#### OUR 5 KEY LOCAL WARD PRIORITIES FOR THE FOUR OAKS WARD

(September 2017 – May 2018)

1. Four Oaks has an older than average population. It is therefore a ward priority to ensure that senior residents are able to access the facilities they require.

2. Following on from point one above, it is a priority to provide help for dementia in the ward, so as to assist those senior residents who suffer from this very distressing condition.

3. It is a priority for residents to keep grass verges and similar maintained to a high standard.
