above reasons, and the fact that to maintain the licensing objective of preventing crime and disorder the normal review procedure would not be sufficient.

The severity of the incident is a matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the Licensing Committee immediately.

I am conscious of the guidance on the use of "Expedited Reviews" and given the emphasis that is given to use of this power to tackle serious crime and disorder, my feelings that this process is deemed appropriate are further enforced.

 Details of association of the above premises with serious crime, serious disorder or both: (Please read guidance note 2) Cross Keys Banqueting and Catering is a licensed premises located in Steward Street, Springhill, Birmingham.

The premises is on a side street that comprises of a number of commercial premises. It does not have other any other licensed premises nearby. The venue is a destination venue.

The premises is licensed for live music, recorded music, performance of dance, late night refreshment and sale of alcohol by retail until an end time of 01:00 daily.

At 03:19 on Monday 21st February, a call from the Ambulance service alerted police to an incident at the location. A male was found with injuries, and despite the efforts of the emergency services, the male was pronounced deceased. It is believed that the injuries were caused following an incident inside of the premises.

A murder investigation is currently underway.

"Serious crime" is defined by reference to S.81 of RIPA Act 2000. An offence for which an adult could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for a period of 3 years or more.

West Midlands Police are concerned that at a time when the premises had no licence to trade, a man has tragically lost his life, and wish to bring this to the urgent attention of the licensing committee.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective: (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:– (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where– (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value

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added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with operating schedule

2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

CCTV

A digital Closed Circuit Television System (CCTV) will be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped.

The system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard-drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed.

CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.

Cameras will encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, all areas where sale/supply of alcohol occurs, all areas where the public have access and the area immediately outside the premises. The system will record and retain CCTV footage for a minimum of 31 days.

The system will record at all times when the Premises are open. The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on a desktop computer.

The digital recorder will be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tampering, or deletion of images.

There will be at all times, when the premises is open, a member of staff on duty with access to the CCTV system who is trained in the use of the equipment, including the download of images.

Upon receipt of a request for a copy of CCTV footage from officers of any Responsible Authority, the member of staff will produce the footage within 24 hours, or less if urgently required for investigations of serious crime.

CCTV footage must be made available to be viewed by West Midlands Police or an Officer of a Responsible Authority at the premises upon request.

INCIDENT BOOK

An incident book must be kept at the Premises and maintained up to date (no later than 24 hours after the incident) at all times and will record the following:

- Time date and details of all incidents/complaints of crime and disorder or anti-social behaviour.
- All crimes reported to the venue.
- Any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment.
- Any visit by a responsible authority or emergency service.

The incident book must be kept at the premises and made available to West Midlands Police or an Officer of a Responsible Authority on request, or during an inspection.

REFUSALS REGISTER

A refusals register must be kept at the Premises and maintained up to date at all times recording the date time, type of product refused, reasons for every refusal to sell alcohol to a customer and the name and signature of member of staff refusing the sale.

The refusals record must be made available to West Midlands Police or an Officer of a Responsible Authority on request, or during an inspection.

The Premises Licence Holder or the Designated Premises Supervisor must monitor the Refusals Register every month and must sign and date the Refusals Register when this has been completed, or if the Refusals Register is electronic the check and date and time of the check must be clearly recorded.

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TRAINING

Training in relation to the use of the CCTV system, Challenge 25, under age sales, sales to adults on behalf of minor (proxy sales), sales to intoxicated persons, refusals registers, incident records and all other conditions on the Premises Licence must be provided and undertaken by all members of staff (whether paid or unpaid) before he / she makes a sale or supply of alcohol and at least every six months thereafter.

Documented training records must be completed in respect of every member of staff and must include the name of the member of staff trained, date, time and content of the training. The record must be signed by the member of staff who has received the training, the Designated Premises Supervisor, the Premises Licence Holder or external training providers.

Documented training records must be kept at the premises and made available to West Midlands Police or an Officer of a Responsible Authority on request, or during an inspection.

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

The premises shall operate a zero tolerance to dealing in or taking drugs on the premises and anyone so doing shall be removed from and barred from the premises and the matter referred to West Midlands Police and any relevant CCTV images shall be made immediately available to West Midlands Police.

The premises licence holder will supply a list of all externally promoted events (an external promoted event includes any events where a third party has any control of the event, such as ticket management, promotion, booking the artists, or is done in conjunction with the premise licence holder) held at the premises, at least 28 days in advance, unless this requirement is waived by West Midlands Police.

This notification will be accompanied by a risk assessment, unless this requirement is waived by West Midlands Police. Risk assessments will include as a minimum search policies and a security deployment plan, names of the artist, revised capacity numbers to reflect the risk of the event.

The premises will employ at least two SIA registered doormen after 21:00 on a Friday and Saturday, for when there is no event on. For event security levels this will be detailed in the risk assessment

Door staff to be wearing hi visibility coats/jackets whilst working and to sign on duty when they arrive and off duty when they leave. This will include full name, badge number and company they work for.

Door staff not to leave duty until the premises has been cleared including the outside area.

The premises will undertake an annual fire risk assessment, which will be made available to any responsible authority immediately upon request. The fire risk assessment will have a documented capacity figure, which the licence holder will be required to comply with.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

Signs shall be placed at all exits asking customers to respect the needs of local residents and requesting that they leave the premises and area quickly and quietly.

Adequate bins shall be available for customers to dispose of litter.

Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause nuisance to nearby properties.

The premises shall have an operational dispersals policy and noise management plan.

The Premise Licence Holder will ensure that all external windows and doors (other than for necessary access/egress) shall be closed whenever regulated entertainment takes place at the premises.

The Premises Licence Holder shall be responsible for ensuring that the external areas do not create a public nuisance to neighbours at the premises and if necessary will restrict the number of people utilising the outside areas at any one time.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure regulated entertainment to take place indoors only.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure all sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only and shall not be consumed on the premises or immediately outside.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure consumption and preparation of alcohol and food to take place indoors only and not on the public highway.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure customers permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drink or food with them.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure during the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure while live or recorded music takes place, the licensee or management shall undertake regular monitoring of noise levels at the nearest noise-sensitive locations. A record shall be kept of any monitoring, including the date, time and location of monitoring; the name of the monitor; and any action taken. Records shall be kept for no less than six months and shall be made available upon request by the Police or any authorised officer.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm

Staff must require ID in the form of a current ten-year passport, photo card driving licence or PASS Hologram identity card from any customer who appears to be under the age of 25 and verify the customer is over the age of 18 before any sale of alcohol is made.

Notices must be exhibited at all points of sale and at all entrances and exits informing customers and staff that the Premises is operating a Challenge 25 Policy.
