1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Late Night Refreshment (indoors only) between 23:00 hours and 05:00 hours, Monday to Sunday.

Premises to remain open to the public 24 hours a day (Monday to Sunday)

2. Recommendation:

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received 10^{th} April 2017 in respect of Starbucks, Northfield Drive Thru, Sir Herbert Austin Way, Birmingham, B31 1PT

Starbucks Coffee Company (UK) Limited applied on 10th April 2017 for the grant of a Premises Licence for Starbucks, Northfield Drive Thru, Sir Herbert Austin Way, Birmingham, B31 1PT.

Representations have been received from West Midlands Police, as a Responsible Authority, see Appendix 1.

Representations have been received from other persons. See Appendices 2-3.

The application is attached at Appendix 4.

Conditions have been agreed with Birmingham City Council, Licensing Enforcement and the applicant, which are attached at Appendix 5.

Site Location Plans at Appendix 6.

West Midlands Police have received the application for a premise licence for Starbucks, Northfield Drive Thru, Sir Herbert Austin Way, B31 1PT. West Midlands Police wish to object to this application on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and public nuisance. The premises is located in an area that already has issues with ASB from boy racers and has seen an emerging tread with gangs in the area.

The premises wishes to trade as a drive thru with an associated car park, this could easily lead to the location being a congregation point which will likely cause crime and disorder and public nuisance issues.

West Midlands Police have concerns that currently there is no CCTV coverage for the car park, and the premises does not have policies and procedures to deal with issues on their car park. West Midlands Police are working with the applicant around conditions to ensure that these issues are addressed but as of this date these have not been formalised.

I wish to raise an objection against starbucks opening 24 hours a day under the following reasons

- 1. Prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. Public safety
- 3. Prevention of public nuisance

We live directly behind Bellfield school playground, opposite the car park of starbucks and get all the noise from the relief road - cars and bikes racing, sainsburys petrol station - inconsiderate users leaving their radios on full blast with bass and now the noise from starbucks drive through and car park. The "acoustic" fence for the relief riad has been moved back and is now lower than originally erected because of the hill. It has also been opened up in places so we get all the noise channeled in from the traffic and car parks. We live in an area where crime and public disorder is on the increase and letting starbucks open 24 hours is only going to encourage this anti social behaviour and unwelcome visitors which will add to the misery we already endure. We no longer enjoy our garden and will have to put up with more noise at night by people who aren't really interested in coffee.

We were originally assured by starbucks and Birmingham city council that there would not be 24 hours opening and only by chance did we get to hear about it which makes this application very sneaky. This is a residential area and we would like to be given some respite from noise that will be generated in the car park during the early hours of the morning.

The fact that a drive through has been placed next to a school entrance in the first place is beyond our comprehension. It's only a matter of time before there is a serious accident. We already see adults walking back to their cars at school times, through the drive in area with their children rather than using the pavement.

Please see sense and leave the hours as they are. No good (or profit) will come from opening all around the clock.

I DO still wish to appeal against the 24 hr opening regardless of their amendments. As I stated in my previous email the noise from the car park will affect our quality of life and sleep as our bedrooms all face the opening across Bellfield school playground through to the starbucks car park.

In response to starbucks' revised application I would like to add the following comments:

CCTV will not prevent crime or discourage it, only record it. Neither will having a minimum of 2 staff on site (what happens if one goes off sick?). And how can starbucks care about the welfare of their staff if they're leaving 2 people on their own all night to deal with goodness knows what. These staff are not going to jeopardise their own safety trying to diffuse bad behaviour.

Has anyone seen the news for Northfield lately, robberies, muggings, stabbings and yet another shooting. Opening 24 hours is a ridiculous idea, we don't need or welcome 24 hour opening, this is a residential area not Birmingham city centre. Let people live normally and have peace and quiet in the evenings not more chaos and noise. If this application is approved the car park will become a gathering for undesirables who have no respect for residents, including the retirement apartments over the main road. We still have problems with idiot car users who race their cars up and down the relief road so the car park will serve as a pit stop with refreshments!

Putting up signs asking people to leave quietly and starbucks saying they do not tolerate disturbances and nuisance is not going to prevent them or discourage anti social behaviour.

If this application goes through what next? 24 hour opening for sainsburys garage and supermarket? Then the Black Horse pub? Why, when the high street is all closed up anyway at a normal time and people have gone home? We need to prevent anti social behaviour not encourage it.

Please, please, please no 24 hour opening in this fragile residential area.

Leave things as they are, it's already bad enough.

- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or 0 on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling 0 circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.




