(sometimes referred to as ScruClub)	
The original application for this venue was made in Au	ugust 2016. At this time, Jordan Patel was the person
who was in control of the venue. He made the applica	tion which was objected to by West Midlands Police
and by local residents.

The venue did not appear to operate often and we had very little communication with the licence holder or their representatives after the licence was granted.

On 19th October 2017 WMP licensing team were sent an Intelligence log stating that there was going to an event at was on 21st October and that this event would attract gang nominals. It seemed unusual

There were online advertisements for an event called Pandora which was being planned for ArtHouse which is adjacent to Author and the start at 22:00 hours on Saturday 21st October.

This event at Arthouse would have been subject to the notification conditions and risk assessment requirements as per the premises licence. These had not been received by WMP.

I was unsure who was operating the venue and who was planning on running this event without notifying WMP.

I made some enquiries with previous contacts for the venue, nearby venues and security providers and it appeared that the event was going to go ahead at Arthouse and that Jordan Patel was operating the location. Exhibit BR/1 refers.

Jordan then contacted me by email stating he was the sole director of the company. After some emails to clarify the situation, I spoke with Jordan over the phone about the Pandora event which was planned for his venue.

I then sent Jordan an e mail (copied to BCC licensing and Heath Thomas) clarifying the position of WMP if the event were to proceed. The mail was very specific and highlighted conditions and hours of permitted licensable activity. Exhibit BR/2 refers.

In response to this email, Jordan and Heath arranged to attend Lloyd House to meet with myself and to discuss the operation of the premises moving forward. I thought that this was a really positive move by the venue to work with WMP and to increase communication with us.

The meeting took place on Monday 23rd October.

Following the meeting, Jordan began to send a number of risk assessments and event notifications. On the email (Exhibit BR/3 refers) the following sentence was used by Jordan –

I want to apologise again for my previous mistakes, but I guarantee I'm going to do my best and be top of all my paperwork and policy and procedures.

Jordan was certainly presenting as someone who wanted to operate correctly and promote the licensing objectives. He had listened to the advice of PC Deano Walker and myself during the meeting and of course, the advice of his solicitor, Heath Thomas. With the assurances we had been given I was optimistic that ArtHouse would be operating in a more professional way moving forward. That being said, I was still not

confident in the operator.

On the 24th October I mailed Sharon Watts at Birmingham city council licensing section to arrange a joint compliance visit at Arthouse to see if the policies and procedures were being put into place. Exhibit BR/4 refers.

One of the emails (Exhibit BR/5 refers) that was sent to me by Jordan was the RA for the Halloween Party on 31st October (Exhibit BR/6 refers). This was to be an in house event from 23:00 x 02:00. It states it was using the ground floor main suite area and the second bar area, which has a maximum capacity of 800 people, although only 200 were expected.

On Thursday 26th October I sent an email to Jordan and Heath about an event called Midland Baseline Gathering. The event had been displaced from another venue and I wanted to ensure that ArtHouse were once again aware their conditions. I did not have to do this, but in light of our partnership working and our recent meeting, I wanted to ensure that Jordan was not tempted to host an event at short notice. Exhibit BR/7 refers.

On 31st October, Jordan sent me further RA and event notifications for events in November.

I am now aware, that on the afternoon of 31st October, the promoter for an event called AppleBum was trying to source a new venue after the initial venue they had booked, Rainbow Warehouse, could no longer hold the event. The promoters contacted a number of venues and eventually did a deal with Jordan to host the event at Arthouse venue. This was hours before the event was due to open.

The promoter was given a quote of £1600 to host the event, with a capacity of 1,100 people spread across two rooms. Jordan gave an option pay an additional £1000 so that a third room could be opened and stated that this would then be able to accommodate 'everyone'. As the promoter had sold 1,500 tickets, he decided he would have to pay the additional cost to ensure that the capacity was enough for the event. Applebum paid Jordan a total of £2600 to hire the venue. This was on the understanding that the venue was booked until 04:00 (although the venue actually closed at 02:30)

From looking at the plans for the venue, I am unsure as to the division of the premises and how the three rooms are operated. I have enclosed a copy of the plans for the venue.

This event being moved to Arthouse on the day of the event was a clear breach of the premises licence. Nothing was communicated to WMP. In spite of the assurances given by Jordan just 8 days before hand, this event still went ahead.

It also raises questions about the booking process, the hours of licensable activity and the capacity of the

venue.

Applebum had 5 staff working at the event, including a director of the company who was the most senior person representing the Applebum brand at the event. Applebum state that the venue had one entry/exit point and that the venue lost control of the front doors and the barriers. The doors were closed, which Applebum state was their decision and not that of the venue. The brand had a large number of complaints and refund requests following this event.

During the event, calls were made to the 999 network complaining about overcrowding at the location. I have attempted to contact these callers to clarify the events, but they have not replied to my messages or contacted me back. Exhibits BR/8 BR/9 and BR/10 refer.

Exhibit BR/11 is a screen shot from the AppleBum event page on Facebook

The victim of the assault and his friends had booked tickets to Applebum and were made aware of the change of venue on the evening of the event.

The assault took place inside the venue and resulted in the male requiring a metal plate in his jaw due to it being broken.

This assault was reported to WMP after the male was discharged from hospital, he then left the West Midlands area to return to his family home as he is a student in Birmingham and not permanently resident here.

The premises was taken to expedited review as soon as WMP were fully aware of the circumstances and were able to present the evidence to a Supt for consideration.

At the same time, I was also contacted by an officer from the neighbourhood task force who was looking into some intelligence around firearms which related to Arthouse. This was historical Intel and could not be acted on immediately. I have sought clarity from the officer as to the content of this intelligence which has been added to this evidence bundle as exhibit BR/12.

The committee members challenged the venue during the expedited review over the functionality of the CCTV system during the end of October. I also have similar concerns that although the licence holder appeared to be working with ADT to rectify the issues, there did seem to be reports stating that the CCTV system was not fully operational.

Following the suspension, I was contacted a number of times by Jordan who was adamant that the alleged assault did not happen in his venue. I explained to him that the victim was very specific that he had been to Applebum and has since provided images and a video of himself in the location.

I have spoken with the injured male over the phone and via email to clarify a number of points. The event change notification is added to the bundle as exhibit reference BR/13. The e mail update is attached as part of my evidence bundle, exhibit BR/14 and BR/15 refer. He has also contacted his friends via social messaging apps and I have screenshots of the conversations that they have had together discussing events at Arthouse, exhibit BR/16 refers.

I spoke with the promoter of the event in detail and a record of the email conversation is printed out, exhibit BR/17 refers.

At a meeting with Jordan and Heath on Tuesday 21st November, Jordan appeared to have changed his position and was accepting that this incident may have taken place at the venue.

During the meeting, PC Walker and myself explained the position of WMP in relation to the operation of Arthouse. Jordan Patel is the sole director of the licence holding company and he does not appear to be professional enough to manage a venue whilst promoting the licensing objectives. The event of 31st October appears to be financially driven, and the temptation of £2,600 was clearly put before complying with his license conditions.

The venue already has a number of stringent conditions which were added by the committee 12 months ago. WMP can not see how adding any further conditions would either increase public safety or reduce the risk of crime and disorder. In the short time that Jordan has been operating this venue he has completely lost the confidence of WMP.

Thank you for calling the office.

I just want to clarify the police position and summarise the conversation.

You were initially involved in the business around the time that the application was made, which was subject to a committee decision.

You state that you then left the business. In your absence the business became unsuccessful. You have then gone back into the business and are now the licence holder for Art House.

Since taking over (approx 6 weeks ago) you have held some events and have other events booked in (including Pandora)

I refer to conditions on the Arthouse licence -

Schedule of Events: The Premises Licence Holder will provide West Midlands Police, Licensing Section with a Schedule of forthcoming events at the Premises for the first 3 months after the premises open, and thereafter, as agreed with West Midlands Police, Licensing Section, but as a minimum at least 28 days in advance of any proposed event.

Policies, Procedures, and Risk Assessments: The Premises Licence Holder will provide West Midlands Police, Licensing Section with copies of: 1) all policies and procedures that relate to the management of the premises within 7 days of requesting the same and on each occasion these are subsequently updated, revised or amended; 2) Risk Assessments for any Event taking place at the premises within 7 days of requesting the same, or lesser period, depending on the time and date the Event is taking place.

I would also draw your attention to the hours of permitted licensable activity, which terminates at 04:00 on the weekend. Events have been advertised with a 06:00 finish.

On the phone you have apologised for the lack of communication and the lack of notifications since you have taken control of the premises. Whilst this is admirable that you acknowledge that there have been issues, it highlights that you are fully aware that the licence conditions will be breached if you operate without giving the appropriate notification.

West Midlands Police will deal with any breaches robustly. We also note that these conditions were imposed at a committee hearing.



Thank you very much for everything that's been done so far, very grateful. As for the pain it's ok but not being able to eat solid foods is killing me!

Anyway as to your questions,

I went to the Applebum Halloween event, originally supposed to be at Rainbow Venues but got switched to Scruvery late.

I purchased my ticket online, got a confirmation email from Skiddle which I can provide if that will help.

I was notified via email of the event change, I will forward that to you now but I think It's worth noting that the email was sent out at 10:02, 2 minutes after they claimed the doors opened.

I would have guessed about 4am maybe but I don't really do big nights out very often and usually leave about 2am so I wasn't too concerned about closing to be honest.

I arrived at the venue just after 12, I should have an Uber receipt to validate this but was queuing for upwards of 40 minutes so didn't get into the venue until later.

The event was not well organised at all, absolute chaos getting in. Many people were bring turned away because it was too busy but I saw quite a few people sneaking under fences and around security which somehow went unnoticed. Security staff seemed panicked and disorganised. Only on arrival into the event were people notified it was cash only which also caused annoyance to some people.

The atmosphere was pretty aggressive on the whole. I know quite a few people who told me they were involved in violent incidents that night, I saw multiple fights myself that night.

My friend told me he spoke to the bouncers after the incident and they claimed they were happy with the outcome as the situation had 'diffused' after the person who attacked me left. I can send him a message to clarify his comments.

I left the premises at 2:15, I have a text I sent to my girlfriend at 2:12, just after the assault and I left shortly after. I took an Uber straight to the hospital so I'll have a receipt from Scru to A&E.

I'm not sure what time the event closes but I know quite a few people began to leave after they stopped serving alcohol at about 2, which was actually a relief because it was incredibly busy!

I forwarded my friend's account of the assault to the investigating team. The views of the night were all very similar to mine, poorly organised, panicked and not well run. It very much seemed like an event with a last minute venue change. I don't have any photos myself but I believe my friends will so I can send those over as soon as I get them.

The atmosphere was pretty aggressive on the whole. I know quite a few people who told me they were involved in violent incidents that night, I saw multiple fights myself that night. Have you got any details of these violent incidents please?

Thank you for meeting with us last week and for the open and honest discussion that followed.

In summary

Applebum has four directors, you are one of the listed directors and were the most senior person representing the brand at the Halloween event planned for Rainbow.

At 16:00 on 31st October the event was cancelled at Rainbow. You contacted a number of venues to try and move the event. You spoke with Jordan about moving the event to Arthouse/Scruclub.

Jordan confirmed that they could hold it and stated the cost would be £1600 to hire the venue, with a capacity of 1,100 people over two rooms. You were offered the option of booking a further room for an additional £1000, and Jordan stated that this would then be able to cater for 'everyone'. You had sold 1,500 tickets and were under the impression that all ticket holders (apart from those requesting refunds) would be accommodated in addition to the event already planned in for that venue. You paid Jordan a total of £2,600 to hire 3 rooms.



Applebum had 5 staff working at the venue. You stated that the venue had one entry/exit point and that the venue lost control of the front door and the barriers. You said that the doors were closed and that this decision was made by Applebum and not by the venue.

You stated that you had booked the venue on the understanding that it was a 04:00 finish, although the venue actually closed at 02:30.

You stated you have had 250 – 300 refund requests and that you will not be returning to the venue in future to hold events.
